Council called to Order by Mayor Hennerston
in the Chair and presiding. Roll call
showed all members of Council
present - except J. S. Northrup and
Recorder J. M. Buntinshaw. - N. M. Musford
was elected to act as Recorder
pro tem during absence of the
Recorder. - On motion of Councilman
J. M. Crandall second by Councilman
A. C. Greising, that the petition asking
for fire hydrants at the intersection
of ~~Maple~~ + Oak Streets was granted
and the Water Company install
such hydrant.

Resolution #12 was
introduced by Councilman J. M.
Crandall and second by Councilman
B. F. Cotton and read, providing
for viewers & appraisers to view out
locate, and ascertain the damages
and benefits in opening extending
and widening, Franklin St. and other St.
J. C. Meyer, S. C. Stewart, and Lee
P. Bidyer, were named in said
Resolution.

The Council appointed the following
persons to act as Judges and clerks
of the City Election to act as such
at both the Primary Election and
Regular City Election to be held Dec 12
1913. Judges G. M. Cranson, Helen V. Crawford
and Amanda C. Lewis, Clerks J. M. Buntinshaw
