

COUNCIL CHAMBER LEBANON, OREGON, NOVEMBER 11, 1913.

Council met in regular session pursuant to adjournment from last regular meeting, with Mayor V. S. Werrnersten in the chair and presiding. The roll being called showed all members elected to the Council present and in their places. Minutes of the last regular meeting were read and approved as read.

Resolution No. 14 declaring an assessment upon adjacent and abutting property and property particularly and specially benefited by the improvement of Main street, from A street to the South line of Carolina street, was introduced by Councilman I. M. Crandall and the same was read in full; and upon motion of Councilman I. M. Crandall, seconded by Councilman W. D. Keefhaver, the motion was put by the Mayor upon the question, "Shall the Resolution be adopted", and upon the roll being called and the votes taken by aye and nay, and entered in the Journal of the Council, the result was as follows: I. M. Crandall yes, W. D. Keefhaver yes, A. E. Ziesing yes, E. L. Cotton yes, J. S. Northorp yes, W. O. McClain yes, whereupon the Mayor stated, "The Resolution has received the unanimous, affirmative vote of all members elected to the Council, I therefore declare the Resolution duly passed and adopted."

Resolution No. 15 declaring an assessment upon adjacent and abutting property and property particularly and specially benefited by the improvement of Sherman street, from the West line of Third street to the West line of Park street, was introduced by Councilman I. M. Crandall and the same was read in full; and upon motion of Councilman I. M. Crandall, seconded by Councilman W. D. Keefhaver the motion was put by the Mayor upon the question, "Shall the Resolution be adopted," and upon the roll being called and the votes taken by aye and nay, and entered in the Journal of the Council, the result was as follows: I. M. Crandall yes, W. D. Keefhaver yes, A. E. Ziesing yes, E. L. Cotton yes, J. S. Northorp yes, W. O. McClain yes, whereupon the Mayor stated, "The Resolution has received the unanimous

affirmative vote of all members elected to the Council, I therefore declare the Resolution duly passed and adopted."

Resolution No. 16 declaring an assessment upon adjacent and abutting property and property particularly and specially benefited by the improvement of Grant street, from the East line of Second street to the West line of Park street, was introduced by Councilman I. M. Crandall and the same was read in full; and upon motion of Councilman I. M. Crandall, seconded by Councilman W. D. Keefhaver, the motion was put by the Mayor upon the question, "Shall the Resolution be adopted," and upon the roll being called and the votes taken by aye and nay, and entered in the Journal of the Council, the result was as follows: I. Upon motion of Councilman A. E. Ziesing, seconded by Councilman J. S. Northorp, that the bill be read the second time by title only, the Mayor stated "The question is, shall the bill be read the second time by title only" and the roll being called and the votes taken by aye and nay, and entered in the Journal of the Council, the result was as follows: I. J. C. Mayer presented to the Council a deed executed by J. C. Mayer and wife and Sam'l E. Garland and wife, conveying to the City a tract of land for street purposes, from the East terminus of Ash street to the Lebanon and Santiam Canal, which said deed upon motion was duly accepted and ordered placed on record, that said tract be established as a public street.
