Ordinance <sup>Bill</sup> # 147

Ordinance #

Was introduced and read by City Atty Newport. An ordinance to amend section 1 of Ordinance No 88 passed by the City Council the 20th day of April 1909. and approved by the Mayor the 20th day of April 1909. Entitled An Ordinance to regulate the manner and place of setting Electric light poles, Telephone poles, or other poles set in the streets and alleys of the City of Sebanon and to provide for the punishment of any violation of this ordinance, and declaring an emergency as amended by ordinance # 127 passed by the Council Mayor 1913. and approved by the Mayor May 23, 1913.

The bill was read the first and second time in full. A motion was made + carried the bill be read the 3rd time and place on its final passage and on calling the roll all Councilmen voted yes and the bill was read the 3rd time whereupon

the Mayor stated this is the 3rd reading shall the bill pass and upon calling the roll all Councilmen voted yes.
