

## City Council Chamber

Lebanon Co. Dec 16 1913.

Council met in regular session with Mayor Kennersten in the Chair. Roll call showed all Councilmen present and in their places. Minutes of last meeting read and approved. City Engineer J. H. McArthur made report of the amount of work accomplished during the year and the report showed that over 3 miles of sewer pipe had been laid of the different sizes pipe's, and that 38 man holes will have been built at the close of the year, and that the city will have saved the sum of \$4200<sup>00</sup> above the Contractors price of last years work. The report was accepted and placed on file.

Petition of property holders and others asking for a sidewalk in the Southern part of the City between Main St. and Second St. was read and the same was lost.

Ordinance Bill No 149 Ordinance No.

An Ordinance regulating the use of and preventing the driving of traction Engines upon the paved streets of the City of Lebanon, was introduced by the Ordinance Committee and was read in full the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>d</sup> time, whereupon the Mayor stated this is the 2<sup>d</sup> reading of the bill it is now ready for commitment or amendment in order for the 3<sup>d</sup> reading, motion by Craudall second by Jaising that the Bill be read the 3<sup>d</sup> time and placed on its final passage. The Mayor stated the question is shall the bill be now read the 3<sup>d</sup> time, and upon the roll being called and the vote being taken by aye + nay and entered in the Journal of the Council the result was as follows. J. M. Craudall yes B. L. Cotton yes N. D. Keefaver yes W. O. McClain yes J. S. Northrop yes A. E. Jaising yes. The Mayor stated the question had received the unanimous affirmative vote all member elected to the Council, The bill may therefore

be read the 3<sup>rd</sup> time <sup>word</sup> and placed on its final passage", and thereupon the bill was read the third time in full. The Mayor then stated this is the third reading of the bill, shall the bill pass upon the roll being called and the vote being taken by Aye + Nay and entered in the Journal of the Council, the result was as follows: J. M. Crandall yes, B. L. Cotton yes, N. D. Keefer yes, H. O. McClain yes, J. S. Northrop yes, and A. E. Giesing yes. The Mayor stated shall the title of the Bill stand as the title of the Ordinance and upon calling the roll and the vote being taken by Aye and Nay the vote was as follows: J. M. Crandall yes, B. L. Thereupon the Mayor stated the question had received the unanimous vote of all members of the Council and the title of the bill would stand as the title of the Ordinance.

A Communication from The Electric Light + Water Co. signed by J. L. Meyer President and S. M. Gordon Secretary, giving their side of the question as to whether it would be to the City's interest to grant another franchise for light and power purposes <sup>within the City</sup> and also made the City the following offer: If the City really desires to purchase the Lebanon Electric Light + Water Co, plant the Company will meet the City half way in an endeavor to come to an amicable agreement. The Communication was ordered placed on file.

Ordinance Bill 143 Ordinance No -  
was read the 3<sup>rd</sup> time. The Mayor then stated this is the third reading of the Bill "shall the bill pass" upon the roll being called and the vote being taken by Aye and Nay and entered in the Journal of the Council the result was as follows: J. M. Crandall yes, B. L. Cotton yes, A. E. Giesing yes, N. D. Keefer no, H. O. McClain no, and J. S. Northrop no, whereupon the Mayor declared the Bill lost.

Mr. R. L. Gilson of the Lebanon Hardware Co was present and stated he had secured permission from Mrs. Latta of Portland for the erection of a farmers hitch rack on Mrs. Latta lot, and asked the City to build the same. Motion made by giving authorizing the City Marshal to build the same.
