

Council Chamber

Lebanon Or. Dec. 17, 1913.

Council met in regular session with Mayor
 Kemmerston in the Chair and presiding and all members
 elected to the Council present and in their places.
 When among other things the following
 proceedings were duly had.

Resolution No 17

Was introduced by Councilman Grandall and
 was read in full, and upon motion being duly made
 and second that the resolution be adopted and
 upon the roll being called and the vote taken by aye
 and nay and entered in the Journal of the Council
 all members elected to the Council voted in favor
 of the adoption of the resolution. Thereupon the Mayor
 declared the resolution was duly adopted
 and passed by the Council.

Which said Resolution was and is as follows.

Whereas, the Recorder of the City of Lebanon, Or.,
 did heretofore duly advertise and call for sealed bids for
 the purchase of Improvement bonds of the City of Lebanon
 which said advertisement and call
 was duly given in pursuance of Ordinance
 Bills Nos 150 - 151 - 152 duly passed and
 enacted by the Council of the said City
 on the 2d day of Dec. 1913 and duly approved
 by the Mayor of the said City on the 2d
 day of Dec. 1913, etc. And in response to
 said call for bids the Warren Const.
 submitted a bid for the purchase of said
 Bonds and bid therefor the sum of Par
 and accrued interest and no premium, where
 said bids were separate for each of
 said streets and were for the entire issue
 of the said bonds.

Upon motion duly made
 and second that the resolution be ^{adopted} ~~accepted~~ and
 upon calling the roll and the vote being taken
 by Aye & Nay the vote was as follows I. M.
 Grandall yes, B. L. Cotton yes, N. D. Kephart
 yes, W. D. McClain yes, J. S. Northrop yes, and
 A. V. Greasing yes. Thereupon the Mayor

declared the resolution passed.

Resolution No 18, was introduced by Councilman J. M. Crandall which authorized the City Recorder to have printed and engraved ^{Bill} Bonds, as provided in Ordinances No, 150-151-152, as passed the Council Dec 2, 1913, and upon motion duly made and second that the Resolution be ~~accepted~~ ^{accepted} and upon calling the roll and the vote being taken by Aye & Nay the vote was as follows, J. M. Crandall ^{yes}, B. L. Cotton ^{yes}, N. S. Keephaus ^{yes}, H. O. McBlaine ^{yes}, J. E. Northup ^{yes} and A. E. Ziesing ^{yes} Whereupon the Mayor declared the Resolution passed.

Motion made by Ziesing second by McBlaine that a Committee of three be appointed by the Mayor to investigate the proposition of the City buying the Detarion Electric Light & Water Co's plant. The Mayor appointed B. L. Cotton, H. G. Amos, and A. H. Blackburn.

The City Engineer was authorized to give grades and lines on E. St. from Main St. to 2^d St. and to establish grades on 2^d St. from the Bridge south to the City limits.
