

RESOLUTION REQUIRING BUILDING AND REPAIRING OF
CERTAIN SIDEWALKS.

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Streets of said City has reported in writing to the City Council that certain sidewalks in the City of Lebanon, Oregon, as herein-after mentioned, should be built, rebuilt, repaired, and put on grade; Now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, OREGON:

That, within thirty (30) days from the date of the adoption of this resolution, the several owners of the lots and parcels of land hereinafter specified shall build, rebuild, repair, or place on grade, as indicated in this resolution, the sidewalks along the following lots and parcels of land, respectively:

Along the East front of Lot 2, Block 19, Original Plat of Lebanon, owned by the Lutheran Church, a new concrete walk of standard width to be built;

Along the South side of the property situated at the Northeast corner of Main and Maple Streets, owned by G. W. Crum, a new concrete walk, six (6) feet in width, to be built;

Along the North front of Lots 4 and 5, Block 4, Halston's 3rd Addition to the City of Lebanon, owned by the Baptist Church, ~~xxnew~~ the wooden walk to be lowered to grade and placed in a good state of repair, or a concrete walk of standard width to be built;

Along the North front of property owned by John Reed and abutting on the South side of Grant Street, a new wood or concrete walk of standard width to be built;

Along the South front of a part of Lot 6, Block 26, J. W. Halston's Addition to the City of Lebanon, owned by C. W. Ross, the wooden walk to be put in a good state of repair, or a new concrete walk of standard width to be built;

Along the West front of Lots 3 and 4, Block 2, Kirkpatrick's Addition to the City of Lebanon, the old walk to be raised and placed in a good state of repair, and the North part of same to be widened to regulation width, or a new concrete walk of regulation width to be built; said property belonging to the Simpson Estate;

Along the North front of Lots 1 and 2, Block 4,
J. H. Ralston's 3rd Addition to the City of Lebanon,
owned by William Elher, a new concrete walk, of regu-
lation width, to be built;

That all of said walks shall be built, or repaired,
as the case may be, in conformity to the specifications and
requirements of Ordinance No. 74 of the said City of Lebanon.

A petition for the building of a sidewalk on the First Street north of Olive St. was read, and, upon motion the petition was granted, and the sidewalk ordered built.

"A bill for an ordinance to establish a sinking fund for the retirement of the Sewer Bonds of the City of Lebanon, now outstanding," was introduced and read in full for the first time. There being no objection the bill was read the second time by title only. The bill being now ready for an amendment or commitment in order for a third reading, the Mayor stated, "The question is shall the bill be read the third time?"
