

# City Council Chamber

City Council met in regular session, May 20th, 1891. Chair - Roll call showed all members present. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

Street Com., per Mr. Taylor, reported as to removal of conviction at the jail, and the master was referred to the Marshall to see that the conviction be made.

Dr. Amos reported as the plumbing license that ordinance pertaining to license for plumber is satisfactory, also recommended that the license com. take credentials of applicants before a license is issued.

Mr. McArthur and Mr. McClain reported as to numbering residences, dividing the city, securing cedar posts, and also asking for bids for painting wooden signs. Com. to report further at a later date.

McLinton reported in brief as to occurring police and fire alarms. No definite action.

Recorded fees quarterly report, also report as to cash received since last Council meeting, as follows: R. Kuhn 15<sup>00</sup>, John Beloff 2<sup>00</sup>, Street Lecture 25<sup>00</sup>, Mr. Kudrikem 25<sup>00</sup>, J.R. Green 4<sup>00</sup>.

Motion by Cotton that the Recorder be instructed to make a monthly report of Police Court proceeding in a local paper. Motion carried.

Supt. of Streets made a report as to certain sidewalk improvements.

A resolution requiring building and repairing of certain sidewalks, as per St. Rep. & recommendations, was duly adopted.

Motion by Dr. Amos that the master of abating the goat nuisance on the property of Mr. L. C. Lefebvre with the Marshall and Health Officer, with instructions to see that the place is cleaned up and kept clean. Motion carried.

178 A bill for "An Ordinance to prevent Poultry running at large within the corporate limits of the City of Lebanon" was introduced and read in full for the first time. There being no objection it was read the second time by title only. The bill being now ready for enaction and amendment, was ordered for a third reading.

RESOLUTION DECLARING CERTAIN REMAINS OF A BURNED  
BUILDING TO CONSTITUTE A NUISANCE; AND  
ORDERING THEIR REMOVAL.

WHEREAS the City Marshal of the City of Lebanon, Oregon,  
has filed with the City Recorder his written declaration de-  
claring the remains of the burned residence on Lot 7, Block 5,  
Original Plat of Lebanon, Oregon, to constitute a nuisance;  
AND WHEREAS, the members of the Council have personally  
investigated said premises, and find that the said remains of  
said building are in a dangerous condition and in danger of  
falling down; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
LEBANON, OREGON:

That the remains of the burned residence on Lot  
7, Block 5, Original Plat of the City of Lebanon, Oregon,  
constitute a nuisance, within the meaning of Section 6 of  
Ordinance No. 2 of said City, and the owner of said premises is  
hereby required to remove the same and abate said nuisance,  
within two (2) days from the date of the service upon such owner,  
or his or her agent, of a copy of this resolution; and such  
owner, or his or her agent, shall be so notified, without delay,  
by the City Marshal.

of October, 1914.

Major stated the question is, shall the bill be read for the third time? The Mayor then declared the bill duly enacted and passed. All the members of the Council voted in the affirmative that the title of the bill be made the title of the ordinance.

R. 24<sup>th</sup> Marshall Bishop made a report in which he declared the partly burned building on Second St - spoils the Presbyterian Church - a nuisance. A resolution declaring this building a nuisance was introduced and unanimously adopted.

The matter of granting Mr. Hardman's petition for street connection was upon motion referred to the Street Com.

Dr. Wright addressed the council on the subject of meat inspection.

Securing a way for travel until Grand St can be opened was discussed at length and was upon motion referred to the Street Com with power to act.

A communication from G. W. Morgan was read, in which he asked the City of Lebanon to make good his loss \$57 discount on city warrants. No action taken.

Motion by Cotton that a warrant be issued to the First National Bank of Lebanon to take up the balance of the \$1000.00 loan. Motion carried.
