Council met in special session to decide definitely and finally upon a Budget, and to fix the levy for the fiscal year 1915.

Mayor Collins in the chair. Roll call showed all the members of the Council present.

The report of the special committee, appointed by Mayor Collins at the mass meeting of Friday evening Nov. 27, was read in full, and discussed at length by the members of the Council, and others present. The report suggested certain changes in the tentative Budget of Expenditures for Lebanon, for the fiscal year 1915.

Mr. Northrop made a motion, which was duly seconded, that the report, containing the recommendations of the special comm. appointed by the Mayor, be laid upon the table indefinitely. Motion carried.

A Resolution adopting a Budget of Expenditures for the City of Lebanon, in Linn Co., Mo., for the fiscal year 1915, and fixing the tax levy to meet the same, was introduced and read in full by the City Attorney.

Mr. Cotton made a motion, which was seconded, that the sum of \$1300.00 for the dredging of Weber Slough, and one month's salary of the City Engineer, amounting to \$160, be eliminated upon the roll being called, and the vote taken by aye and nay, the result was as follows: Cannon, no; Cotton, yes; Blackburn, no; McClain, yes; Northrop, no; Taylor, yes. There being a tie vote, the Mayor voted. The Mayor voted, yes.

Mr Northof made a motion that 18 1/2 mills be inserted in the Budget, as the levy for taxes for next year. Motion carried.

Upon motion of Mr Cotton, and seconded by Mr Blackburn, the resolution was duly adopted. ~~Mr. Cannon being on the floor.~~ Upon motion it was directed that the report of the special Com. appointed by the Mayor, together with the names of the members of the Com. be placed upon the minutes.

A motion was made, and duly seconded, that it be recommended to the new Council that the office of Street Dept. and Chief of Police be combined. Motion carried.

Upon motion the levy adopted by the Council was placed in the hands of the City Engineer to be delivered to the County Clerk.

There being no further business the Council adjourned.

Be it further resolved that no city officer or head of a department of said City shall, during said fiscal year 1915, incur any liability or liabilities on behalf of said City against any of said accounts, which, in the aggregate, shall

exceed the amount hereby appropriated for his department, unless the Council shall have theretofore specifically authorized such additional expenditure or liability.

And whereas it is necessary, in order to meet said expenditures and appropriations, that, in addition to the other revenues of said City, money be raised by general taxation; now, therefore,

Be it further resolved, that, for the purpose of meeting the said expenditures of the said City of Lebanon, in Linn County, Oregon, for the fiscal year 1915, there be, and is hereby, levied upon each dollar of assessed valuation of property liable to taxation within said City, as shown by the official Assessment Roll for Linn County, Oregon, for the year 1914, now on file, the sum of 18 1/2 mills, the same to be collected as provided by law.

And be it further resolved that the Recorder of said City at once notify the County Clerk and the County Recorder, in writing, of the making of said levy, and transmit to each of them a certified copy of this resolution.
