

City Council Chambers, Lebanon, Dec. 1, 74.

Council met in regular session, Mayor Conner presiding. All members of the Council present.

M. St. Con. from Mr. Taylor, unable to report definitely as to light on Oak & Cedar St.

Motion made and carried that a hydrant be placed at corners of Wheeler and Grove St. Motion carried.

St. Sup't. Mrs. Green reported as to certain sidewalks, which matter was, upon motion, referred to the Street Comm.

Mr. Taylor made a motion that Mr. Hardman be allowed the privilege of connecting with the sewer, at his own expense as to digging and laying the pipe, the city furnishing the pipe, the pipe to be laid under the direction of City Engineers. Motion carried.

The resignation of Mr. Davis as night watch was read and accepted.

The application of G.R. Lovall for the position of night watch was read.

On motion the Councilmen proceeded to ballot for a night watch. Upon the votes being cast the result was as follows, Lovall, 2; H.C. Smith 4. Mr. Smith was declared duly elected as night watch.

Motion by Mr. Taylor that Mr. Haley's gun be returned to him, and that an affidavit be secured from Mr. Haley to be used at some future date in case of trial. Motion carried.

Mr. Blackburn made a motion that the assessment roll of the property fronting on Grant St. be read, and that property owners be given until Monday night to present any objections and that the Assessing warden be notified to this effect. Motion carried.

Assessment roll filed with Recorder, together with the plan of Grant St. which was approved.

Motion by Dr. Davis that the City Engineer be instructed to make a plan of the City and of the sewer system. Motion carried.

A RESOLUTION declaring a forfeiture of a certain  
deposit made by the Warren Construction Company.

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WHEREAS, in response to an advertisement for bids for the improvement of Grant Street from Second Street to the right-of-way of the Southern Pacific Company, and of Third Street from Grant Street to Sherman Street, the <sup>on or about the day of 1914,</sup> Warren Construction Company, filed its bid, and with said bid, its certified check payable to the Mayor of the City of Lebanon, in the sum of \_\_\_\_\_

\_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$\_\_\_\_\_), as a guarantee that, if awarded the contract for said work, it would enter into contract for the performance of the same within ten (10) days after the acceptance of its bid; and, whereas several months have expired since the acceptance of said bid, and said Company has never entered into such contract; Now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEBANON, OREGON:

That said deposit be, and the same is hereby, forfeited to the said City of Lebanon, Oregon, and the Mayor is hereby directed to cash said certified check and cause the proceeds thereof to be paid into the general fund of said City;

~~Be it further resolved, however, that, in case the said Warren Construction Company shall, during the year 1915, enter into contract with said City for the execution of said work on the same terms as contained in its said bid, and complete the same during said year, then said amount so forfeited, less any extra expenses to which said City may be put by reason of additional proceedings, advertising &c., shall be refunded to said Warren Construction Company.~~
