City Council Chamber, Lebanon, Ore Dec 15-94

Council met in regular session, Mayor Comer presiding. All members of the Council present except Mr. Cotton. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

St. Coal, per Mr. Taylor reported as to lights on corners of Oak and Good Streets, recommending two lights. Reported adversely on the building of ~~the stable~~ on Grove St. Report of Corn Tax on

Recorded reported having received money as follows: John Landstrom \$5.00; J.W. McArthur, \$39.75; RR Kuhn \$15.00; F.W. Bishop \$9.00; D. Conner, \$350.00; Mr. Narmel, 50¢; Ted Daly \$33.50.

City Engineer reported delay as to getting crushed rock from Mr. Larens' plant, owing to a break down.

Third reading of Ordinance Bill 179, fixing and levying an assessment upon the several lots, parcels and tracts of land specially benefitted by the improvement of that part of Grand St in the City of Lebanon, Oregon, extending from the west curb line of Park St Eastward to the city limits. The bill being now ready for commitment or amendment in order for third reading the Mayor stated, "The question is, shall the bill be read for the third time?" Upon roll being called the result was as follows:

Arras, ye. Blackburn, ye. McClaim, ye. Northrop, ye. Taylor, ye.

The bill was then read the third time.

The Mayor then stated "The question is shall, shall the bill pass?"

Upon roll being call all the members of the Council present voted in the affirmative. Therefore,

the bill was declared duly enacted and passed.

By a unanimous affirmative vote of all the members of the Council present the title of the bill was made the title of the ordinance.

The official canvass of the regular annual City election, held Dec. 7 and the Mayor's proclamation for the measure adopted by vote of the people at the regular election were read, and upon motion duly accepted and placed on file.

180 "A Bill for an Ordinance requiring and regulating the numbering of residences, places of business, and other place within the City of Lebanon Oregon" was introduced and read in full for the first time. There being no objection the bill was read the second time by title only. It was not read the third time by reason of the absence of Councilman Cotton.

Dr. Ames made a motion which was duly seconded, that the work of the City Engineer in putting up street signs, and house numbering proceed without delay. Motion carried.

On motion the Recorder was directed to notify firemen that all bills presented to the Council must be stamped, and individual receipts filed with Recorder for all monies paid.

On motion the office of the City Engineer was made an official office in order to get certain benefits.

The time for the City Engineer making repair and Franklin St. was extended until next meeting.
