

City Council Chamber, Lebanon, Ore Dec 15 1890

Council met in regular session, Mayor Council presiding. All members of the Council present except Mr Cotton. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

St. Com. for Mr Faylor reported as to lights on corner of Oak and Grand Streets, recommending two lights. Reported adversely on the building of ~~the table~~ ^{pedestals} on Grove St. Report of Com. laid on table.

Recorded reported having received money as follows: John Laddstrom \$5.00; J. M. Arthur, \$39.75; R. R. Kuhn \$15.00; Geo Bishop \$9.50; D. Council, \$350.00; Mr. Warner, \$5.00; Ed Daly, \$33.50.

City Engineer reported delay as to getting crushed rock from Mr Larcen's plant, owing to a break down.

Third reading of Ordinance Bill 179, fixing and levying an assessment upon the several lots, parcels and tracts of land specially benefited by the improvement of that part of Grand St in the City of Lebanon, Oregon, extending from the west curb line of Park St Eastward to the City limits. The bill being now ready for commitment or amendment in order for third reading the Mayor stated, "The question is, shall the bill be read for the third time?" Upon roll being called the result was as follows, Amos, yes; Blackburn, yes; McClain, yes; Northrup, yes; Faylor, yes. The bill was then read the third time. The Mayor then stated, "The question is shall the bill pass?" Upon roll being call all the members of the Council present voted in the affirmative. ^{as follows} Amos, yes; Blackburn, yes; McClain, yes; Northrup, yes; Faylor, yes. Thereupon the bill was declared duly enacted and passed. By a unanimous affirmative vote of all the members of the Council present the title of the bill was made the title of the ordinance.

The official canvass of the regular annual city election, held Dec. 7 and the Mayor's proclamation as to measures adopted by vote of the people at the regular ^{city} election were read, and upon motion duly accepted and placed on file.

"A Bill for an Ordinance requiring and regulating the numbering of residences, places of business, and other places within the City of Lebanon, Oregon" was introduced and read in full for the first time. There being no objections the bill was read the second time by title only. It was not read the third time by reason of the absence of Councilman Cotton.

Dr. Amos made a motion, which was duly provided, that the work of the City Engineer in putting up street signs, and house numbering proceed without delay. Motion carried.

On motion the Recorder was directed to notify firemen that all bills presented to the Council must be itemized, and individual receipts filed with Recorder for all monies paid.

On motion the office of the City Engineer was made an official office in order to get certain benefits.

The time for the City Engineer making repair on Franklin St. was extended until next meeting.
