

City Council Chamber, Lebanon, Pa Oct 19th 1875

Council met in regular session, Mayor Conner presiding. All members of the council present. Minutes of previous meeting was and approved.

The Quarterly Report of the Recorder was read and referred to the Finance Com.

Dr Wright of the Fire Dept. called attention to the fact that certain hose couplings were badly needed. The matter was referred to the Com. on Streets and Public Property.

A communication from the Mayor reporting the results of his investigation into the office of City Marshall was read. Upon motion the report was received and placed on file.

Mr Wallace made a motion that the office of City Marshall be declared vacant. The motion was ^{seconded and} amended by Dr Rinnell, and incompetency was made as the cause of declaring the office vacant. There followed considerable discussion. A vote by ayer and nay was called for and the result was as follows:

Ingram, no; Amos, no; Blackburn, no;
Rinnell, yes; Taylor, no; Wallace, yes.

Dr Amos made a motion, which was duly seconded, that the matter of complaint against the Marshall be investigated Monday evening Oct 25th 1875. Motion carried.

A petition asking for a "Siren Fire Alarm System" was read and placed on file.

Estimates of expenditure in the various departments of the City of Lebanon for the coming year was read (in full)

Dr Amos made a motion that \$500 be placed on the Budget for the Library with the understanding that if at the next election the people refused to sanction it the amount should be used to reduce the indebtedness of the City. Motion carried.

On motion of Dr Amos \$500 was placed on Budget for Street Cleaning apparatus.

On motion of Mr Blackburn the Budget appropriations were accepted tentatively, and that the same may be published.

On motion of Dr Amos the Treasurer and
Recordes were instructed to provide a "Banking
Fund" for Rev Mr. Conde, out of tax money received.

The Council extended a vote of thanks for
work done on Wheeler St.

Motion by Dr Amos that attention be called to
the loose boards of sidewalk near South school, also
to the pile of gravel in the street near rail road.
Motion carried.

The "Fair Dept." Com, directed to collect from
Leaven Lumber Co a certain bill, was referred, and
the Recordes was instructed to present the matter to
the company.
