

## City Council Chamber, Lebanon Ore

Nov. 15 1915

Council met in regular session, Mayor  
Comer presiding. All members of the Council  
present. Minutes of the previous meeting  
read and approved.

Street Committee reported adversely against  
putting in lights at Row and 5th Streets.  
Comr recommended that Milligan St. - between  
Ash and Vine Sts. - be improved; that Mr. Mayes  
furnish two teams and two men, the City doing  
the work.

Mr. Wallace made a motion that the Marshall  
as Street Supt. - be instructed to carry out the  
plan for the improvement of Milligan St. as  
recommended by the Street Comr.

The Marshall reported that 6" piping was  
needed for drainage of streets; he was, upon  
motion, instructed to buy the necessary piping.

City Recorder reported having received the

City Attorney called attention to the  
"8 hr. jury duty law"; and took the position that  
the City had been violating the statute.

The report of City Engineer M. Arthur,  
in which he made an accounting of money  
entrusted to him by the City, was read, and  
upon motion <sup>was</sup> accepted and placed on file.

A communication from the Lebanon  
Lumber Co was read.

Resolution #18 (15) - granting extension  
of time on the franchise was read in full.  
The resolution was amended to read March 1st  
1916 instead of July 1st 1916. An aye and nay  
vote on the adoption of the resolution resulted

as follows; Crandall, yes; Amos, yes; Blackton,  
yes; Kimmell, yes; Taylor, yes; Wallace, yes.

The resolution was therefore duly adopted.  
Dr. Amos made a motion that the  
contract between the City and the M.S.M. be  
published once in each of the local papers.  
Motion carried.

On motion of Mr. Crandall the telephone  
now in use by Mr. Bishop is to be transferred  
to the home of Mrs. Richards.

The Recorder was instructed to make  
out a bill against the Oregon Power Co. for  
1 cord of 16 in. wood - \$4.00 and present the same.
