requiring the owners of the Lebanon and Santiam canal now passing
through the city to build and maintain all bridges over the canal
which they are liable to keep up and maintain, motion was carried.

On motion of Dr. Amos the concession was granted to the Womans
Civic Improvement club to put up decoration and hold a Christmas
tree and festivities on Main street at Christmas time.

On motion of Mr. Wallace it was ordered that the viewers who
served on the board for the opening of Oak, and Ash street be paid
\$2.00 each for their services, and that warrants be drawn for the
amounts as other bills against the city.

On motion it was ordered that the bill of J. W. McArthur for map
work for the city in the sum of \$79.81 be allowed and paid.
