

Council Chamber December 21, 1915

Council met in regular session with all members of the Council present and in their places with the mayor in the chair and presiding. The Roll was called showing all officers of the present, except the Recorder who is out of the city.

Minutes of the last meeting of the council was read and approved as read.

Councilman Taylor, of the Street committee reported that the matter of the drain on South Main Street near the residence of Mrs. Kissing had been fixed by making an open ditch on the west side of Main Street.

Report of the board of Election canvassers was read and on motion was placed on file and the recorder was directed to issue certificate to the persons therein shown to have been elected, as follows:-

H. L. Underwood Mayor, A. M. Reeves, Councilman first Ward, D. A. Reeves Councilman Second Ward, and A. M. Wilson Councilman Third ward

It was moved and carried that the sinking fund of the City be left on deposit until June payment of bond interest, and that in the meantime that due notice be given for the calling in of bonds for the investment of the sinking funds in Lebanon City Bonds.

On Motion of Councilman Wallace, it was ordered that the former viewers who served on the board for the opening of Ash and Oak Streets who have not been paid, be paid \$2.00 each.

On Motion of Councilman Amos, the City Attorney was directed to notify the bondmen of former Marshal W. I. Bishop to pay to the City treasurer the amount of his shortage in the sum of \$5.75.

On motion of Councilman Amos the City Attorney was directed to proceed to collect the benefit assessed against the abutting property for the opening of East Ash Street.

be notified to remove their fences out of Franklin Street recently
ordered open, and on their failure to remove the same the marshal
be directed to proceed to the removal the same as provided by law.

Moved and carried on motion of Councilman Taylor that the map
presented by City Engineer J. W. McArthur be accepted, and that
he be allowed to make and sell to the public copies of the map was
also carried by unanimous vote of the council.

M^oved By Councilman A. W. Blackburn and seconded by W. C. Amos
that the city attorney proceed to prepare resolution or ordinance
requiring the owners of the Lebanon and Santiam Canal now passing
through the city to build and maintain all bridges over the canal
which they are liable to keep up and maintain, motion was carried.
On motion of Dr. Amos the concession was granted to the Womans
Civic Improvement club to put up decoration and hold a Christmas
tree and festivities on Main street at Christmas time.

On motion of Mr. Wallace it was ordered that the viewers who
served on the board for the opening of Oak, and Ash street be paid
\$2.00 each for their services, and that warrants be drawn for the
amounts as other bills against the city.

On motion it was ordered that the bill of J. W. McArthur for map
work for the city in the sum of \$79.81 be allowed and paid.
