Council met in regular session Mayor J L Chamberlain presiding

All members of the council present on call

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved

Committee on Streets and Public Property reported that it was not feasible at the present time to improve Grove Street as requested by the property owners.

After discussion of Contamination of water in sewer North East of the City. further investigation was decided on. On motion of A M Reeds, that the Mayor and Council go, as a body in the near future and investigate thoroughly the conditions in and around Mr Schuberts place and the sewer outlet. was carried

A petition for a street light on Eddy street at the Rail road crossing was read and referred to the Committee on Streets and Public property.

Bills of L B Keson for \$54 47 payment on Motor Cycle and Supplies and bill of the Lebanon Mutual Telephone Co for \$130 for Telephone service to Traffic Officer were rejected.

The following bills were then read and on motion were allowed and warrants ordered drawn on the Treasurer for the various amounts:

The Committee on Publication of Notice of Ash Street Improvement District Assessment reported that the bid of the Lebanon Contractor being the lowest, they were awarded the job.
