Council met in regular session
Mayor J L Underwood presiding
All members of the Council present
Minutes of previous meeting read and
approved

The Street committee made verbal report
explaining the difference in cost and
quality of lumber purchased for Bridges
The report of the Firewane Committee
appointed to confer with the Lebanon
Fire Department was read, the report
recommended increase in pay of the
Firemen; the report on motion was
adopted, and the City Attorney was
instructed to draft an Ordinance in
conformity with the report

Report of the Sub. of Streets, as to the
condition of Foot Bridge across the Canal
on Wetherside Street was referred to the
Committee on Streets and Public Property.
The Petition of Night Policeman, W. E.
Fitzgerald, for an increase of salary, was
on motion referred to the Police Committee
with power to act.
