

Planned On Nov 19th 1918

Council met in regular session Mayor
J L Underwood presiding
All members of the Council present
Minutes of previous meeting read and
affirmed.

The report of the Budget Committee on
estimates of the expense of the different
departments for the year 1919 was read
and on motion the report was accepted
tentatively; and the recorder was instructed
to prepare and have the same published as required
by the City Charter; publication to be made
in both of the City Papers.

The report of the City Recorder for the
Third Ward was read and placed on file.
The report of the Superintendent of Streets
as to sidewalks needing rebuilding or
repairing was read, and on motion
was accepted, and he was instructed
to notify the different property owners
to have the necessary work done within
the second twenty day, and to see to
it that the notice was complied with.

The report of the mayor and City Recorder
as canvassing board, for the City Election
held on Nov 5th was read, showing
the following Officers elected for the dif-
ferent offices.

Ordinance bill # 11 for 1918. Ordinance # 230: an Ordinance fixing the compensation of the Firemen, for attendance at Fairs, Meetings and Drills was read the first time in full, and on roll call was passed, all members of the Council voting yeas.

On Motion the Ordinance was referred to the Ordinance for further consideration to report at next meeting.

On motion the construction of the Concrete bridge, across the Canal, on Main Street was postponed to some future time.

Communication from the Leb E & R Water Co agreeing to keep the Bridge across the Canal for further repair, and in regard to disposed of Cement purchased by the City, was read and ordered placed on file.

The matter of collecting the costs of two Light Columns that had been broken was referred to the City Attorney and Recorder.
