

Lebanon Or. Dec 2<sup>nd</sup> 1919

Council met in regular session. Mayor Brown Millsap presiding.

Councilmen present over call: J M Burkhardt, B L Cotton, A J Grindall, P A Tucker and H W Kennedy;

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved. Petitions were read for lights on East Rose St., on Grove Street south of the R.R. and at the corner of 4<sup>th</sup> and A Streets;

Petitions were referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property;

Verbal petition was made for light at the Depot, on the corner of Third and Sherman Streets; The report of the City Engineer and Superintendent of Streets, concerning the completion of the improvement of parts of Park St. and of Ash Street between Main and Second Street; and of the amounts assessed against each parcel of real property specially benefited by said improvement, was read and on roll call was adopted. All members of the Council present voting 'yea.'

Res #20 for 1919. Authorizing Levy against property on Park Street and Ash Street, as specially benefited, according to the report of the City Engineer and Superintendent of Streets was read and on roll call was adopted all members of the Council present voting 'yea.'

Introduced bill #14 for \$919. and Ordinance declaring an assessment and lien upon real property specially benefited by the improvement of Park St from the North line of Grant Street, to the South line of Sherman Street, and from the North line of Ash Street to the South line of Vine Street, and of Ash Street from the West line of Main St to the East line of Second Street; was read the first time in full, on the question shall the Bill be read the second time by title only, the roll was called, and all members of the council present voted 'yea.'

A motion was made and carried, that when Council adjourned it do so with the understanding that they will again Friday night Dec 5<sup>th</sup>.

Report of the City Recorder as to condition of Improvement on Improvement Bond for Street Assessments was read; after discussion;

An motion the City Attorney was instructed was instructed to begin foreclosure proceedings against property owner over one year, in arrears on pay bonds.

Communicated from the Chief Gilson, that the Fire Department had selected a Chevrolet one and a half ton Truck chassis costing \$1500<sup>00</sup> for the use of the Fire Department, and asking approval of the Council to estimate.


