

Lebanon Ore Sept 19th 1922
 Council met in regular session. Mayor
 Byron Millsap, presiding.

All members of the Council being present
 Minutes of previous meeting read and approved
 as read.

The City Marshall reported that Toilet in Mayor
 Building had been cleaned as ordered.

The Committee on streets and Public Property
 that the outlet of the sewer had been flushed and
 was in good condition.

The Superintendent of streets reported that notices
 to build and repair sidewalks had been
 posted and mailed, as required by resolution
 #2, and that some walks had been completed.
 some were course of construction, and a
 few had taken no action to comply with
 with the order.

The Committee reported several street crossings
 in poor condition, and the Dept of streets
 was instructed to repair or replace the same:

There being no objection the Title of the bill:
 was declared to be the title of the Ordinance.

The request of the Fire Department for additional
 equipment, in the way of clothing, to protect
 the fire men, was referred to the Committee
 on ways and means:

On motion the Superintendent of streets was
 authorized to purchase Lumber necessary
 for street crossings:

On motion J M Burtenshaw, was appointed a
 committee of One, to attend to the Alteration of
 the Library room, to enable the Civic Club
 to have access from the room east of the
 Library, to the Council room; and to present

present the bill for cost of the same to the City.
 The Mayor appointed the following property owners as members of the Budget Committee
 J. L. Mayer, Dr. W. G. Amos, A. J. Brandall
 J. M. Riggins, D. W. Reeve and J. M. Jones.
 On motion the appointment was confirmed by the Council:

The Approach to the Bridge on Grove Street was reported to be in a dangerous condition the matter was referred to the Supt of Streets

Bill of W. W. Thomas for \$37.⁰⁰ that due on cement walk. was read and on motion was allowed and a warrant ordered drawn on the Treasurer for the amount:
