

Lebanon Ore Oct 17th 1922

Council met in regular session:

Mayor Byron Millkap presiding:

All members of the Council present on roll call
Minutes of previous meeting read and approved:

The committee on ways and means reported
that equipment, consisting of Coats, Boots &c
had been purchased, for the Fire Department:

The Committee on Streets and Public Property
reported, in favor of granting petition for a
light on Eaton Street: and
On motion, the light was ordered installed:

The Mayor reported that the Farmers Union
would hold their state convention in Lebanon
on Dec 7th 8th and 9th 1922

The Supt of Streets reported, that he had been to
Albany, to consult with Officials there, as to
methods employed to keep sewers open, and
that the Supt of Streets of Albany, had invited
the members of City Council of Lebanon, to visit
Albany and inspect their apparatus, and
had offered to loan the City of Lebanon, part
of their apparatus, to clean the sewers:

After discussion it was decided, that as many
as could do so, would go on Thursday, the 18th.
A Petition for the improvement of Cleveland
Street, from Isabella Street, north to Dodge Street
was read: and on motion the petition
was granted, and the City Attorney instructed
to prepare the necessary Resolutions and
Estimates:

The Supt of Streets made a written report
as to sidewalks, needed on 2nd Street
between Tangent Street and Olive Streets: and

Res # 3 ordering the construction of sidewalks, as
recommended by the Supt of Streets, was read
and on roll call was passed, all the members
of the Council voting yea:

Ord bill #17 for 1922. Repealing Ordinance # 291
 Ord # 293 was read the first, second and third
 times in regular order and passed
 all the members of the Council voting
 yes on the several roll calls.

Ord Bill #18 for 1922. a bill for an Ordinance granting
 a franchise to the Lebanon Mutual Telephone
 Co. was read the first time in full and
 on roll call, there being no objections, the
 bill was read by title only; and on
 motion was referred to the Ordinance Com-
 mittee for amendment and correction.

Budget
 1923. The Tentative Budget for 1923, as adopted
 by the Budget committee, was ordered
 published as required by Law.

Deeds for property on South Main Street
 and Edwards Street; for Park Purposes
 were received, and the Recorder instructed
 to have same placed on the County Records.
 On motion the Supt of Streets was in-
 structed to repair pavement at ^{intersection} corner
 of Main and Sherman Streets, and present
 the bill to the Leb & L and water Co.

The following bills were read and on motion
 were allowed and warrants ordered drawn
 on the Treasurer for the several amounts
