Council met as per adjournment of Nov 6
Mayor Thad Sterling presiding.

Minutes of previous meetings read and
approved as read:

A proposition of The Western Bond and Mortgage
Co. for the taking over, and investing of the
Sinking Fund for the retiring of the Seven
Bonds, was made by a representative of
that company:

and a written report of the Committee on account
approving the plan was read; and after dis-
cussion, was referred back to the Committee
for further investigation, with instructions to
confer with the Local Banks, in regard to
investing the fund as it accumulates;

The Committee on Streets and Public property
recommended, that the petition for the improve-
ment of East Ash Street, that had been presented
at the meeting of Oct 16th be granted;

On Motion the City Attorney was instructed
to prepare the necessary resolutions, and that
the City Engineer and Dept of streets, prepare an
estimate of the probable cost of same.

The same Committee reported favorable to the
installation of a street light at the inter-
section of 5th and Oak Street.

On Motion the City Attorney was instructed
to take action to collect the amount of Oak
Street street assessment that had been paid
by Mr. Poickett to former City Attorney W.
M. Newport

Application was made by the Donaca Estate
for permission to build a regulation five
foot cement walk on the north side of Grant
Street, between 2nd and 3rd street instead of
