

Lebanon, Ore Nov 20<sup>th</sup> 1923  
 Council met in regular session  
 Mayor Thad Stelling presiding.  
 Councilmen present: For roll call. Elmer Fitzgerald  
 L. E. Heyne. Henry Hunt. Max Stewart and  
 Geo W Gandle.

Minutes of previous meeting read, and approved  
 as read.

The committee on streets and Public property  
 reported. that no petition for opening alley  
 between Main and Park Streets, from Inabella  
 Street south, had been presented, and that  
 they had no recommendation to make at the  
 present time.

They also reported construction of a check  
 gate in the Lebanon Canal, had been  
 started.

The committee on accounts reported that they  
 had no further report to make, on the matter  
 of investing the Sewer Bond sinking fund  
 and suggested that the matter be taken up  
 by the Council as a whole.

Mr Meyer, of the First National Bank offered  
 to invest the sinking fund for the City  
 to receive a return to the City of six per cent  
 per annum, compounded semi annually.  
 A motion was made and carried, that the  
 City accept Mr Meyers proposition, to the  
 amount of \$1500<sup>00</sup> as soon as the money  
 is available; and the City Attorney was  
 instructed to prepare an Ordinance to that  
 effect.

The City Attorney reported, that Mr Newport  
 requested, two week more time, to investigate  
 the matter of payment of street assessments,  
 by Mr Pickett.

On motion the request was granted.

The Com. on streets and Public property, was  
 instructed to ascertain the condition of  
 the sidewalk abutting on Lot # 4, Block # 3,  
 in Wm Ralston's addition; and report at  
 the next meeting.

for 1923. requiring of the City Engineer and Supt of Streets, estimates of the probable cost of the improvement of Ash Street, from the East line of the Lebanon and Santee Canal to the West line of Walnut Street was read, and on roll call, was passed, all the members <sup>of the Council</sup> present voting yes.

The estimate of the City Engineer and Superintendent of Streets, on the improvement of Ash Street was read, showing estimated total cost to be \$278.<sup>34</sup> the cost to be paid by the City for grading, to be \$108.<sup>00</sup> the cost to the owners of property benefitted thereby, to be \$170.<sup>34</sup>

On motion the report was adopted.

for 1923. accepting the report of the Supt of Streets and City Engineer on the cost of the improvement of Ash Street, and authorizing the Supt. of Streets, and Committee on Streets and Public Property, to proceed with the improvement as prayed for, was read, and on roll call was passed, all the members of the Council present voting, yes.

A communication from the Commercial Club in regard to an appropriation, to be added to the City Budget, for the Auto Park camp ground, was read, and a motion made and carried, that the City Attorney be instructed to prepare a petition, to the Tax Supervision Committee, of Lin. Co., requesting them to increase our Budget, by \$500.<sup>00</sup> for the benefit of the Auto Camp ground.

A motion was also made and carried, that the Tax Supervision Commission be requested to add \$250.<sup>00</sup> to the City Budget to take care of the Sewer Bond Sinking fund, and the City Attorney was instructed to prepare a petition to that effect.

The following bills were read and on motion were allowed, and warrants ordered drawn on the Treasurer for the several amounts.
