

Lebanon, O., Sept. 16th - 1924

Council met in regular session

Mayor Thad Sterling presiding

All members of the Council being present.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved as read.

The Com. on Streets and Public Property reported that they had secured the services of Mr. Junker of Albany, to repair the street pavement on East Grant St. The same Committee reported that the sidewalk on East Oak Street complained of at previous meeting was in bad condition and needed repairing; and that a cross walk was needed on Second Street, at intersection of A Street.

The Committee on Health and Police requested more time to report on failure of different property owners to connect with the sewer; there being no objection the request was allowed.

The Supt. of Streets reported that the improvement of East Oak St. and River Street would be completed in a few days.

A motion that the trees in front of Lots 5 & 6 Block 4, City of Lebanon be ordered removed and the sidewalk constructed on the proper line, was made and carried.

A petition for the construction of a bridge across the Lebanon Canal on East Oak Street was read and referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property.

The Committee on Streets & Public Property reported that they favored retaining the present Dump Ground, unless it could be sold for enough to purchase another. Communication requesting information as to the authority the City had empty sewage in what is known as the Mark's Slough, was read and referred to the City Attorney.
