


Lebanon, Oregon, June 16, 1942.

- CITY COUNCIL met in regular session, called to order at 8 P M by acting Mayor J C Zimbrick. Roll Call showed the following present: Councilmen Elmer Fitzgerald, Ralph Scroggan, J C Zimbrick, Fred Kerr, Vernon Tucker and C A Shimanek; Recorder, Geo H Randle; Attorney, F D Mayer; E C McClain, Street Supt.; S I Stewart, City Engineer. MINUTES of the meeting of June 3rd were read and approved.
- STREET COMMITTEE reported nothing definite as yet in progress with the Oregon Electric on S. end of Williams St. Leak in water main on Sherman Street between Main and Second, near the alley.
- Police & Health Committee brought up the matter of salaries and hours for the Police force, and by motion duly carried this matter was left in the hands of the Police Committee for settlement with power to act.
- PUBLIC PROPERTY Committee reported progress on the Building being erected on the roof of the City Hall for a Lookout Station, and that the same would be ready for use about the 25th of June.
- FIRE COMMITTEE reported some kick had been made regarding the sending out to the house on the City Park property the large pumper - by motion the matter of sending out the Pumpers was left in the hands of the Committee for settlement. Fire Chief Elmer Fitzgerald was appointed a committee of One to see what could be done regarding another Pumper.
- A letter from the FUC addressed to the Mayor was read and returned to him. The Mayor also reported on the 4-County Cantonment, reading report of Coordinator Johnson. The next meeting of the Council will be held in the Lion's room at the Coffee shop on Monday evening July 27, at 6:30 P.M.
- MARSHALL'S report showed 8 arrests for Drunk in Public Place, 1 Disorderly Conduct, 1 Assault on person, and 2 traffic arrests. Fines collected, \$83.00 in Cash, and 1 released to State Police, and 4 days served in City Jail.
- FIRE CHIEF reported 6 calls for the period, One at House in City Park, part of roof burned off; Hunt's Paint Shop, no damage; Log Truck at Cottonwoods (out of City) 1 Tractor fire, (out of City) Lebanon Laundry, no damage; McPherson Mill, (out of City).
- TREASURER reported, Balance June 1, all Funds \$ 21,950.16; Collections from Taxes, \$4,846.61; from City Recorder, \$213.67. Paid out for Sewer Bonds, \$2,906.25, Interest on Bonds, \$222.53, for City Warrants, \$1,606.13; Balance on hand all Funds, \$ 22,275.53.
- RECORDER reported Budget meeting held and adopted by the Committee, Meeting to be held on Monday, July 6 for final action.
- Manager of Camp Brewster asked permission to dump their Garbage in the City Dump, which was granted.
- STREET SUPT. stated that he had been using "screenings" to keep gravel in place, and could undoubtedly purchase Asphalt through some of the local dealers. Also that the fire at the Dump was burning all the time but as low as it could be done so it could be put out in case of Raid.
- CITY ENGINEER had a drawing of the proposed streets in the land of McDaniels and Rogers - no petition in, so no action taken.
- Regarding MUFFLERS, or rather the lack of them, Police were notified to pick up any trucks or cars that were making unnecessary noise.
- SEVERAL COMPLAINTS about grass and vines across sidewalks, and limbs hanging low were mentioned, and it was ordered that Police enforce the ordinance with help from the Street Supt. Bridge on Grove St. and also on Second reported in bad shape, and it was ordered to have signs made regarding the defacement of City Property at the Park or elsewhere in the City, and to prepare an ordinance covering same.
- RESOLUTION No. 2 for 1942, that the Recorder and Treasurer be and are hereby authorized and empowered to transfer to the General Fund all balances in all Funds of the City of Lebanon, Oregon, except the Sinking Funds, and the 1941 Series "A" Improvement Bond Fund and Interest Fund therefor, was presented and by motion on Roll Call was adopted all members of the Council voting "Aye" on the Roll-call.
- THE HIRING of a man to take the position of Listening Post Attendant from Midnight to 7:00 A M, was left in the hands of the Fire Committee. Also the hiring of a Paid Fireman was left in the hands of the Fire Committee.
- The Regular Bills against the City for the month of June were presented, amounting to \$1,564.35, and after being OK'd by the Finance Committee, were by motion allowed, and warrants ordered drawn on the Treasurer for the several amounts. Nothing further to come before the Council, adjourned to meet July 7, 1942, the beginning of a new Fiscal Year.
