April 2, 1968

City Council met irregular session called to order at 7:30 P.M. by Mayor Haevernick. Rollcall showed the following present: Councilmen John Smith, Orville Jones, Lyle Winters, Vern Reeves, Claude Robertson, Joe Estep. Also present were Recorder Thome, Attorney Gill, Public Wks. Supt. Stolsig, Acting Police Chief Borigo. Minutes of the regular meeting of March 19 were approved as submitted.

Pat Workman advised of a traffic problem in the vicinity of 7th and Grant streets, speeding etc. Street committee will study problem and possibility of Stop signs at intersection.

Street Committee recommended a 21,000 lumen street light be installed on the south side of West Oak between driveways of Bethel Assembly Church. Motion by Jones seconded by Winters that light be installed. Motion carried and so ordered.

Committee advised that 2 file cabinets could be purchased for Public Wks. Office at price of \$50.00 each. Motion by Jones seconded by Robertson that purchase be Okayed motion carried and so ordered.

Committee also reported that request had been received for a 4 - way stop at Franklin and Elmore. Franklin is now the arterial street. Request is referred to the street and Safety Committee for study.

Building Committee gave report for month of March as follows: 13 permits issued with valuation of \$23,340.00. Receipts from permits \$57.60.

Petitions for street improvement were read as follows: Paving, curbs, etc. for Elmore from Filbert to Eddie paving, curbs etc. for D street from 7th to 9th and 9th street from D street to E street. Fred Knowlen on behalf of Albert Wilson stated that Wilson who owns majority of abutting property did not wish to pave 9th street at this time. But was agreeable to grading and gravelling.

Motion by Jones seconded by Smith that petitions be accepted for Elmore street and D street and engineer be instructed to prepare plans and specifications. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Bill No. 10 to amend Ord. No. 1288 adding a clause concerning delinquency of dependent minors and to amend Ord. No. 1287 adding a section pertaining to being intoxicated on public streets was read in full for the first time. By unanimous rollcall vote the bill was read the second and third times by title only and passed by unanimous rollcall vote. The Mayor thereupon declared the bill passed and the title of the bill shall become the title of the Ordinance No. 1302.

Letter was read from the Public Utilities commission concerning study of 3rd and Tangent railroad crossing. Letter was read from Gibson and Gould requesting 30 day extension to complete their sewer contract. Motion by Smith seconded by Jones that extension be approved. Motion carried and so ordered.

Letter was read from Liberty Television requesting that additional rate service charge be added to their existing schedule. Rate would be \$5.00 for connection and \$5.00 per month for service. Motion by Smith seconded by Jones that additional rate schedule be approved. Motion carried and so ordered. Liberty Television also requested approval of change of collateral assignment of their franchise. Motion by Estep seconded by Robertson that change be approved. Motion carried and so ordered.

Councilman Smith reported complaint about a person doing car body and fender work at house on Evans Drive. Complaint referred to Police Department to investigate. Smith also reported that the one acre lot just east of Century Park property was available for \$8500.00 and the City could obtain a 90 day option of \$100.00. Mayor Haevernick stated that no monies were available for the purchase unless a special levy was voted.

April 16, 1968

City Council met in regular session called to order at 7:30 P.M. by Mayor Haevernick. Rollcall showed the following present. Councilmen John Smith, Orville Jones, Lyle Winters, Vern Reeves, Claude Robertson, Joe Estep. Also present were Recorder Thome Attorney Gill, Acting Police Chief Borigo, Public Wks. Supt. Stolsig, Fire Chief Robertson. Minutes of the regular meeting of April 2 were approved as submitted.

Police Committee reported that Sgt. Morris and Officer Miller were appointed Acting Senior and Junior Sergeants beginning April 1st.

Parks Committee reported all parks would soon be open for regular use.

Safety Committee reported no meeting last week because of the Budget Committee meeting and still working on Main and Milton intersection problems with the Highway department.

Acting Chief Borigo presented department report for month of March.

Petition was read to grade and gravel F Street from 7th Street west approximately 600 feet. Motion by Smith seconded by Jones to accept petition and have work done. Motion carried and so ordered.

Petition was read to grade and gravel 9th street from E street north approximately 440 feet. Motion by Jones seconded by Smith to accept petition and have work done. Motion carried and so ordered.

Petition was read to pave 3rd Street south from Kees Street and 4th Place north from Kees Street. Motion by Jones seconded by Winters to accept petition and have engineer prepare plans and specifications. Motion carried and so ordered.

Petition was read to complete paving and curbing of Post Street from Binshadler street to Ralston Drive. Motion by Reeves seconded by Robertson to accept petition and have engineer prepare plans and specifications. Motion carried and so ordered.

Petition was read to pave Elmore Street from Filbert street to Eddie Street. Motion by Jones seconded by Winters to accept petition and have engineer prepare plans and specifications. Motion carried and so ordered.

Resolution No. 3 for submitting to the voters at a special election the amounts of \$85,076.00 for General Fund operation and \$6,000 for ambulance service for the fiscal year 1968-69 was read in full. Motion by Smith seconded by Winters that Resolution be adopted. Motion carried by 5 to 1 vote with Reeves voting NO and so ordered.

Ordinance Bill No. 11 calling a special election on May 20, 1968 to submit the proposition for a tax levy for the general fund in the amount of \$85,076 and a tax levy for ambulance service in the amount of \$6,000 both for the fiscal year 1968-69, was read in full for the first time. By unanimous rollcall vote the bill was read the second and third times by title only and passed by unanimous rollcall vote. The Mayor thereupon declared the bill passed and the title of the bill shall become the title of the Ordinance No. 1303.

Ordinance Bill NO. 12 to amend Ordinance 1287 concerning alcoholic liquors and Bill No. 13 to amend Ordinance 1288 concerning concealed weapons were each read in full
