Subject: Ranney Collector Intake Pump Replacement

<u>Recommended Motion</u>: Authorize City Manager to enter into an agreement with Siskiyou Pump in the amount of \$65,813 to replace the Ranney Collecter Intake Pump #1.

Financial Impact: \$65,813 to be funded from the Water SRF Fund.

#### **Background/Discussion:**

During a routine annual inspection performed on the intake pumps at the Ranney Collector in August of 2019 it was discovered that intake Pump #1 was cavitating during operation. Staff performed the annual maintenance but it did not reduce the cavitation. The pump was taken out of service and divers were employed to inspect the condition of the intake structure and pumps. Divers indicated that there is damage to Pump #1 impellers and bowls.

Due to the condition of the Raw Water Intake Pump #1 and column, Jacobs recommended the replacement of the existing pump, pump column and discharge head.

Jacobs initiated a request for proposal (RFP) process in order to obtain three qualified bids to do the work. Three separate contractors submitted bids on the project, one of which was disqualified because they did not include the installation. Siskiyou Pump was the low bidding contractor. The proposed plan for a partial rebuild of Pump #3 and a full replacement of Pump #1 motor, pump, pump column and discharge head.

After the work has been completed, dive inspections by qualified divers will be scheduled periodically for the ongoing monitoring of the intake structure and pump condition.

It is also our recommendation, due to the age of the structure and pumps, that additional pump and motor replacements be planned for in upcoming years.







WHEREAS, the minimum level of key urban facilities and services can be provided in an orderly and efficient manner to the annexed properties, in a logical manner; and,

WHEREAS, a Staff Report (Attachment A) regarding annexation of the properties addressing all relevant criteria was presented to Planning Commission and City Council of the City of Brooking; and,

WHEREAS, on July 7, 2020, the Planning Commission of the City of Brookings conducted a public hearing and considered the request for annexation, and issued a recommendation for approval, based on the findings and conclusions included in the Staff Report, onto City Council for final action.

#### NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY OF BROOKINGS ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS,

Section 1. Based upon the findings above and Attachments A through D and Exhibits A 1 through 5, which are all incorporated herein by this reference as a basis for the Council decision, the City Council of the City of Brookings does hereby approve annexation of the properties into the City of Brookings as being described as follows:

KCIW Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

Financial Impact:

No change; lease revenue already budgeted.

#### Background/Discussion:

On September 8, 2014, the City Council authorized the City Manager to prepare and execute an agreement with Curry Coast Community Radio to install and maintain a radio broadcast antenna on the City public safety communications tower, with the term of the agreement to be three years and with the applicant to pay all costs associated with installing and maintaining the antenna, including electricity costs.

The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City of Brookings and Curry Coast Community Radio (KCIW) was signed in March 2015. A new MOU was signed, effective November 1, 2019 for \$100 per month for twelve months, to allow KCIW time to find a new location for their antenna. This MOU will expire October 31, 2020.

City staff met with KCIW staff soon after about alternative locations, but not recently, as many activities have been slowed down due to COVID. Negotiations with a private cell phone provider were also halted during much of the current pandemic. Day Wireless informed us that those negotiations just started back up in recent months.

Rose Mantle and Candice Michel, representing KCIW, made a presentation at the July 27, 2020 council meeting, and Council requested this topic be on a future workshop. That workshop was held on August 3, 2020. At that workshop, I gathered input from the Council, and drafted the agreement accordingly. No members of the Council requested a change in the lease amount. On the length of the agreement, two suggested a one-year agreement, two suggested "up to" three years, and one was fine with one, two, or three years. The attached draft agreement is for one-year with the option to renew for two separate one-year terms.

We also added language to section 1.3.3 to include a deadline of February 1, 2021, for the local emergency override system to be operational, and to section 1.4 so that all types of programming were allowed to be broadcast.

KCIW had requested revisions to include no cost and a term that would start with a three-year term with the option to renew for two additional three-year terms. Also, they requested language to have the cost associated with enabling the emergency broadcast system be negotiated. As well as the following language for Section 1.4:

1.4 The City desires to support the efforts of KCIW, as described above, recognizing the value of this service to the Brookings Community. Consistent with the KCIW mission statement and suitable programming guidelines, KCIW programming will encourage differing perspectives that are representative of the Brookings community. KCIW will assist the City in the timely broadcasting of City requested public service and emergency related announcements/programming.

I added some of their language requests, but not the other terms. I believe that the attached Draft Proposed MOU represents the Council's consensus at the August Workshop.

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING City of Brookings and Curry Coast Community Radio (KCIW)

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is executed by and between the CITY OF BROOKINGS (City) and CURRY COAST COMMUNITY RADIO, Inc. (KCIW) a non-profit corporation, City and KCIW hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Parties."

#### 1.0 RECITALS

- 1.1 WHEREAS, KCIW is a non-profit organization.
- 1.2 KCIW desires to develop and operate a broadcast antenna on the Emergency Communications Tower (Tower) owned and operated by the City of Brookings, at 898 Elk Drive, Brookings, Oregon.
- 1.3 Public radio services provided by KCIW will include:
  - 1.3.1 Public service announcements provided by the City.
  - 1.3.2 Community event and City meeting schedules.
  - 1.3.3 Emergency notification and information broadcasts. In the event of a disaster or emergency impacting the Brookings-Harbor community, KDIW transmission resources and frequency shall be made available to the City. The local emergency override system will be installed, operational, and useable by the City of Brookings' personnel by February 1, 2021.
- 1.4 The City desires to support the efforts of KCIW, as described above, recognizing the value of this service to the Brookings community. KCIW programming will encourage differing perspectives that are representative of the Brookings community. KCIW will assist the City in the timely broadcasting of City requested public service and emergency related announcements/programming. KCIW also commits to allow all reasonably requested programming, including different perspectives than that of current and/or future programming. It is understood that requested programming would need to be reasonably scheduled.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties promise and agree as follows:

#### **2.0** TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 2.1 The above-recitals are hereby incorporated by reference as though fully set forth herein.
- 2.2 KCIW will retain the space rental for a broadcast antenna and all associated equipment on Tower. The specific location of all such facilities shall be as determined by the tower management contractor.
- 2.3 KCIW shall pay the City \$100 monthly (\$1,200 annually), effective November 1, 2020.
- 2.4 All costs associated with installing and maintaining an antenna and related equipment shall be borne by KCIW.
- 2.5 Use of Tower by KCIW shall be secondary to the City's primary use of Tower for emergency communications. All KCIW facilities shall be removed from Tower at the expense of KCIW upon reasonable written notice from City or tower management contractor.

- 2.6 All City facilities, within which KCIW facilities are located, are under the security control of the City of Brookings Police Department, which shall establish rules, policies and procedures for KCIW access to those areas.
- 2.7 Term: The term of this MOU shall be 12 months from effective date, November 1, 2020, with the option to renew for two separate one-year terms by August 1<sup>st</sup> of the year of renewal. Therefore, this agreement will expire October 31, 2023; if it is renewed for each term. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the parties may terminate this MOU upon ninety (90) days notice, with or without cause.

#### 3.0 NOTICE:

3.1 Notice to either of the parties shall be (1) by personal delivery, (2) by facsimile and regular U.S. mail, (3) by U.S. Mail, registered receipt requested, or (4) e-mail. Notice shall be deemed effective upon personal delivery, email, or, in the case of a mailing, upon the depositing of the mail with the United States postal service. Notice shall be given as follows:
