West Eugene EmX Extension Corridor Committee Charge

The purpose of the committee is to bring strong insights into how the project can best be integrated along the corridor consistent with the values of the adjacent neighborhoods and businesses. Specifically, the West Eugene EmX Corridor Committee will:

- 1) Serve as a conduit of information between the project team, EmX Steering Committee, LTD Board of Directors, and the committee members' affiliated groups.
- Advise the project team on key technical and community issues regarding the project.

Issues to be considered by the Corridor Committee in development of the West Eugene EmX Corridor will vary by location and stage of project development. While time will not be allotted to public testimony during committee meetings, public comments received as part of the project will be discussed by the Corridor Committee.

The charge of the Corridor Committee is to provide advice to the EmX Steering Committee and the LTD Board of Directors. The Board's ultimate decisions will be informed, not by the results of votes on specific positions, but on the full range of discussion by the West Eugene EmX Corridor Committee members.

To provide the best information for the EmX Steering Committee and the Board processes, the Corridor Committee will be most effective by focusing its work on a collaborative and insightful discussion of issues that can explore the full range of positions, not on establishing a preferred position of a majority.

West Eugene EmX Extension Corridor Committee Operating Agreements


- Meetings will begin and end on time.
 - Committee members will strive to accomplish all agenda items during regularly scheduled meetings.
 - If agenda items cannot be completed on time, staff will work with the committee to determine if the meeting should be extended in order to provide timely advice on key issues.
 - Issues and concerns requiring extensive discussion may require additional meetings if within the project timeline.
- During the meetings, committee members will:
 - Be respectful of everyone's time, input, concerns, and issues.
 - Listen to what others have to say.
 - Be quiet while others are speaking.
 - Acknowledge the value that each Corridor Committee member brings to the process.
 - Silence cell phones during the meeting.
 - Provide everyone the opportunity to speak.
 - Engage each other in a productive manner, focused on completing the requested tasks on the agenda.
- The flow of discussions will be managed to allow for the development of advice from committee members to be forwarded to the EmX Steering Committee and the LTD Board of Directors for consideration.



West Eugene EmX Extension Corridor Committee Meeting Mechanics

- Every meeting will be opened and closed by an LTD Board member serving as a convener.
- Tom Schwetz or his designee will serve as facilitator, and staff will be the point of contact / discussion during meetings to ensure the timely and productive completion of the agenda and assigned tasks.
- The Corridor Committee will generally meet monthly for the duration of the project. At times, in order to obtain advice and feedback from the committee, LTD may request that the committee meet more frequently in order to meet project deadlines.
- LTD will strive to provide informational materials to the committee at least three to seven calendar days prior to meetings. LTD will generally distribute information electronically; however, LTD may use a variety of methods to provide information, especially if document files are large. Because of the dynamic nature of the project, newly developed materials may be delivered to the committee at the meeting.
- Because one of the primary purposes of this committee is to provide the project team
 with timely advice on key technical and community issues that are linked to project
 deliverables and milestones, LTD expects that committee members will review
 materials prior to meetings and productively participate in committee meetings.
- LTD expects that committee members will serve as conduits of information with their
 affiliated groups and appropriately communicate with those groups. It is incumbent on
 the committee member to determine the most appropriate method of communication
 with his or her affiliated group and to conduct that communication in a timely manner so
 that all ideas, opinions, and issues can be productively considered in the project
 process.
- It is incumbent on committee members to determine if they can appropriately serve on this committee for the two- to three-year project duration. If a committee member determines that he or she cannot meet the review, communication, and feedback commitments in a timely manner for the project duration, LTD will work with the member and/or the member's affiliated group or organization to find a replacement member who can meet the commitments of serving on the committee.
- LTD will provide mapping, reports, and other information necessary to ensure meaningful participation on the committee. LTD will attempt to honor requests for additional information beyond the information prepared for the project; however, the significant effort associated with producing required materials under the National Environmental Protection Act (NEPA) process may preclude producing additional informational materials.
- Advice from all meetings will be documented. Electronic versions of advice from the committee will be distributed to committee members.
- Meeting summaries of each meeting will be prepared.





Proposed Purpose and Need Statement

The **Purpose** of the proposed West Eugene EmX Extension Project is to improve transit travel time, reliability, ridership, efficiency, and effectiveness in the West 11th Corridor (east/west); to support local and regional plans and goals for land use and transportation; to support economic development opportunities in the corridor, while being sensitive to and protecting environmental resources; and obtaining local public support.

The **Need** for the project results from:

- Historic and projected increases in traffic congestion in the West 11th Corridor due to increases in regional and corridor population and employment;
- Lengthy transit travel times and deteriorating transit reliability in the West 11th Corridor due to growing traffic congestion;
- Increasingly scarce transit operating revenues;
- Adoption and amendment of the Regional Transportation Plan that reflect bus rapid transit (BRT) as the region's preferred high capacity transit mode;
- Recent removal of the West Eugene Parkway as a regional transportation system improvement;
- Growing reliance on transit by the region to meet mobility needs in the West 11th Corridor; Prioritization of the West 11th travel shed by the City of Eugene and LTD as the region's third BRT corridor;
- Local and regional land use and development goals and objectives that target the West 11th Corridor for residential, commercial, retail, and industrial development to help accommodate forecasted regional population and employment growth; and
- Identification and protection of important resources in the natural and built environment in the West 11th Corridor, including but not limited to wetlands, and rare plants and animals and their habitat that could limit options for improvements to the transportation system.


Proposed Goal and Objectives

The **Goal** of the West Eugene EmX Extension Project is to improve transit travel time, reliability, ridership, efficiency, and effectiveness in the West 11th Corridor (east/west); to support local and regional plans and goals for land use and transportation; and to support economic development opportunities in the corridor, while being sensitive to and protecting environmental resources and obtaining local public support.

The **Objectives** of the West Eugene EmX Extension Project in the West 11th Corridor are to:

- ~ Provide convenient, fast, and reliable transit service in the Corridor;
- Improve the efficiency and effectiveness of transit service in the Corridor;
- Support the desired land use patterns and development in the Corridor;
- ~ Help accommodate future growth in travel demand in the Corridor;
- Seek opportunities to enhance the safety and operations for pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorists traveling in the Corridor;
- ~ Provide for a fiscally stable and efficient transit system; and
- Provide an environmentally sensitive design for the project.
