The meeting was called to order at 7:10 a.m. by Don Hall, at the Tapadera Restaurant, 112 W. Second Street, The Dalles, Oregon.

MINUTES - FEBRUARY 21, 1990

A motion was made by Frank Bonn and seconded by Maury Snow to approve the minutes of February 21, 1990. The motion carried unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS

McMurdo Request for Signing of Street: Mrs. McMurdo and all affected parties have been notified of the signing change and are satisfied.

NEW BUSINESS:

Request from School District #12 for a Sign Change at the High School: Ross Cain, Maintenance Supervisor from District 12 showed pictures of the loading zone at 11th and Washington Streets and explained how illegal parking there has caused a dangerous situation for buses needing to load and unload students at the school. When police enforcement was implemented, college students complained about parking rights. A motion was made by Frank Bonn and seconded by Maury Snow that D-12 be allowed to replace the one current "Loading Zone" sign with 2 signs saying "Buses Only". Motion passed.

2 September 1989

To whom it may concern:

We, the Scout Committee and Boy Scouts of Troops 352 and 357 sponsored by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (Mormon), propose to and ask permission of The City of The Dalles to bore holes in the sidewalk in front of part of the enclosed business addresses.

The holes will be about twelve (12) inches deep and about two and one half (2 1/2) inches in diameter. Each hole will be lined with a steel tube about one and one half (1 1/2) inches in diameter and fitted with a counter weighted cover flush or nearly so with the sidewalk; thus, creating no hazard for pedestrians.

These holes will be used to set American Flags on specific holidays and at other special times through out the year. This activity is a major source of revenue for our Troops.

We know that many holes of various sizes now exist and are used for this purpose and we propose to either fill and plug these holes or bring them to the standards described in this letter and depicted in the accompanying diagram.

All will be about twelve (12) inches deep.

All will be about one and one half (1 1/2) inches finished diameter.

All will have a nearly flush fitting cover about two and one half (2 1/2) inches in diameter.

All will be between twelve (12) and twenty-four (24) inches from the face of the curb.

Dear Julie:

As per my conversation with Cindy in the County Works Department, I am writing you regarding the placing of one or more Stop signs or caution signs on East 11th Street, between Kelly Avenue and The Dalles High School.

My husband, son and myself have only lived in our house for a short time, but I have seen numerous "close calls" and in fact was practically run down today with my son in his stroller while making a legal crossing at Jefferson Street. Cars, trucks, motorcycles, and delivery trucks constantly abuse the 25 mile per hour speed limit, and put many people at risk. Anyone or anything trying to cross 11th Street must contend with vehicles travelling in excess of 50 to 60 miles per hour in a very residential area. It is frightening to think of what can and will happen eventually if something is not done about this dangerous problem.

I hope the council will seriously consider looking into this matter before someone is seriously hurt or killed. People should not have to dive out of the way of speeding vehicles while taking a walk with their children in the afternoon. We need safe neighborhoods for our friends and families.

My husband Joe and myself will be attending the May oth Council Meeting, and we hope something will be done. Please call me at your earliest convenience at 296-4012 and inform me of the location and time of the meeting.

Dear Mrs. Chamberlain:

The Traffic Safety Commission reviewed your request for increased visibility at the intersection of West 7th and Walnut.

It was decided to deny your request for the U-Haul Rental trucks to park further back from the intersection based upon the reasons that this is one of the widest intersections in town and if the speed limit is being observed there should be no problem when pulling out onto Walnut Street. Mark Sullivan, with the Traffic Safety Commission, also had the Fire Department go out to that intersection and measure the visibility distance when the U-Haul trucks are parked on the street and in the private lot. It was determined that the visibility distance was sufficient.

The Traffic Safety Commission also reviewed your request for a stop sign at the St. Mary's exit on West 10th Street.

This request was denied based on the Oregon Vehicle Code Book - Rule #811.280, please see the attached sheet.

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(Right of Way)

811.275 Failure to yield right of way at uncontrolled intersection; penalty. (1) A person commits the offense of failure to yield the right of way at an uncontrolled intersection if the person is operating a motor vehicle that is approaching an uncontrolled highway intersection and the person does not look out for and give right of way to any driver on the right simultaneously approaching a given point, regardless of which driver first reaches and enters the intersection.

- (2) This section is subject to the described provisions of the following sections:
- (a) The provisions of ORS 811.260, relating to stop signs and yield signs.
- (b) The provisions of ORS 811.285, relating to the requirements to yield the right of way upon entering a freeway or other arterial highway.
- (3) A person entering an intersection at an unlawful speed shall forfeit any right of way the person would otherwise have under subsection (1) of this section.
- (4) The offense described in this section, failure to yield right of way at an uncontrolled intersection, is a Class B traffic infraction. [1983 c.338 §611; 1985 c.16 §311; 1987 c.138 §4]
- 811.280 Failure of driver entering roadway to yield right of way; penalty. (1) A person commits the offense of failure of a driver entering a roadway to yield the right of way if the person:
- (a) Is operating a vehicle that is about to enter or cross a roadway from any private road, driveway, alley or place other than another roadway; and
- (b) Does not yield the right of way to any vehicle approaching on the roadway to be entered or crossed so closely as to constitute an immediate hazard.
- (2) This section does not apply where the movement of traffic is otherwise directed by a traffic control device.
- (3) The offense described in this section, failure of driver entering roadway to yield right of way, is a Class C traffic infraction. [1983 c.338 §612]

811.285 Failure of merging driver to yield right of way; penalty. (1) A person commits the offense of failure of a merging driver to yield the right of way if the person is operating a vehicle that is entering a freeway or other arterial highway where an acceleration or merging lane is provided for the operator's use and the operator does not look out for and give right of way to vehicles on the freeway or other arterial highway.

- (2) The offense described in this section, failure of a merging driver to yield the right of way, is a Class C traffic infraction. [1983 c.338 §613]
- 811.290 Obstructing cross traffic; penalty. (1) A person commits the offense of obstructing cross traffic if the person is operating a vehicle and the person enters an intersection or a marked crosswalk when there is not sufficient space on the other side of the intersection or crosswalk to accommodate the vehicle without obstructing the passage of other vehicles or pedestrians.
- (2) The offense described in this section applies whether or not a traffic control device indicates to proceed.
- (3) The offense described in this section, obstructing cross traffic, is a Class C traffic infraction. [1983 c.338 §614]

(Driving on the Right)

811.295 Failure to drive on right; exceptions; penalty. (1) A person commits the offense of failure to drive on the right if the person is operating a vehicle on a roadway of sufficient width and the person does not drive on the right half of the roadway.

- (2) A person is not required to drive on the right side of the roadway by this section under any of the following circumstances:
- (a) When overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction under the rules governing this movement in ORS 811.410 to 811.425.
- (b) When preparing to turn left in an intersection, alley or private road or driveway.
- (c) When an obstruction or condition exists making it necessary to drive to the left of the center of the roadway, provided that a driver doing so shall yield the right of way to all vehicles traveling in the proper direction upon the unobstructed portion of the roadway within a distance as to constitute an immediate hazard.
- (d) Upon a roadway divided into three marked lanes for traffic under the rules applicable on the roadway under ORS 811.380.
- (e) Upon a roadway restricted to one-way traffic.
- (3) The offense described in this section, failure to drive on the right, is a Class B traffic infraction. [1983 c.338 §615]

811.300 Failure to drive on right of approaching vehicle; exceptions; penalty.
(1) A person commits the offense of failure to drive on the right of an approaching vehicle if the person is operating a vehicle upon a roadway having width for not more than

Dear Mr. Rieke:

The Traffic Safety Commission reviewed your request for extending the "No Parking" zone upon leaving your parking lot on East 11th Street.

It was decided that the No Parking zone is in accordance with city standards, therefore your request was denied.

The Traffic Safety Commission does agree that it is difficult to see when exiting your lot on East 11th Street, but that the school parking is at a premium and can not afford to lose two more parking spaces. Also the school's main activity time is Monday thru Friday and the church's main activity time is on Sunday.

The Traffic Safety Commission also suggests that you make the East 11th Street access an "Entrance Only" and your alley and "Exit Only", thus eliminated the visibility problem on East 11th Street.
