1. Roll Call

Mayor Ryan called the meeting to order at 6:32pm.

2. Discussion: Citywide Priorities & Goal Setting

Mike Abbate, Facilitator with Abbate Designs, introduced himself and began his PowerPoint Presentation (attached as Exhibit A to these minutes).

Mike Abbate asked that everyone introduce themselves by answering the following questions: what's your name, how long you've lived in Troutdale, how long you've been on Council, and what does Troutdale need?

Mayor Ryan stated that he's lived in Troutdale for 15 years, been on the Council for 3 years, and Troutdale needs visionary leadership.

Councilor Kranz stated that she's lived in Troutdale for 7 years, been on the Council for 1 year and 1 month, and Troutdale needs more engagement from all ages.

Councilor White stated that he's lived in Troutdale for 30 years, been on the Council for 11 years, and Troutdale needs new development and new attractions.

Councilor Moon stated that he's lived in Troutdale for 6 years and in the area for over 10 years and I'd like to see more community events and community involvement.

Councilor Hudson stated that he's lived in Troutdale for 11 years....(inaudible)

Ray Young stated that he lived in Troutdale for 3 years (1985-1987) and Troutdale needs continuing investment into great housing and development in the URA.

Councilor Ripma stated that he's lived in Troutdale for 30 years, he's been on the Council about 20 years, and Troutdale is so great and what it needs is to keep it great which takes the leadership and involvement that you're all talking about.

Councilor Lauer stated that he's lived in Troutdale for 9 years, he's been on the Council for 3 years, and Troutdale could use more clear direction.

Councilor Moon stated he thought the Urban Growth Boundary expansion should be on the list.

Ray Young replied that would be similar to the road issue in that it would take a number of years and a fair amount of staff resources. It's not unfair to say that in the Budget you would have to dedicate 1 FTE for at least 2 years to do that.

Councilor White stated he would consider input on ideas to further incentivize downtown businesses to fill vacancies.

Councilor Lauer added that one of the best things that Gresham did for its downtown was to incentivize small and new businesses, not chain stores, to help revitalize the downtown. I would like to see something similar to what Councilor White is saying where we promote businesses in our area. I'm not saying remove all fees like Fairview has done but things like permitting or applications, small chunks where we can clear some red tape.

Chris Damgen, Community Development Director, states that the Town Center Committee will be looking at.
