BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE MEETNG OCTOBER 18, 2021

CALL TO ORDER

President Tiffany Prince called the meeting to order at 4:04 pm.

ROLL CALL

City Clerk Izetta Grossman conducted roll call; all members present

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

It was moved by Rahmlow and seconded by Nelson to approve the agenda as presented. The motion carried 5 to 0; Prince, Nelson, Krummrich, Lennox and Rahmlow voting in favor; none opposed.

APPROVAL OF MINTUES

It was moved by Krummrich and seconded by Nelson to approve the minutes of the October 4, 2021 Regular Beautification Committee Meeting as presented. The motion carried 5 to 0; Prince, Nelson, Krummrich, Lennox and Rahmlow voting in favor; none opposed.

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COMMITTEE REPORTS

Stop the Drop/Community Clean-ups – Ad proposal

Krummrich reviewed the report (attached).

Krummrich said there were two citizens that show up to every clean up. She asked if the Committee approved of giving them each a cap as a thank you. The Committee was in favor.

Krummrich reviewed the proposal from Bicoastal Media for an ad campaign. Grossman said it was a good number of ads for the price.

Items discussed:

Local musician to help with jingle (song)
Sub group to help flesh out message
Different messages for 60 second ad and 30 second ad

It was moved by Krummrich and seconded by Nelson to spend \$1000.00 with Bicoastal Media on an awareness campaign. The motion carried 5 to 0; Krummrich, Nelson, Prince, Lennox, Rahmlow in favor; none opposed.

POTENTIAL NEW PROJECTS DISCUSSION

The following items were discussed and decisions made as noted under each topic:

Stop the Drop –expand awareness

Consensus of Committee was to keep this Stop the Drop as a long-term project, find ways to increase awareness.

Ideas discussed:

- Krummrich to contact teachers to see how she could be involved, during this time of COVID:
 - o Zoom into Classrooms
 - o Provide curriculum for teachers
 - Provide posters
- Sub-Committee to assist Krummrich with project
- Signage on City Trucks
- Flyers with utility billing
- City Newsletter
- Facebook campaign
- Adopt a street promotion
- Civic involvement project

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SIDE NOTE: Lennox asked if there was any word on City doing the Welcome Signs. Grossman said the project was slated for next budget cycle. She said she would keep the Committee informed.

Downtown Trees – recommend City remove dead trees; City wide trees

Committee decided this should be a Long-term project.

Discussed:

- Recommend City hire arborist to catalogue current status of trees in the city and make recommendations for replacement/new trees
- Identify areas that could accommodate trees easily
- Trees are good for shade, climate control
- Look into grants Oregon Department of Forestry; OSU Extension Urban Forestry
- 1992 Comprehensive Study done by Citizens with draft ordinance (Lennox will provide to Rahmlow)

Container Plantings Downtown – flowers/metal art; BC provide containers

Item to bring to City Visioning Process

Items discussed:

- Living matter softens look of downtown
- Need strong commitment from the City for planting/watering
- Do a walk about as Committee see what is there now
- Have a theme plan
- Metal art option
- Sustainability

Vogt Fountain – help find plumber

Short term project

Items discussed:

Work with Northern Wasco Parks and Recreation to find suitable volunteer Skot Barker willing to volunteer

Work hard in next three months to identify a volunteer, ready to turn fountain back on in Spring

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Wind Sculpture – more locations

Committee decided to pursue identifying new locations. Ongoing project.

Ordinance regarding empty storefronts – see attached information from City Community Development Department

Short term project.

- Discuss at November 1, 2021 meeting on how to proceed
- Part of Visioning Process?
- Identify things to make better

Grossman said the items sounded like things that should be presented at the Vision Planning meetings. She said she would invite Alice Cannon, Community Development Director to the next meeting to explain the process to the Committee.
