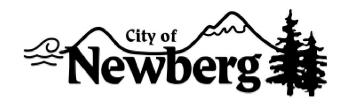


EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The City's current water supply is drawn from groundwater production wells located in the City's well field on the south side of the Willamette River in Marion County. The well field is accessible from Riverside Road, off Champoeg Road and Highway 219 (refer to Figure 1). From the wellfield the raw water is conveyed to the water treatment plant north of the Willamette River within two transmission lines. There is over 56 miles of potable water piping, and one booster pump station in the water distribution system. For distribution and storage there are three reservoirs. The average daily water demand is about 2.4 million gallons per day (mgd) and the maximum day demand is approximately 4.5 mgd in summertime.

The Water Master Plan notes that the City's system is vulnerable to flooding, ground movement, seismic activity or other natural disasters. It was recommended that the City assess redundant supply options on the north side of the Willamette River.

Per the Master Plan, the redundant source, piping and treatment system should supply a capacity of one day of wintertime average daily demand. The current wintertime average daily demand is approximately 2 mgd. The Master Plan evaluated the expansion of a ground water source in Appendix C of the plan. Other options may include a surface water source, and interties to other nearby potable water supply systems.

As the project scope was being developed, the question arose if the need for 'emergency supply' is enough or should the City be evaluating a long term full redundant supply. The slideshow will have more information on options and criteria for making this important decision.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

On January 5, 2005, the Newberg City Council adopted Resolution No. 2005-2553, which created the downtown street banner program by approving the initial spring and fall banner designs and adopted an official Newberg slogan of "Newberg – Home of George Fox University". Subsequent Resolutions (2005-2579, 2005-2607) approved summer and winter banner designs.

In 2010, the Newberg City Council adopted Resolution No. 2010-2903, approving a new design for the fall banners, which were designed and paid for by George Fox University (GFU).

On May 16, 2016, the Newberg City Council adopted Resolution No. 2016-3288, which approved a banner design celebrating GFUs 125th anniversary. The 125th anniversary banners were hung in August of 2016 and remained for one year. After one year the seasonal banners were hung.

The winter and spring banners are almost 15 years old and colors have faded. The current fall banners are approximately 9 years old and will continue to be used. GFU is requesting approval for new spring and winter banner designs (Exhibit A). The proposed banners will be the same size as the current banners. GFU is willing to cover all printing and delivery expenses.

The two referral review agencies that are pertinent for review of the downtown banners are PGE and ODOT. Both of the aforementioned review agencies have reviewed and approved the banner proposal.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Newberg Public Works Department currently handles all banner changes, and would be in charge of hanging the new banner as well. GFU would pay for the design and fabrication of the new banners. Therefore, there is not a fiscal impact to the city.







EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The City of Newberg was designated a "Certified Local Government" (CLG) by the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) in 2014, which made the City eligible to apply for CLG grant funds. The City of Newberg has applied for a 2019 CLG grant through the State Historic Preservation Office to survey historic features in and around the downtown area. The CLG grant application deadline was February 22, 2019, which staff has met, and requires a 100% local match (in money or staff time).

The Historic Preservation Commission asked staff to start a project that documents historic sidewalk features and determined an inventory of historic features in and around downtown Newberg would be best. The survey will include historic features throughout downtown Newberg like sidewalk and curb stamps, mail posts, horseshoe rings, and historic rail tracks. City staff has contacted a number of consultants to determine the best organization for preforming the historic inventory work. The chosen consultant will research the history of the items, document the location and GIS coordinates, prepare public presentations, progress reports, and follow-up with SHPO and the National Park Service throughout the nomination process.

The award is for a \$6,000.00 CLG grant, which will be matched by \$6,000.00 of General Fund money to hire a consultant and conduct inventory work.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Planning Division fund has \$6,000 in professional services for FY 19/20 as a match for the grant.

- 3. After City Manager authorization, staff will enter into an agreement with SHPO for a \$6,000.00 CLG grant to be used to hire a historic preservation consultant. The consultant will create an inventory of historic features, write progress reports, and give related presentations to the public.

THE CITY OF NEWBERG RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The City of Newberg supports the preservation of historic features such as sidewalk stamps, curb stamps, horseshoe rings, mail posts, and historic rail tracks in Newberg.
- 2. The City of Newberg therefore accepts the 2019 CLG grant for \$6,000.00 from SHPO to be used for the creation of an inventory of historic features throughout downtown Newberg.
- 3. The City Manager is authorized to negotiate and execute necessary contracts associated with the award from the grant application.

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt Resolution No. 2019-3568, recommending that Yamhill County approve the proposed partition on NE Bell Road (Yamhill County tax lot no. 3209-01000).

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: On May 7, 2019 the City of Newberg received a copy of a partition application to divide a property (Yamhill County tax lot no. 3209-01000) on NE Bell Road into three parcels. The property is located outside the city limits, but inside the Newberg Urban Reserve Area. This site is adjacent to tax lot 1001 on which Newberg City Council recommended approval of a three lot partition in February 2019 (Bell Road Partition, GEN19-0001). That partition is shown on the tentative partition plat. The current zoning is Yamhill County VLDR-2.5. There is no city comprehensive plan designation for the site since it is not within the Newberg urban growth boundary.

Yamhill County has jurisdiction over the site, and will make the final decision on the partition application. The Newberg Urban Area Growth Management Agreement states that the City Council shall make a recommendation to the County on land use applications, including partitions, within the urban growth boundary. The City has 60 days from the receipt of the application to make a recommendation.

The site is located on NE Bell Road, Yamhill County tax lot no. 3209-01000. It is approximately 7.58 acres and used for farming. The proposal is to divide the property into three parcels ranging from 2.28 to 2.65 acres in size.

The City's intent in the Urban Area Growth Management Agreement is to recommend that the County only allow development in the Urban Reserve Area that is limited in scope and consistent with the future urban development of the property. The site is in the Urban Reserve Area, so at some point in the future it is anticipated that the property may be annexed into the city. The proposed partition would not preclude the future urbanization and development of the rest of the property. The applicant's future development plan shows an example of how the site, along with the adjacent site (Yamhill County tax lot no. 3209-01001), which was previously approved for partitioning, could be developed if someday annexed into the city. An exact lot layout is not proposed but a street network showing how access could be provided to smaller blocks is shown along with potential locations of one single-family home on each of the partitioned parcels. No new homes are proposed with this application. The applicant is not bound by this future development plan; however, it shows one way the site could be developed to city development standards in the future.

The proposal was reviewed by Public Works – Engineering Services staff. Comments on the proposal are found in Attachment 3. City services will not be provided to serve the partition since the site is outside the city. The applicant has indicated that any future homes on the three parcels will be served by private wells and septic.

Staff recommends that the City Council approve Resolution 2019-3568, which recommends that Yamhill County approve the requested partition.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no fiscal impact to the City from the partition.


RECITALS:

- 1. On May 7, 2019 the City of Newberg received a copy of a partition application to divide a property on NE Bell Road into three parcels. The property is located outside the city limits, but inside the Newberg Urban Reserve Area. The current zoning is Yamhill County VLDR-2.5. There is currently no city comprehensive plan designation on the property.
- 2. Yamhill County will make the final decision on the partition application. Under the terms of the Newberg Urban Area Growth Management Agreement, the City Council shall hold a quisi-judicial hearing and make a recommendation to the County within 60 days of receiving a copy of the application.
- 3. The site is located on NE Bell Road (no site address), Yamhill County tax lot no. 3209-01000. It is approximately 7.58 acres and is vacant. The proposal is to divide the property into three parcels ranging in size from 2.28 to 2.65 acres. The future development plan shows potential home locations on the three parcels and how the site could potentially be developed to city development standards if it was annexed into the city.
- 4. Notice of the hearing was posted in the *Newberg Graphic* and in four public places on June 5, 2019.
- 5. The Newberg City Council held a hearing on June 17, 2019 to consider the partition proposal. The City Council finds that the proposal is limited in scope, and consistent with the future urban development of the property.

THE CITY OF NEWBERG RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The City Council finds that the proposed partition, as shown in Exhibit A, meets the criteria for development within the Newberg Urban Reserve Area and adopts the findings, which are attached hereto as Exhibit C. Exhibits A, B and C are hereby adopted and by this reference incorporated.
- 2. The City Council recommends that Yamhill County approve the proposed partition on NE Bell Road, Yamhill County tax lot 3209-01000.




EXHIBIT C: FINDINGS

The applicable Newberg Urban Area Growth Management Agreement criteria are:

The City recommends that that the County only allow development in the Urban Reserve Area "that is limited in scope and that is consistent with the future urban development of the property."

- 1. Future Development Plan: The City Council shall recommend approval, recommend approval with conditions, or recommend against the future development plan in accordance with the following criteria:
 - (a) The current development shall not cause more than 10 percent of the property to be used for site improvements including buildings, parking areas, improved recreation areas, and storage areas, unless the City agrees the development intensity will not prohibit future urban development.
 - (b) The future development plan shall allow for the efficient future urban development of the remainder of the property. It shall allow for construction of future urban streets and utilities, and shall allow for required setbacks to current and future property lines.
 - (c) The plan is consistent with adopted plans and policies for the area, such as street or utility plans and policies in this agreement.

B. Submittal Requirements

- 1. A future development plan shall be required for any development in the Urban Reserve Area requiring a Yamhill County Type B or Type C review, excluding any development that involves a change in use to existing buildings only. The future development plan shall be used solely to evaluate the current proposal's compatibility with potential future urban development. It does not bind or commit the applicants, property owners, review bodies, or governing bodies to approve or carry out the proposed future development.
- 2. The future development plan shall show how the property could be fully developed when incorporated into the city. The plan shall be drawn to scale and shall include the following:
 - (a) The location of potential future streets within and surrounding the site.
 - (b) The location of potential future sewer, water and storm drainage facilities within and surrounding the site.
 - (c) The location and approximate dimensions of potential future lot lines.
 - (d) Setback lines for proposed structures from current and proposed property lines.

Findings: The site is located on NE Bell Road (Yamhill County tax lot No. 3209-01000). It is approximately 7.58 acres and is used for farming. The property is outside of the Newberg city limits and urban growth boundary but within the Urban Reserve Area. The site has County VLDR-2.5 zoning but no City Comprehensive Plan designation. The applicant is applying to Yamhill County for approval to partition the property into three parcels ranging from 2.28 to 2.65 acres in size. A new public right-of-way extending south from NE Bell Road (approximately 8.28% of the site) is proposed to serve the partition.

The applicant states new homes are not part of this proposal, but the future development plan shows potential locations of a single-family home on each of the three parcels. These homes would be served by well and septic services. This plan also depicts a new network of 60 foot wide streets that extend through the site to provide access to future lots and adjacent properties, including the three lot partition to the west on tax lot 3209-01001. This partition was recommended for approval by Newberg City Council at a February

19, 2019 public hearing. The blocks created by the streets are large enough to accommodate future development meeting city standards.

The City's intent under the Urban Area Growth Management Agreement is to recommend that the County only allow development in the Urban Reserve Area that is limited in scope and consistent with the future urban development of the property. The proposed partition will not prohibit future urban development. The proposal is limited in scope, and consistent with the future urbanization of the property.

 - (a) The current development shall not cause more than 10 percent of the property to be used for site improvements including buildings, parking areas, improved recreation areas, and storage areas, unless the City agrees the development intensity will not prohibit future urban development.

<u>RESPONSE</u>: As depicted by Exhibit B (Proposed Partition Plat), the subject property is approximately 330,310 SF (7.58-acres) in the size. The proposed Partition will be served by a new public right-of-way which encompasses 27,358 SF (8.28 %) of area on the subject property. No other structures, or public improvements are proposed by this Partition Application. This criterion is satisfied.

(b) The future development plan shall allow for the efficient future urban development of the remainder of the property. It shall allow for construction of future urban streets and utilities, and shall allow for required setbacks to current and future property lines.

<u>RESPONSE</u>: As depicted by the enclosed Future Development Concept Plan provided as Exhibit C, the proposed development allows for the efficient future urban development of the remainder of the subject property, as well as parcels adjacent to the subject property. 



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Newberg-Dundee Police Department is preparing to upgrade/migrate their legacy (classic) VisionAIR CAD/Mobile/RMS to the most current software platform, as the existing software is at/near end of support. The new parent company, TriTech Software Systems, Inc., has provided a quote of \$403,083, after a \$77,100 TriTech upgrade credit and credit for existing VisionAIR RMS licenses to update/migrate Newberg to the most current platform of the CAD/Mobile/RMS software suite.

Existing VisionAIR CAD/Mobile/RMS is a public safety suite of software designed to work together efficiently. This suite of software is used, among other things, for dispatching, communicating with officers via MDC (mobile data computer), running queries on people and vehicles, writing reports, and reporting Federal UCR (Uniform Crime Reporting). Upgrading to the TriTech Inform CAD/Mobile/RMS will put Newberg-Dundee Police on the most current system software available today.

BACKGROUND: On May 10, 2000, the City of Newberg entered into an agreement with Vision Software, Inc. for CAD (Computer Aided Dispatch) and Mobile for public safety dispatch software. On May 17, 2002, the City of Newberg expanded their relationship with VisionAIR, Inc. to include RMS (records management) software, rounding out the public safety suite. The Newberg-Dundee Police Department has been using this software, with regular updates, since installation.

January 2012, VisionAIR was purchased by TriTech Software Systems, primarily for obtaining the VisionAIR police records management system. TriTech advised then that the VisionAIR CAD and Mobile would be phased out as TriTech moved to improve and enhance their TriTech CAD/911 phone/Mobile/RMS product lines.

Subsequently, in 2018, TriTech Software Systems, Superion, Zuercher Technologies, and Aptean merged to form CentralSquare Technologies.

We are nearing the end of life of the VisionAIR CAD and Mobile products, with only maintenance provided

and no enhancements. The classic VisionAIR RMS product cannot be updated until CAD and Mobile are upgraded.

Upgrading the entire CAD/Mobile/RMS product suite is part of the department's CJIS (Criminal justice Information System) plan for security enhancements as existing VisionAIR software operates on the Microsoft 7 operating system, which is steadily degrading and with increasing security vulnerabilities. Microsoft support for Microsoft 7 will cease January 14, 2020 and must be replaced with Windows 10 for CJIS compliance.

Newberg Municipal Code, Section 3.25.070, provides a process for the approval of special solicitation methods and exemptions, which includes steps for a public hearing and written findings. As the Contract Review Board, the City Council has the authority to exempt the solicitation process and authorize a sole source procurement.

Notice of the Public Hearing has been given through publication in the Newberg Graphic on June 12, 2019. The findings of fact are attached as Exhibit A.

Should the City Council determine there are sufficient findings to approve an exemption for the solicitation method and authorize a sole-source procurement to TriTech Software Systems, the interested parties will negotiate with TriTech to obtain contract terms that are advantageous to the City of Newberg.

Prior to implementation, the negotiated contract will come before City Council for approval and authorization to execute the purchase.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Preliminary quote for TriTech CAD/Mobile/RMS upgrade is \$403,083.00, after a \$77,100.00 TriTech update credit, and credit for existing RMS licenses as stated. The project will incur additional costs for CAD-to-CAD capability, work station hardware, monitors and SQL licensing, bringing the anticipated total cost of the project to approximately \$455,000.00.

Since the City has planned for the upgrade since 2012, funding to migrate to the current software platform is available in Fund 32-2310-610200 and Fund 32-2110-610108.

STRATEGIC ASSESSMENT (RELATE TO COUNCIL PRIORITIES FROM SEPTEMBER 2017):

Maintaining a State of the Art 911 Dispatch Center is a priority for the City Council, and meets FY 2017-18 City Council Goal # 1: Maintain a state-of-the-art 911 Dispatch center and 800 MHz radio communication system.

RECITALS:

- 1. The City has previously entered into agreements with VisionAIR Software, now TriTech Software Systems, a Central Square Technologies, LLC, company, for CAD and Mobile (2000), and RMS in (2002) public safety software.
- 2. The City has long desired to migrate/upgrade to the current TriTech version of the CAD/Mobile/RMS software suites, as the legacy products are nearing end of life, maintained only with no software enhancements, and create compatibility issues between software and hardware components.
- 3. TriTech is no longer producing enhancements to the legacy VisionAIR CAD/Mobile and classic RMS products, resulting in compatibility issues between software versions, hardware, printers, and, currently, UCR (Uniform Crime Reporting) reporting to the FBI.
- 4. Upgrading CAD/Mobile/RMS will help meet current Federal CJIS security requirements.
- 5. The City desires to improve compatibility between adjacent dispatch agencies by utilizing TriTech CAD, to encourage information sharing and increase efficiency.
- 6. Notice of the Public Hearing has been given through publication in the Newberg Graphic on June 12, 2019.
- 7. At the public hearing on June 17, 2019, the City offered an opportunity for any interested party to appear and present comment.
- 8. Newberg Municipal Code §3.25.070 provides the City Council, as the Contract Review Board, the authority to approve an exemption to the solicitation method and authorize a sole source procurement upon an Administrative Hearing and adopted findings of fact.

THE CITY OF NEWBERG RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The City Council as the Contract Review Board approves an exemption to the solicitation method, authorizing a sole source procurement to TriTech Software Systems, Inc., for a public safety CAD/Mobile/RMS software upgrade. This exemption is based upon findings of fact pursuant to NMC §3.25.070, attached as Exhibit "A" and by this reference incorporated.
- 2. To the extent reasonably practical, the City of Newberg shall negotiate with TriTech Software Systems, Inc. to obtain contract terms that are advantageous to the City of Newberg.
- 3. The negotiated contact will be brought back to the City Council for approval and authorization, prior to execution of the contract.

FINDINGS OF FACT for Exemption from competition and to allow sole source procurement to TriTech Software Systems, Inc., a Central Square Technologies, LLC, company, for an upgrade to existing public safety CAD/Mobile/RMS software.

Pursuant to Newberg Municipal Code 3.25.070 Process for approval of special solicitation methods and exemptions.

- **A. Authority of City Council.** In its capacity as contract review board for the city, the city council, upon its own initiative, or upon request of the purchasing manager, may create special selection, evaluation and award procedures for, or may exempt from competition, the award of a specific contract or class of contracts as provided in this section.
- **B.** Basis for Approval. The approval of a special solicitation method or exemption from competition must be based upon a record before the city council that contains the following:
 - 1. The nature of the contract or class of contracts for which the special solicitation or exemption is requested.
 - Request for exemption to allow sole source procurement to TriTech Software Systems, Inc., a Central Square Technologies, LLC, company, for an upgrade to existing public safety CAD/Mobile/RMS software.
 - 2. The estimated contract price or cost of the project, if relevant.
 - The preliminary cost estimate for the software upgrade is \$403,083.00, dated 4/5/2019. This quote includes a \$77,000 TriTech upgrade credit. Additionally, the City of Newberg will receive credit for stated number of existing VisionAIR RMS licenses, which will be converted to TriTech Inform RMS licenses.
 - 3. Findings to support the substantial cost savings, enhancement in quality or performance or other public benefit anticipated by the proposed selection method or exemption from competitive solicitation.

SUBSTANTIAL COST SAVINGS:

- This is an upgrade migration from existing legacy VisionAIR CAD and Mobile software (2000) and VisionAIR Inform RMS (2002) to the current TriTech software product line. CAD and Mobile software must be upgraded, before an upgrade of the classic VisionAIR RMS to ensure compatibility between all components. Cost savings for TriTech upgrade credit of \$77,000, plus credit for existing VisionAIR RMS licenses as follows:
 - o 18 Inform RMS User Licenses
 - o 1 Inform RMS Accident Module License
 - o 1 Inform RMS Evidence and Bar Coding Module License
 - o 1 Inform RMS GIS License
 - o 1 Inform RMS Reporting Server License
 - o 1 Inform RMS Test or Training System License
 - o 18 NCIC/State Software Inform RMS Concurrent User Licenses

- Utilizing TriTech CAD and RMS software will allow continued use of existing interface to COPLink at no cost. Different software would incur cost for interface creation.
- Sole sourcing with TriTech will allow for the reuse of existing servers and some software, while still meeting hardware and software requirements.

ENHANCEMENT IN QUALITY, PERFORMANCE AND PUBLIC BENEFIT:

- TriTech CAD is used by neighboring dispatch centers facilitating info sharing. Adjacent agencies with TriTech CAD: Washington County Consolidated Communications (WCCCA), Clackamas County Communications (CCOM), Lake Oswego Communications (LOCOM), Columbia County 9-1-1, and Yamhill County Communications (YCOM). With the planned inclusion of CAD-to-CAD, Newberg will be capable of sending/receiving CAD data and messages between WCCCA, CCOM, LOCOM, and Columbia County 9-1-1, with the potential of adding YCOM in the future. Contracting with another vendor will result in increased costs for interface development.
- Newberg will electronically send data to WCCCA at the same time a 9-1-1 call is manually transferred to WCCCA, improving information flow for dispatching of TVF&R by WCCCA on medical and fire calls. This same capability is available when transferring misrouted 911 calls to other TriTech users having CAD-to-CAD capability.
- CAD data will be shared between Mobile and RMS, eliminating redundant data entry between components, providing quicker more efficient recordkeeping, reducing errors and providing more efficient document development and retrieval.
- GIS and GPS location data and radio messaging provided through the Motorola 800 MHz radio upgrade will be available for Newberg Dispatch to access through the TriTech CAD should Newberg desire to implement AVL or messaging functions in the future.
- 4. Findings to support the reason that approval of the request would be unlikely to encourage favoritism or diminish competition for the public contract or class of public contracts, or would otherwise substantially promote the public interest in a manner that could not practicably be realized by complying with their solicitation requirements that would otherwise be applicable under these regulations.
 - It's in the public interest to upgrade the current vendor software to a level compatible with our peer dispatch agencies, which will allow Newberg dispatch to share near real time unit data exchange resulting in an increased response time for certain types of calls. Utilizing the current vendor for the upgrade will allow the City to use existing hardware components and licenses, providing some financial relief that would not be available through an outside vendor. This upgrade is only available from TriTech Software Solutions, a Central Square Technologies, LLC, company. (Attachment 1)

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve Order 2019-0039 to replace the consumer price index used to adjust the communications officer public safety fee annually from the Portland CPI-U to the CPI-U West Region Annual Average Index.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

In 2014, City Council approved Order 2014-0035 (see Exhibit A) establishing a Communications Officer Public Safety Fee (COPSF) in the amount of two dollars (\$2.00) per residential meter equivalency (RME) per month for the purpose of funding two communications officer positions. Within this order, Section 2, paragraph B states that the amount of the fee shall be adjusted annually in a percentage amount equivalent to the Portland CPI-U for the prior calendar year as published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

In 2016, City Council approved Ordinance 2016-2800 (see Exhibit B) establishing a process for the Council to adjust an existing public safety fee. The process allows an adjustment to an enacted PSF by an amended order. The amended order shall only address a change in the fee amount. The amended order may index future increases to the PSF to an objective criteria, including but not limited to a CPI published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. Further, any adjustment must be based upon the following criteria.

- 1. Identification of the financial circumstances that have changed since the original enactment of the PSF.
- 2. The amount of revenue needed to support the resources to provide the services identified in the PSF.
- 3. Any other criteria that should reasonably be considered that would be likely to assist in establishing an equitable adjustment to the PSF.
- 4. The report proposing the PSF adjustment will address the criteria to be considered.

In 2017, the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) announced that they would be discontinuing the regular publication of the Portland-Salem OR-WA Consumer Price Index (CPI) due to a change in population thresholds in an updated population-weighting methodology. This index has been adopted by the City of Newberg as a standard index for most contracts, fees, or labor/wage adjustments. Various contract or fees have been updated individually as the need arises. 2017 was the last year this index was published (Exhibit E), which was used to increase the PSF effective July 1, 2018. The purpose of this new order is to update the CPI to a new index published by the BLS.

CPI SELECTION:

The attached memo (Exhibit D) was created in September 2018 address the problem of the discontinued Portland-Salem OR-WA CPI-U. It provides an analytical approach to the method of selecting a replacement index to be used by the City. The recommendation was to use the CPI-U West Region Annual Average index. This index has been used in other agreements since then, and the aim is to standardize on one index.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Since one index has been discontinued, there is no way to prospectively draw a comparison against the replacement index. The West Region CPI-U annual average for 2018 is 3.3% (Exhibit F). The adjusted PSF would go from \$2.13 to \$2.20 per residential meter equivalency (RME) per month. The FY 2019-20 Adopted Budget included this increase. The amount of additional revenue generated by the increase is approximately \$8,000 annually.

RECITALS:

- 1. Order 2014-0035 (Exhibit A) established a Communications Officer Public Safety Fee (COPSF) in the amount of two dollars (\$2.00) per residential meter equivalency (RME) per month for the purpose of funding two communications officer positions. Section 2, paragraph B states that the amount of the fee shall be adjusted annually in a percentage amount equivalent to the Portland CPI-U for the prior calendar year as published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.
- 2. Ordinance 2016-2800 (Exhibit B) established a process for the Council to adjust an existing public safety fee.
- 3. In 2017, the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) announced that it would be discontinuing the regular publication of the Portland-Salem OR-WA Consumer Price Index (CPI). The final publication of the Portland-Salem Consumer Price Index series occurred on January 12, 2018 (Exhibit E).
- 4. Staff has reviewed multiple options using an analytical approach as the method of selecting a replacement index to be used by the City. The recommendation is to use the CPI-U West Region Annual Average index (Exhibit D).
- 5. In accordance with the process established by Ordinance 2016-2800, the City Council conducted on June 17, 2019, at the regularly-scheduled meeting, a public hearing to receive from the public advice, input, and comment concerning the proposed adjustment (Exhibit C for quasi-judicial hearing format).
- 6. The City Council has taken into consideration the facts and information presented to them, as well as the testimony presented during the June 17, 2019 public hearing.

THE CITY OF NEWBERG ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>Recitals:</u> The recitals are hereby adopted by the City Council and considered facts in the deliberation.
- 2. <u>Administrative Report:</u> The administration has presented to the City Council an administrative report recommending a replacement Consumer Price Index. The City Council adopts the administration report, which is attached as Exhibits D, E, F, and G.

- 3. <u>Hearing Format:</u> Exhibit C is the quasi-judicial hearing procedures to be used for this Order.
- 4. <u>Findings of Fact:</u> The City Council adopts the Findings of Fact as set forth in Exhibit G, which is hereby attached and by this reference incorporated. The Findings of Fact addresses the criteria for adjusting the COPSF. The City Council finds that the criteria for adjusting the COPSF has been met and satisfied.
- 5. Order No. 2014-0035, Section 2, subsection B, is amended to read as follows:

The amount of the fee shall be adjusted on July 1, 2015, and annually thereafter, and shall increase of decrease in a percentage amount equivalent to the CPI-U West Region Annual Average index for the prior calendar year, as published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

- 6. Except as specifically amended herein, all other provisions of Order No. 2014-0035 remain in effect.

ORDER No. 2014-0035

AN ORDER ESTABLISHING A PUBLIC SAFETY FEE (PSF) IN THE AMOUNT OF TWO (\$2.00) DOLLARS PER RESIDENTIAL METER EQUIVALENCY (RME) PER MONTH FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING TWO COMMUNICATIONS OFFICER POSITIONS

RECITALS:

- 1. The city has had a long-standing need for additional communications officers. Both a Staffing Study conducted in 2010 and an ad hoc report from Oregon Emergency Management, prepared July 2014, indicates Newberg-Dundee 9-1-1 is significantly understaffed when compared to other PSAPs (Public Safety Answering Point) in Oregon of comparative size.
- 2. To provide an adequate level of 9-1-1 services, it is necessary to provide stabilized funding for an existing communications officer and to hire an additional communications officer.
- 3. Call volume, population, activities, and field personnel have increased over time while staffing of the dispatch center has remained stagnant.
- 4. No new personnel have been added to the dispatch center since 2005.
- 5. The City Council adopted Ordinance 2009-2714, which authorized the establishment of a public safety fee to fund police and fire services. The ordinance provided a process for adopting a public safety fee. The ordinance is hereby attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.
- 6. Support Services Manager, Mary Newell, provided a Memorandum/Administrative Report of the historical background and necessity of increasing staffing in the 9-1-1 dispatch center which is hereby attached as Exhibit B and incorporated by reference.
- 7. The National Fire Protection Association requires two dispatchers on duty or in the operations room at all times (NFPA 1221, Operations, § Staffing 7.3.2*, 2013 Ed.).
- 8. The city of Newberg Budget Committee and City Council adopted FY 14/15 budget based in part on adoption of this PSF.
- 9. In accordance with the process established by ordinance, the City Council conducted on October 20, 2014, at the regular scheduled meeting, a public hearing to determine if the request for the PSF meets the criteria as provided for in the Newberg Code. The format for that hearing is marked as Exhibit C, which is attached and incorporated by reference. The criteria for establishing the PSF is listed in Exhibit A, Section 5 which has been codified in Section 36.37 of the Newberg Municipal Code, also contained in Exhibit A.
- 10. The council has taken into consideration the facts and information presented to them, as well as the testimony presented during the October 20th public hearing.

THE CITY OF NEWBERG ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>Recitals:</u> The recitals are hereby adopted by the city council and considered facts in the deliberation.
- 2. <u>Public Safety Fee (PSF):</u> A PSF increase is hereby established and authorized to be charged as follows:
 - a. Amount: Two (\$2.00) dollars per residential meter equivalency (RME) per month will be charged on all water meters within the city of Newberg according to the following based on the Sixth Edition of the American Water Works Association (AWWA) Manual of Water Supply Practices (M1 Manual), table VI.2-5, Meter Equivalencies:

- b. The amount of the fee shall be adjusted on July 1, 2015, and annually thereafter, and shall increase or decrease in a percentage amount equivalent to the Portland CPI-U for the prior calendar year, as published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.
- c. Responsible Party: The person(s), firms, corporation, or entity (hereinafter referred to as "person") responsible for the water utility charge will be responsible for the PSF. If there is no water service to the developed property, the person with the right to occupy the developed property will be responsible for the PSF.
- d. Implementation: The PSF will be implemented and charged through the November 2014 water utility bill. However, the city manager (CM) has the authority to delay implementation if the CM deems it necessary, but the PSF will be implemented as soon as possible if delayed after the November billing.
- e. Expenditures: The revenue collected from the PSF will be used to stabilize the funding of the existing communications officer, and fund an additional communications officer, including all necessary expenses.
- f. PSF Designation: The PSF will be referred to as Communications Officer Public Safety Fee (COPSF).

- 3. <u>Administrative Report:</u> The administration has presented to the city council an administrative report recommending an amount and the implementation of the PSF. The city council adopts the administration report, which is attached as Exhibit B and incorporated by reference.
- 4. <u>Hearing Format</u>: Exhibit C is the hearing format to be used for this Order.
- 5. <u>Findings of Fact:</u> The city council adopts the Findings of Fact as set forth in Exhibit D, which is hereby attached and by this reference incorporated. The Findings of Fact addresses the criteria for establishing the PSF. The council finds that the criteria for establishing the PSF has been met and satisfied.
- 6. <u>Administration</u>: Under the authority of the CM, city administration is hereby delegated the authority to administer the PSF, including charging, collecting, and implementing the PSF. The CM is hereby delegated all necessary authority for implementation and administration of the PSF. Furthermore, the CM is delegated the authority to do all necessary acts; enter into all necessary agreements; and execute any other necessary documents for the implementation and collection of the PSF. This authority is in addition to the authority given to the administration under Newberg Code provision § 36.36 entitled, "Administration and Collection." Furthermore, additional conditions for implementation and collection are presented in Exhibit E, which is hereby attached and by this reference incorporated. The authorized conditions are to be implemented by the administration.
- 7. <u>Appeal:</u> Any dispute, claim, or other disagreement concerning the implementation, charges, and collection of the PSF including but not limited to determination of the number of RME's; the amount of the PSF to be charged; the responsible party; and settlement of disputed claims will initially be made by the finance director. Appeal of this decision will be to the city manager. The city manager's decision will be final.

FEFFECTIVE DATE of this order is the day after the adoption date, which is: October 21, 2014.

ORDINANCE No. 2016-2800

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A PROCESS FOR THE COUNCIL TO ADJUST AN EXISTING PUBLIC SAFETY FEE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

RECITALS:

- 1. On May 18, 2009, the Council adopted Ordinance No. 2009-2714, establishing a process for enacting a public safety fee to finance police and fire services. That ordinance has been codified as Chapter 3.30 of the Newberg Municipal Code.
- 2. Since 2009, the City has enacted and levied two public safety fees. Order No. 2009-0021, enacted July 6, 2009, funded three police officer positions. Order No. 2014-0035, enacted October 20, 2014, funded two communication officer positions.
- 3. The public safety fee ordinance as enacted contains no process or procedure for adjustment of a public safety fee, once a fee is enacted.
- 4. Over time, the estimated amount needed to fund a police officer or communication officer position may prove to be insufficient to support the funded positions. Increases in the cost of insurance, wage scales under new collective bargaining agreements, and salary increases attributed to longevity and advancement may leave a funding gap.
- 5. This ordinance does not increase any existing public safety fee or create any new fee. The purpose is to establish a mechanism and criteria for the Council to adjust fee amounts should a determination that an increase or decrease is warranted.

THE CITY OF NEWBERG ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 3.30.040, Adjustment of Existing Public Safety Fee, is added to Chapter 3.30 to read as follows:

3.30.040 Adjustment of Existing Public Safety Fee.

- A. Purpose of Adjustment. The council recognizes that unanticipated increases in the cost of living, health care, pension obligations, renegotiation of collective bargaining agreements, and other circumstances may require the council to adjust a previously enacted PSF to provide the revenue needed support the resources to provide the services for which the PSF was enacted.
- B. Amended Order. The Council may adjust an enacted PSF by an amended order. The amended order shall only address a change in the fee amount. The amended order may index future increases to the PSF to an objective criteria, including but not limited to a

CPI published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

- C. Criteria. Any adjustment must be based upon the following criteria:
- 1. Identification of the financial circumstances that have changed since the original enactment of the PSF.
- 2. The amount of revenue needed to support the resources to provide the services identified in the PSF.
- 3. Any other criteria that should reasonably be considered that would be likely to assist in establishing an equitable adjustment to the PSF.
- 4. The report proposing the PSF adjustment will address the criteria to be considered.
- D. Public Hearing. Prior to adjusting any enacted PSF, the Council shall hold a public hearing at which the city council may receive from the public advice, input and comment concerning the proposed adjustment. The testimony at the public hearing should be addressed to the criteria.
- **Section 2.** All other provisions of Chapter 3.30 shall remain unchanged.
- **Section 3.** In order to allow time for the council to consider a potential adjustment of one or more PSF during the Fiscal Year 16-17 Budget process, an emergency is declared to exist. To carry out the intention of this ordinance, this ordinance shall take effect on April 19, 2016.
- **EFFECTIVE DATE** of this ordinance is: April 19, 2016.

Subject: Consumer Price Index (CPI-U Portland-Salem OR-WA) Discontinuation

Problem

In 2017, the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) announced that they would be discontinuing the regular publication of the Portland-Salem OR-WA Consumer Price Index (CPI) due to a change in population thresholds in an updated population-weighting methodology. This index has been adopted by the City of Newberg as a standard index for most contracts, fees, or labor/wage adjustments.

Selection Criteria

Factors to consider in selecting which index to use include the following:

- Population coverage (CPI-U verses CPI-W)
 - CPI-U covers All Urban Consumers and represent about 94% of the total U.S. population.
 It is based on the expenditures of all families living in urban areas.
 - CPI-W is a subset of the CPI-U represents about 28% of the total U.S. population. It is based on the expenditures of families living in urban areas who meet additional requirements related to employment, specifically more than one-half of the family's income is earned from clerical or hourly-wage occupations.
 - CPI-U is used more frequently because the population coverage is more comprehensive.
 CPI-W is used for escalation primarily in blue-collar cost-of living adjustments (COLAs).
- Area coverage (U.S. City Average, regional, divisional, city-size classes, metropolitan areas, etc.). The area selected can vary in size. The City of Newberg has used a narrow area of coverage in the past by selecting the Portland-Salem OR-WA index. The smallest area coverage available currently is the Pacific division. This will be explained in greater detail in this memo.
- Volatility of index The larger the sample size, the lesser the volatility of the index. The BLS recommends that users adopt the U.S. City Average CPI for use in escalator clauses. Further, the national or regional indexes are subject to less sampling errors.

Index Options

BLS publishes multiple indexes that should be considered as replacements to the old index. The following indexes are all CPI-U, all items, not seasonally adjusted, with a base year of 1982-87=100 unless otherwise noted.


- <u>U.S. City Average</u> The largest sample area and the index recommended by the BLS for escalation clauses.
- West Region Comprised of two divisions (total of 13 states)
 - Mountain Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming.
 - o Pacific Alaska, California, Hawaii, Oregon, and Washington.
- West-Size Class A CPI based on West Region cities within all 13 states with populations over 2.5 million (prior to 2018, the threshold was 1.5 million).
- West-Size Class B/C CPI based on West Region cities within all 13 states with populations of 2.5 million or less (prior to 2018, the threshold was 1.5 million).
- <u>West-Pacific Division</u> Cities within the five state as defined above.

<u>Data</u>

Comparative data for the old Portland-Salem CPI-U and the first four indexes defined above are shown in the table below and on the line graph on the last page of this memo. The percentage change in the annual average is reflected in the top section of the table (2011-2017). The middle section of the table provides several metrics that pull out more meaningful information, particularly the range of averages and the average of the annual numbers. The bottom section of the table reflects critical information that can be used to determine which of the indexes would acceptable to use.

Upon arranging the data in a couple ranked lists (see below), it is interesting to see that the largest sample area index (All U.S. City Average) has the largest range of volatility (0.12 to 3.16), with the Portland-Salem index the second-highest index in volatility (1.20 to 4.20), and so on. Further, the average of the annual averages for each index is reflected in the "Average Ranking" list, with Portland-Salem providing the highest result. It appears from the analysis that the Portland-Salem index, while geographically representative of our area, proves to be one of the most volatile indexes with the highest average.

The West Region index seems to stand out as the most modest of the indexes on both lists, ranking fourth on the volatility list and third (middle) on the average ranking list (with a 2.04 average annual change). The West Size B/C also appears to be a reasonable option, ranking third on the volatility list and fifth on the average ranking list.

The West Size A (cities with populations over 2.5 million) has the least amount of volatility but ranks second on the average list at 2.18.

Recommendation

City staff recommends using the CPI-U West Region Annual Average Index to replace the CPI-U Portland-Salem OR-WA Annual Average Index currently begin used as the standard index. This index provides a middle-of-the-road approach to both evaluation factor of volatility and actual numerical results. The City can continue to maintain the comparative information on the indexes selected above (with the exception of the Portland-Salem Index) and review on an annual basis. In addition, the CPI-U Pacific Index, as mentioned above, is new in 2018 and may serve as a better selection in the future, so staff will include this index as it begins to be published over time. It is important to remember that there is no right answer in this recommendation, and staff is open to multiple viewpoints with additional information.



Consumer Price Index, Portland – Second Half 2017

Area prices were up 1.4 percent over the past six months, up 3.9 percent from a year ago

Prices in the Portland Area, as measured by the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U), increased 1.4 percent in the second half of 2017, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported today. (See table A.) Assistant Commissioner for Regional Operations Richard Holden noted that this latest six-month increase was influenced by higher prices for shelter and medical care. (Data in this report are not seasonally adjusted. Accordingly, six-month-to-six-month changes may reflect seasonal influences.)

Over the last 12 months, the CPI-U rose 3.9 percent. (See chart 1 and table A.) Energy prices increased 7.1 percent, largely the result of an increase in the price of gasoline. The index for all items less food and energy advanced 4.1 percent over the year. (See table 1.)





Chart 1. Over-the-year percent change in CPI-U, Portland, second half 2014-second half 2017



Food prices increased 0.8 percent in the second half of 2017. (See table 1.) Prices for food away from home increased 1.0 percent, and prices for food at home increased 0.6 percent for the same period.

Over the year, food prices increased 1.8 percent. Prices for food away from home increased 4.0 percent since a year ago, and prices for food at home edged up 0.1 percent.

Energy

The energy index increased 2.7 percent since the first half of 2017. The increase was mainly due to higher prices for gasoline (4.6 percent). Prices for electricity increased 0.3 percent, and prices for natural gas service inched up 0.1 percent for the same period.

Energy prices advanced 7.1 percent over the year, largely due to higher prices for gasoline (12.6 percent). Prices paid for electricity advanced 0.9 percent, but prices for natural gas service moved down 1.3 percent during the past year.

All items less food and energy

The index for all items less food and energy rose 1.4 percent in the latest six-month period. Higher prices for medical care (2.6 percent) and shelter (2.5 percent) were partially offset by lower prices for recreation (-1.9 percent) and apparel (-1.1 percent).

Over the year, the index for all items less food and energy advanced 4.1 percent. Components contributing to the increase included shelter (7.0 percent), medical care (6.0 percent), and household furnishings and operations (1.6 percent). Partly offsetting the increases were price declines in apparel (-2.7 percent), education and communication (-1.3 percent), and recreation (-1.1 percent).

Consumer Price Index Geographic Revision for 2018

In January 2018, BLS will introduce a new geographic area sample for the Consumer Price Index (CPI). As part of the new sample, the index for this area will be discontinued. The first indexes using the new structure will be published in February 2018. Additional information on the geographic revision is available at: www.bls.qov/cpi/additional-resources/geographic-revision-2018.htm.

Technical Note

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change in prices over time in a fixed market basket of goods and services. The Bureau of Labor Statistics publishes CPIs for two population groups: (1) a CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) which covers approximately 89 percent of the total population and (2) a CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) which covers 28 percent of the total population. The CPI-U includes, in addition to wage earners and clerical workers, groups such as professional, managerial, and technical workers, the self-employed, short-term workers, the unemployed, and retirees and others not in the labor force.

The CPI is based on prices of food, clothing, shelter, and fuels, transportation fares, charges for doctors' and dentists' services, drugs, and the other goods and services that people buy for day-to-day living. Each month, prices are collected in 87 urban areas across the country from about 6,000 housing units and approximately 24,000 retail establishments—department stores, supermarkets, hospitals, filling stations, and other types of stores and service establishments. All taxes directly associated with the purchase and use of items are included in the index.

The index measures price changes from a designated reference date (1982-84) that equals 100.0. An increase of 16.5 percent, for example, is shown as 116.5. This change can also be expressed in dollars as follows: the price of a base period "market basket" of goods and services in the CPI has risen from \$10 in 1982-84 to \$11.65. For further details see the CPI home page on the Internet at www.bls.gov/cpi and the BLS Handbook of Methods, Chapter 17, The Consumer Price Index, available on the Internet at www.bls.gov/opub/hom/homch17 a.htm.

In calculating the index, price changes for the various items in each location are averaged together with weights that represent their importance in the spending of the appropriate population group. Local data are then combined to obtain a U.S. city average. Because the sample size of a local area is smaller, the local area index is subject to substantially more sampling and other measurement error than the national index. In addition, local indexes are not adjusted for seasonal influences. As a result, local area indexes show greater volatility than the national index, although their long-term trends are quite similar. **NOTE: Area indexes do not measure differences in the level of prices between cities; they only measure the average change in prices for each area since the base period.**

The Portland-Salem, OR, WA metropolitan area covered in this release consists of Clackamas, Columbia, Marion, Multnomah, Polk, Washington, and Yamhill Counties in the State of Oregon and Clark County in the State of Washington.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Division 38 Simplified Method (Newberg 2030 Project)

With Technical Assistance Grants from the Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD) the Community Development Department completed some work on the Newberg 2030 project, which was to determine the long-range land needs (14 year horizon) for the City utilizing the Simplified Urban Growth Boundary (UGB) Method (Division 38) rules. Newberg was the first jurisdiction to utilize the new rules, and issues with the method were discovered in both Phase I and II of the project. The Oregon Land Conservation and Development Commission adopted technical fixes to the Division 38 rules in January 2019 which addressed most of the issues related to the Buildable Lands Inventory (BLI). As the project team continued further into the Division 38 process it became evident there were more issues related to narrowing down the 10,000 acre preliminary study area to roughly 100 acres and determining if land is serviceable. These issues create uncertainty and risk for a successful outcome, and the level of analysis needed to address serviceability would be costly.

Based upon the draft BLI and land need calculations, the City of Newberg has an overall adequate land supply to meet its 14 year need, however deficiencies were identified for high density residential and industrial land. As a separate project, a Housing Needs Assessment (HNA) is currently being done in compliance with Statewide Goal 10-Housing, and the draft HNA shows a deficiency in all residential land categories (low, medium, and high) over a 20 year horizon. There is no concurrent analysis of employment lands for comparison.

Staff reviewed the BLI findings, land need calculations, and methodology issues with the Citizen Advisory (CAC) and Technical Advisory (TAC) Committees on May 13, 2019. As a means to address the identified high density shortfall, provide more land for lower cost housing, and efficiently use land within the city limits, the CAC made a recommendation to Council to consider the following: the City takes whatever measures it can to increase the amount of land available for high density housing including the up zoning of low density land.

After discussing the findings with DLCD staff, Newberg City Council, and the advisory committees, it was determined that the simplified method does not work for Newberg, and the project has been terminated.

Citywide Activities Affecting Land Supply/Need

Buildable land inventories and land need calculations are based on a point in time. Development and changes in zoning and Comprehensive Plan designations impact the land supply. New homes continue to be built on vacant lots in subdivisions and partitions. The draft Riverfront Master Plan proposes to change the zoning or designation of some commercial land to medium and high density residential and rezone a parcel from medium density to high density residential. The largest tract of commercial land within the city has received planning approval for a development with a mix of residential and commercial uses (Crestview Crossing). If all of these proposed changes in zoning/designation are approved and development happens, then the small surplus of commercial land noted in the Division 38 findings will be eliminated.

Next Steps

There is a finite amount of land within the current UGB. Modifying the zoning and designations may improve the supply in one category but lessen the supply in another. In addition, not all land is suitable for all uses. There are many factors impacting suitability. To plan for future growth the City will pursue an UGB expansion using the traditional method (Division 24). Part of that process is to complete a Housing Needs Assessment (HNA) and Economic Opportunities Analysis (EOA). The HNA is currently underway, and the draft shows a deficiency of residential land. This draft will be reviewed by the Project Advisory Committee on May 30, 2019, and the project will be complete by June 30, 2019 per the grant contract.

Funding for an EOA is included in the fiscal year 2019-2020 budget, and it is anticipated that the EOA would be completed by the end of June 2020. Along with the EOA, the HNA would be updated to reflect changes in land supply since March 29, 2019. Staff is tracking development on a monthly basis to simplify the work needed for an HNA update.

Once the EOA and HNA are completed, then Newberg would notify DLCD of intent to pursue an UGB amendment through the Division 24 process. Outside consultants including land use planners, engineers, legal counsel, and environmental specialists to identify stream corridors would be needed to perform the work. The process will take 2-3 years to complete and require extensive advisory committee meetings and work sessions with Planning Commission, City Council and Newberg Urban Area Management Commission (NUMAC). The estimated cost is \$250,000 -\$300,000. If approved and no appeal of the UGB amendment, then all master plans (water, wastewater, transportation, stormwater, etc.) would need to be updated to provide for services in the expansion areas. The City would additionally want to consider if any UGB expansion areas should be master planned. This would be an additional cost to the estimate noted above. Staff will seek opportunities for grant funds to help cover the overall project costs.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Estimated cost to perform the work needed for a Division 24 UGB amendment is \$250,000 -\$300,000. This amount includes the \$55,000 for an EOA but does not include follow up work to update infrastructure master plans or create new, special planning area master plans. As stated above, staff will seek opportunities to defray project costs.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The City of Newberg accepted a pedestrian easement from Werth Family LLC that was recorded as Instrument No. 200808192 on May 12, 2008 across Lot 1 of the Oak Meadows II subdivision (Attachment 1). The easement was a separately recorded document per Instrument No. 200808192. Staff research indicates the easement was obtained based on discussions with a Werth Family LLC representative and the City. The City requested the easement with the intent to establish a pedestrian connection between The Greens and Fred Meyer. Staff reviewed the 2005 Transportation System Plan and the 1999 Springbrook Oaks Specific Plan that were in effect at the time the easement was granted and was not able to identify any specific requirements for such a pedestrian easement, but the property owner agreed to grant the easement. The 1999 Springbrook Oaks Specific Plan states "Transportation, Bicycle and Pedestrian, Pedestrian and bicycle paths/sidewalks (on or off-street) shall be provide: ...4. As interconnections between developments within the Springbrook Oaks area; and...The pedestrian easement was not part of the Oak Meadows II subdivision plat and was recorded as a separate document as noted above. Because it was not part of the subdivision plat releasing the easement does not require a re-plating process.

On June 19, 2017 the City Council approved Resolution No. 2017-3386 terminating a portion of the pedestrian easement and accepted a new pedestrian easement in an alternative location. This was done as part of PAR-17-002 that partitioned Oak Meadows II Lot 1 into Parcel 1 and 2 for the Oregon Clinic project that located on Parcel 1. The relocated easement is now located entirely on Parcel 2. The released portion of the easement on Parcel 1 was recorded as Instrument No. 201709857 on June 21, 2017 (Attachment 2). The relocated easement area was recorded as Instrument No. 201709859 on June 21, 2017 with an Affidavit of Correction recorded as Instrument No. 201709900 on June 22, 2017 (Attachments 3 and 4) to correct instrument numbers on the plat for PAR17-002 (Yamhill County Partition Plat 2017-06).

Staff has been discussing with the Werth Family LLC since 2017 development of Parcel 2 of PAR-17-002 for a retirement community as an expansion of Friendsview's Springbrook Meadows. The issue of the pedestrian easement has been a topic of discussion of its need, purpose and prior requirement. Staff researched the 2005 Transportation System Plan, 2016 Transportation System Plan and 1999 Springbrook Oaks Specific Plan. There are no requirements identified in either of these documents that as part of the transportation system a pedestrian path would run between N Providence Drive and N Brutscher Street. To make such a path viable it would need to cross over the Argyle property to the west of Parcel 2. There is currently no pedestrian easement over the Argyle property and no requirement that a pedestrian path be located on that property in the future in any of the past or current city master plans.

On December 17, 2018 the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2018-3518 a Resolution Authorizing The City Recorder To Execute A Quitclaim Deed In Favor Of The State Of Oregon, Department Of Transportation, Releasing A Pedestrian And Bicycle Path Easement Held By The City, Located Within The Newberg – Dundee Bypass Corridor. This easement area was located to the east of N Providence Drive and would have provided a pedestrian connection to Parcel 2. With the release of that easement to accommodate the Bypass the historical intent to have a pedestrian path connection between The Greens and Fred Meyer was eliminated.

The Werth Family LLC is now requesting that the pedestrian easement be released on Parcel 2. Information provided to staff is that the Friendsview project will not be developing the project with public streets but will be similar in design to the existing Springbrook Meadows development consisting of duplexes on one large lot with internal private drive aisles. Staff additionally evaluated the topography at the west side of Parcel 2 and the adjoining Argyle site. There is 10-15 feet of elevation change between the two properties making a path challenging to meet ADA requirements.

The City Engineering Department and Planning Division support release of this easement.

The applicant's full application packet is included as Attachment 5.

Dear Doug:

In the fall of 2002 the City requested that the Werth Family LLC ("WFLLC"), owners of Springbrook Oaks, create an easement for a pedestrian path along the entire northern edge of the Springbrook Oaks Specific Plan properties. This path was to be designed to allow pedestrians/bikes to travel from the Greens housing development to Brutscher Street and from there to Fred Meyer.

The WFLLC agreed and recorded easements that would allow a pathway from The Greens on the east to a west side parcel now owned by Argyle Winery.

Since the creation of the Pedestrian Path easement it has become apparent that construction of a path that accomplishes the original intent is impossible.

For the following reasons we are respectfully requesting that the easement be vacated:

- The WFLLC sold ODOT the lands that were selected as necessary to construct the second phase of the bypass. As part of that sale the City released the pedestrian easement located on that property.
- There is no path identified in the 2005 or 2016 TSP for a path from The Greens to Fred Meyer.
- There is no TSP plan that shows a pedestrian path over the Argyle site to the west of the WFLLC property.
- Should pedestrians from the hospital complex or from the WFLLC developments on the north side of Hayes Street need

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The City of Newberg maintains a Municipal Services (Utility Bill) Assistance Program as defined in Resolution 2018-3502. On May 28, 2019, the Citizens' Rate Review Committee (CRRC) met to approve the utility assistance grant applications and determine the amount of award for each applicant for the 2019-20 fiscal year. There were ten nonprofit organizations that applied and were awarded \$500 each by the CRRC to assist utility customers for the 2019-20 fiscal year. The CRRC also met to review the overall policies of the assistance program.

An element of this program is financial assistance for low-income residents and active military/veteran residents. Currently, there is \$4,000 allotted for low-income residents and \$2,000 for active military/veteran residents. In the proposed Resolution 2019-3574, it is recommended by the CRRC that these allotments be reallocated so that each program has \$3,000. Historically, the low-income assistance program has used less than \$3,000 to assist customers. The CRRC determined these funds would be better utilized by shifting \$1,000 to the military assistance program.

In addition to the allotment reallocation, the CRRC has recommended some updates to the wording of the Active Military and Veterans Assistance policy. On page 6 of the attached Exhibit A, the following has been added:

- Added "Accepting Applications Only June 1st to June 30th"
- Added "6. This program is intended for those in need of financial assistance, but is based upon the honor system so that proof of financial hardship in not requested nor required."



1. Introduction:

On February 19, 2008, the City of Newberg adopted a Municipal Service (Utility Bill) Assistance Program that offers financial assistance to low-income families and to Active-Duty Military (Res 2008-2767). The Citizens Rate Review Committee (CRRC) recommended to Council to approve the assistance programs for Newberg water and wastewater customers. The programs included a Yamhill Community Action Partnership (YCAP) voucher, Nonprofit Grant voucher, Military Credit and a voluntary donation program for a total budget of \$7,400.

On June 21, 2010, City Council adopted Res 2010-2902, amending Res 2008-2767 to increase YCAP, Nonprofit and Military funding for a total budget of \$15,000. It was also adopted to allow the Finance Director to make direct monthly utility credits available to qualifying low income customers who are responsible for payment of their utility bill. This credit can be \$5 per capita with a max credit of \$10. This program allows for a total budget of \$10,000.

Since then the adopted budgeted amount has been \$20,000 and allocated as follows: YCAP \$9,000, Nonprofit Agencies \$4,000, Military \$2,000, and Low income financial assistance \$5,000.

On October 15, 2018, City Council adopted Res 2018-3502, superseding previous Res 2008-2767 and 2010-2902. The adoption of this resolution made it possible for military veterans to receive assistance in addition to active-duty military. Also, the utility credits for low-income and military assistance were increased to \$15/month for water-only customers and \$25/month for water/wastewater customers. A few other highlights of Res 2018-3502 was making the assistance program available year-round instead of August – June, changing the frequency of how often a customer can utilize the voucher program, and shifting \$1,000 from the low-income program allotment to the nonprofit grant voucher program.

The revised allocation is proposed as follows in Res 2019-3574:

Program:	Allotted Funds
Yamhill Community Action Partnership (YCAP)	\$9,000
Nonprofit (nonprofit organization and churches)	\$5,000
Monthly Financial Assistance	\$3,000
Military Financial Assistance	\$3,000
Total Allotted Funds	\$20,000

2. Municipal Services Grant (Voucher) Program:

Customers experiencing short-term need for payment assistance may contact the Municipal Services (MS) Department for a list of nonprofit agencies that have been awarded funds by the City of Newberg to issue vouchers for a dollar amount up to the discretion of the Finance Director or Designee. Funding is limited and assistance is available during the budget year from July 1st through June 30th.

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a) Nonprofit Agencies:

- Finance Department mails a letter to nonprofit organizations for their consideration to become part of this program. Applications are to be submitted by a date that is set by the Finance Department. Finance may send a courtesy e-mail to the nonprofit organizations who currently are utilizing the program; e-mail is to notify them that the application is in the mail.
- Submitted applications are date-stamped and reviewed by the Citizens Rate Review Committee (CRRC). Based on the number of approved applications by the CRRC, the Finance Director finalizes the grant funding that is awarded to each applicant. These grant funds are incorporated in the adopted City budget and are subject to change. Approved amount is divided amongst applications on a first-come-first-serve basis.
- Nonprofit agencies who receive other funding to assist Newberg customers will be considered first in the approval process.

b) Yamhill Community Action Partnership (YCAP):

A set dollar amount is approved by City Council therefore does not require review by CRRC. The amount is incorporated in the annual adopted City budget and is subject to change. (Example: 2017/18 award amount to YCAP is \$9,000).

c) Qualification/Guidelines for Nonprofit and YCAP:

- 1. Customer (requesting assistance) must reside in residence and have a Newberg Municipal Services billing account who is billed for water and sewer.
- 2. If the customer's name is not on the Municipal Services Statement, the request for assistance must be signed by the owner of the property stating the credit will be passed along to the applicant.
- 3. Assistance applies to Newberg residential customers only.
- 4. Frequency of the voucher assistance is limited to one (1) voucher once every 3 billing cycles. Exception: those who receive the monthly financial assistance credit, they are limited to one (1) voucher once every six (6) billing cycles.
- 5. Vouchers are issued up to an amount determined at the discretion of the Finance Director or Designee. YCAP and Nonprofit agencies are to contact the Municipal Services Department to verify the applicable amount.
- 6. Original signed vouchers must be submitted in person to the City within 15 days from date of issuance. Voucher numbers are assigned by the agencies, duplicate numbers or copies of vouchers will not be accepted. Blue ink is to be used when completing the forms.
- 7. Vouchers will be modified/declined by the Finance Department if the amount of the voucher exceeds the amount given by the Finance Director or Designee or if guidelines are not followed.

3. Monthly Municipal Services Assistance Credit

This program begins July 1st and ends June 30th of each budget cycle. Monthly assistance credit for active accounts that are billed for water and sewer services will receive \$25.00 per month assistance. For active accounts that are billed for water services only will receive \$15.00 per month assistance. Funding is allotted on a first-come-first-serve basis.

Notification of this program is periodically advertised through the Municipal Services billing statements, flyers, local schools and word of mouth.

Finance Department will mail application to requesting customer. Applicants are to submit the completed application and provide supporting documentation for all boxes they check to show proof of hardship. Finance Department will set the timeframe as to when these applications are to be submitted to the City for consideration.

a) Qualification/Guidelines for Monthly Municipal Service Assistance Credit

- 1. Customer requesting monthly assistance must reside in residence and have a Municipal Services billing account who is billed for water or water/sewer.
- 2. If the customer's name is not on the Municipal Services Statement, the request for assistance must be signed by the owner of the property stating the credit will be passed along to the applicant.
- 3. Assistance applies to Newberg residential customers only.
- 4. Customer's account cannot be more than 30 days delinquent at any time of approved assistance. If the account is more than 30 days delinquent throughout the fiscal year, it may result in termination of assistance for the budget year.

b) Processing of Application

- 1. Finance staff will review and recommend approval/decline of applications based on supporting documentation submitted and account status.
- 2. Finance Director or Designee has approving authority.
- 3. Award letter is mailed to the customer informing them of the timeframe they will receive said credit. Finance Director or Designee has approving authority for retroactive credits.

Supporting Documentation:

- Supplemental Social Security Income Documentation must state Supplemental Social Security, this does not include regular Social Security Income.
- Oregon Medical Card Medical Identification card is to list the applicant's name.
- Food Stamps Letter from DHS (Adult and Family Food Services) must list applicant's name and timeframe of approval. (Annual qualification/renewal)
- Medicaid Identification card is to list the applicant's name.
- Free and Reduced School Lunch or Breakfast Program. Letter from the Newberg School District must list applicant's name, children name(s) and timeframe of approval. (Annual qualification/renewal)

c) Approval of Application

- New Applicant: Customer is to meet with Finance Staff to receive the Water Conservation Kit to help conserve water. Awarded monthly credit begins the month the customer receives the water kit to the end of the terms that are stated on the supporting document or budget year (whichever comes first).
- Deleted Accounts/Moved/Name Change (exception marital status) will automatically terminate the monthly assistance. Customer would need to reapply for new Newberg residence (location).

4. Active Military and Veterans Assistance:

Accepting Applications Only - June 1st to June 30th

This program provides a monthly credit for Active Military and Veterans residential households on their Municipal Services Statement for up to 12 months.

a) Qualification/Guidelines for Monthly Military Assistance Credit

- 1. Active Duty and/or Veteran Military members are to complete the Military Credit application and provide proof of services. (Proof of services consist of active duty photo id, supporting documentation and/or discharge documentation).
- 2. If the military personnel's name is not on the Municipal Services Statement, the request for assistance must be signed by the owner of the property stating the credit will be passed along to the applicant.
- 3. Assistance applies to Newberg residential customers only.
- 4. Monthly assistance credit for active accounts that are billed for water and sewer services will receive \$25.00 per month assistance. For active accounts that are billed for water service only will receive \$15.00 per month assistance. Funding is allotted on a first-come-first-serve basis.
- 5. Finance staff will review and recommend approval/decline of application based on supporting documentation.
- 6. This program is intended for those in need of financial assistance, but is based upon the honor system so that proof of financial hardship is not requested nor required.

5. Voluntary Donation Program and Public Awareness:

Voluntary Donation Program:

In the Municipal Service billing statements, customers will be sent a description notice and voluntary donation form once each year. The donation form will give customers the option of making a one-time donation or a regular monthly donation in the amount of their choosing to be paid with their Municipal Service bill. 100% of donated funds will be used for the Municipal Service assistance program. The donation funds will be used to expand the Municipal Service assistance program over and above the rate-payer funds dedicated by the City of Newberg for the Municipal Service assistance program. If stipulated, the funds will be applied as requested by the donor.

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Public Awareness:

The success of these programs will be significantly enhanced by raising public awareness that they exist. In addition to the notices sent in Municipal Service statements as part of the voluntary donation program, Newberg citizens can be made aware of these programs through the City of Newberg website (www.newbergoregon.gov), flyers distributed at Municipal Service customer counter, posters at local schools, Newberg Public Library, Newberg Dundee Police Department, City Hall and local businesses.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The office of city manager will become vacant as a result of the retirement of City Manager Joe Hannan, which will be effective September 2019. The Newberg City Charter provides that a manager pro tem shall be appointed when the office of city manager becomes vacant. [Chapter 8 – Appointive Officers, Section 34(h) – City Manager.] The City has traditionally relied upon a Council subcommittee to make a recommendation to the full Council on selection. This has been done both externally and internally.

The City Council accepted a letter of retirement from City Manager Hannan on May 5, 2019. The Council met in a Study Session on May 14, 2019 with Sean O'Day from the Mid Willamette Valley Council of Governments to review City Manager recruitment processes.

The City Council appointed a City Manager Recruitment Subcommittee at its May 20, 2019 meeting to serve in an advisory capacity for one year. The committee consists of Councilor Elise Yarnell Hollamon, Councilor Patrick Johnson, and Councilor Elizabeth Curtis Gemeroy. Councilor Yarnell Hollamon volunteered on May 20th to serve as Chair of the subcommittee.

Their task is to make recommendations to the Council concerning the employment of a manager pro tem during the interim period. Additionally, the subcommittee will make recommendations concerning the recruitment and hiring of the permanent city manager. Regular reports will be made to the City Council. Meetings will adhere to the Oregon Public Meetings Law.

City Manager Hannan has assigned City Recorder Sue Ryan, and Assistant to the City Manager DawnKaren Bevill as the support staff to the committee.

This motion is written to provide the subcommittee guidance from the Council for the recruitment process for an interim city manager, establish a timeline, schedule of meetings, and prioritize tasks.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Council will need to address the financial costs for this subcommittee's work through the supplemental budget process for fiscal year 2019-2020.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The procedures set out in this resolution has three stages: Candidate Screening, Interviews, and Offer of Employment. The stages are broadly written to allow the City Council discretion to vary procedures to meet Council's specific needs as circumstances warrant.

The city manager is the chief executive officer of the City and implements all policies of the City at the direction of the City Council. In order for the City to comply with its charter and fulfill the policies established by the City Council, a city manager is a necessary public officer of the City.



RESOLUTION No. 2019-3577

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING PROCEDURES FOR THE RECRUITMENT AND SELECTION OF THE CITY MANAGER PRO TEM

RECITALS:

- 1. City Manager Joe Hannan will retire September 1, 2019.

Offer of Employment: The City Council will meet in executive session to select the finalist and direct city staff to extend an offer of employment to the finalist (which is conditional on City Council approval at a public meeting.) The Council will vote in the open Council Meeting regarding approval of the finalist and the tentative contract. Upon final Council approval, the City will enter into an employment contract with the finalist.
- 4. Other Considerations: Nothing in this procedure, in any resolution, or other document shall obligate the City Council to offer the position of city manager to any candidate, select any candidate or person, or appoint any candidate or person to the position of city manager pro tem. Nothing in this procedure shall prevent the City Council from soliciting input, comments or other information from any group, groups, or the general public concerning the candidates.




