CALL TO ORDER

President Tiffany Prince called the meeting to order at 4:02 pm.

ROLL CALL

City Clerk Izetta Grossman conducted roll call; Prince, Krummrich, Nelson, Lennox, Ferrer, Rahmlow, Alsheimer present.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

It was moved by Lennox and seconded by Nelson to approve the agenda as presented. The motion carried 7 to 0; Lennox, Nelson, Krummrich, Ferrer, Prince, Alsheimer, Rahmlow voting in favor; none opposed.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

It was moved by Rahmlow and seconded by Lennox to approve the minutes of the April 4, 2022 Regular Beautification Committee Meeting as presented. The motion carried 7 to 0; Rahmlow, Lennox, Alsheimer, Nelson, Prince, Krummrich, Ferrer voting in favor; none opposed.

STOP THE DROP REPORT

Krummich said the April 9th Clean up went well. She thanked Ferrer for getting the POP group and Wasco County Democrats to be guest hosts.

She reviewed the current openings for guest hosts and asked the group to connect her with anyone they knew on the list of potential groups.

Prince said she would reach out to Girl Scouts; ASP/Honor Society; Little League and MCMC (if no one else has a connection).

Beautification Committee Outline for City Council and Budget Committee Presentation

Lennox said the general idea was to have a City-wide Tree Plan, replacing the old tree list that was seldom given to anyone. He said having a professional hired would be best.

There was some discussion on Ferrer presenting at the Budget Committee, as she serves on both. Prince and Mayor Mays felt she would have to disclose her connection.

The Committee did a run through, adjusted order and discussed language, resulting in the following:

- A. Prince Accomplishments Budget Request
- B. Lennox/Rahmlow Trees
- C. Ferrer Climate Connection
- D. Nelson Benches (Downtown furniture)
- E. Krummich Coordination

It was decided leave some information with Council for review. It was decided Prince would make a cover sheet; included will be Big Tree flyer and accomplishments list; Grossman would print and distribute to Council at the April 25th Council Meeting.

Mayor Mays assisted with fine tuning the wording. He said he had spoken with incoming City Manager Matthew Klebes and felt the Committee would have his support.

The Committee decided to invite Klebes to a future meeting, giving him time to settle in to the position.

The next meeting will be May 16, 2022 at 4:00 pm – in person and Zoom
