

RESOLUTION NO. 2549

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE GSA SURPLUS PROPERTY PER THE FEDERAL SURPLUS LAND DISPOSAL RULES.

THE TROUTDALE CITY COUNCIL FINDS AS FOLLOWS:

1. On May 9, 2012, the City of Troutdale accepted from the General Services Administration (GSA) certain federal surplus property, consisting of 2.37 acres of unimproved land (the "GSA property"), and was then assigned to Health and Human Services (HHS) for oversight of the City's use.
2. The property must be used for public health purposes in accordance with the provisions of the Federal Property and Administrative Services Act of 1949 (40 U.S.C. § 550).
3. The property is adjacent to the Water Pollution Control Facility (WPCF).
4. A previous pilot project utilizing "Bio-Bags" to dewater WPCF biosolids failed to perform as desired.
5. The City Council of Troutdale finds that the proposed Debris Decontamination Station Facility for the collection of and processing of sanitary sewer and storm sewer system maintenance debris and for street sweeping debris handling and disposal is in the best interests of the city and its Public Works operations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TROUTDALE

Section 1. The Troutdale City Council is in support of the development of the proposed Debris Decontamination Station Facility at the GSA property.

Section 2. The Public Works Director is hereby authorized and empowered to perform the city's project management duties as required by the HHS, and further authorizes the City Manager, subject to budget appropriations, to execute any further and required contracts and legal documents needed to satisfy the requirements and needs of the HHS as it pertains to the pursuit of the development of the proposed land improvements.
