October 12, 2021 Council Meeting Minutes

Regarding an ordinance amending TMC 10.38.010.

I have a major problem with adding the offenses of speed racing and reckless driving as subject to vehicle impoundment. I assume that the cost of towing and storage would amount to several hundred dollars.

Impoundment is essentially assessing a fine in the form of those charges before the case has been legally resolved. What if the defendant goes to court, and the charges are dismissed for whatever reason? Could they then sue the City for reimbursement of their impound expenses?

Of course, there are existing penalties under State statute that apply to both of these offenses. including fines up to \$2,000 for Speed racing and fines up to \$6,250 and one year jail time for Reckless driving.

I can see a basis for impoundment if the vehicle operator is found to have a suspended license or no insurance, in which case they shouldn't have been operating the vehicle in the first place.

If impoundment is intended as a deterrent, why not apply it to other equally dangerous moving violations that probably occur every day, such as running red lights and speeding in general, among others?

I also noted that number 9 under 10.38.010 references 10.32.060 Speed racing, under which Section D reads "Any vehicle utilized within the city limits in violation of this section, including vehicles belonging to, or under the control of, spectators may be towed without notice, subject to the provisions of TMC 10.38.010." This appears to already allow for impoundment for Speed racing.

On a final note, I question why under 10.38.010 that blocking a mailbox (number 6) is a towable offense, but blocking a fire hydrant is not. By the way, I see little or no enforcement of either.
