Lebanon, Oregon Oct. 4, 1949

City Council met in regular session called to order at 8:00 P.M. by Mayor Tweed. Roll call showed the following present: Mayor P. T. Tweed. Councilmen, Elmer Fitzgerald, G. N. Gillenwater, C. A. Shimanek, O. M. Stevenson, Kenneth Fuller and Delbert Scott. Attorney K. G. Wilshire, St. Supt. E. C. McClain, Engineer G. E. Whitcomb and Recorder Ilda Unger. Minutes of the adjourned meeting of Sept. 20, were read and approved.

St. Committee report. Paving Sts. are completed, Berry St. graveling nearly completed, School and no parking signs at Presbyterian Church, recommended by St. Committee the recorder to notify Southern Pacific, sidewalk to be installed at Hiatt St. Williams St. and Tangent St. crossings. Motion by Gillenwater seconded by Shimanek that the Recorder be instructed to write letter to Southern Pacific to install sidewalk on Hiatt, Williams and Tangent St. crossings, also a letter to the S.P. & S. for sidewalk on Elmore and Williams Sts. Motion carried and so ordered. Sidewalk on Williams St. between Elmore and Milton Sts. discussed as to the width making a $4\frac{1}{2}$ ft. this making the sidewalk on the property line. Motion by Stevenson seconded by Shimanek that this matter be left in the hands of the St. Committee with the authority to act. Motion carried and so ordered. The St. Committee and Supt. started to clean up the streets, and there has been 57 items the St. committee and Mayor have taken care of.

The bids that was opened Sept. 20, for gas and diesel oil and left in the hands of the finance committee to report. They recommended the bids be rejected and call for new bids, one for gas and the other for diesel oil. Motion by Stevenson seconded by Shimanek that we accept the Finance Committee recommendation to reject the bids and call for new bids, being separate bids. Motion carried and so ordered.

Sanitary Sewer and disposal plant and the new territory to be annexed to the City was discussed. Also another police car and an extra policeman was discussed. Motion by Fitzgerald seconded by Gillenwater that the police committee check the finances and purchasing of a new police car for patrolling. Motion carried and so ordered.

Fire report, City 4 general 3 silent, Rural 17 general 2 silent, 1 False, City-Drowning 1. Fire hydrant at the corner of Oak and Hiatt Sts. discussed. Motion by Stevenson seconded by Gillenwater that the recorder write a letter to the Mt. States Power Co. to install a fire hydrant at the corner of Oak & Hiatt Sts. Motion carried and so ordered.

Oregon Police Officers schools was discussed. Motion by Scott seconded by Stevenson that the matter of sending officers to police school be left in the hands of Police committee to act. Motion carried and so ordered.

Directory for Lebanon and this section of Linn County was discussed and the number to be ordered for the City. Motion by Gillenwater seconded by Scott that we by one Linn Co. Directory. Motion carried and so ordered.

Petition for St. lights on Wheeler St. from Williams St. E. to the City limit line. Motion by Stevenson seconded by Gillenwater that this be left in the hands of the St. Committee to act. Motion carried and so ordered.

Petitions for annexation to the City was read and discussed, as to the boundary and county road along E. side of Franklin St. extended. Motion by Scott seconded by Fuller that the petitions for annexation and the boundary lines as presented by Ways and Means Committee and Stevenson be accepted. Motion carried and so ordered.

Resolution No. 34, Petitions asking for annexation to the City of Lebanon for certain described territory was read. Motion by Fitzgerald seconded by Gillenwater that the resolution be adopted. Resolution No. 35, addition to resolution passed by the Council on Oct. 4, 1949, the question of the annexation to the City of Lebanon of the two new tracts of land, was read in full. The vote being yes the Mayor declared the resolution adopted.
