

## **RESOLUTION NO. 2571**

### **A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH METRO FOR REGIONAL CLEANUP FUNDS.**

#### **THE TROUTDALE CITY COUNCIL FINDS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. That from 2014 through 2021 the City and Metro have had a series of Intergovernmental Agreements (IGA) for the clean-up of solid waste discarded on public property in Troutdale, and that the City and Metro desire to continue and build upon this past partnership.
2. That dumped garbage, abandoned items such as bulky waste, sharps and other hazardous materials, and other debris, defacement via graffiti, and abandoned vehicles are a blight on the community and represent a threat to the public health, safety, and welfare of the City residents.
3. That the Oregon Legislative Assembly in 2022, by House Bill 5202 (HB 5202) as codified at ORS Chapter 110, through the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, has provided to Metro \$10,000,000 for distribution for trash and sanitation services intended for trash pick-up, debris cleanup, abandoned vehicle removal, provision of dumpsters and trash bins and related costs associated with voluntary trash collection and mitigation, and for remedial actions.
4. That through the IGA the City may receive \$230,000 of the HB 5202 regional clean-up funds from Metro for the contracted clean-up of public spaces including litter pickup, dump site coordination and disposal of abandoned vehicles, and a dedicated graffiti abatement truck outfitted with the necessary mobile power washer, water tank and other clean up equipment.
5. That the Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 190.110 provides the necessary authority for the City and Metro to enter into an IGA for the HB 5202 regional clean-up funds.
6. That an IGA is necessary to distribute the HB 5202 regional clean-up funds, the City and Metro desire to enter into the IGA, and the IGA is in the best interest of the City.

#### **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TROUTDALE:**

Section 1. Agrees now that the City enter into an IGA with Metro for HB 5202 regional clean-up funds and approves the IGA in substantial conformity with Exhibit A of the Staff Report, but with any changes the City Official may determine necessary.

Section 2. Environmental Specialist Ryan Largura is hereby designated for Sections 3 and 16 of the IGA, as the named Scope of Work Project Manager on behalf of the City.

Section 3. The City Council finds that in accordance with the authority granted in Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 190.110 entering into an IGA for clean-up of solid waste in the community serves a valuable, necessary, and authorized public purpose and is in the public interest.

Section 4. The City Manager Ray Young, and Finance Director Erich Mueller, (each an "City Official") are designated, or a designee of the City Official, to act on behalf of the City, and without further action by the City Council, the City Official is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to sign the IGA on behalf of the City, and any and all other required and necessary documents to implement the intent of the IGA and this resolution.

Section 5. The City Official is hereby authorized to execute, acknowledge and deliver the IGA, including any other supporting and implementing documents, and to take any other action as may be advisable, convenient, necessary, or appropriate to give full force and effect to the terms and intent of the IGA and this resolution, and the execution thereof by any such City Official shall be conclusive as to such determination.

Section 6. Further, consistent with intent of the IGA, and in the best interest of the City, the City Official is authorized to determine, execute, acknowledge and deliver any subsequent addendums, extensions, revisions, modification, or successor documents of the IGA, and the execution thereof by any such City Official shall be conclusive as to such determination.

Section 7. Further, as applicable, to comply with State statutes, administrative rules or local ordinances, and to act in the best interest of the City, and without further action by the City Council, the City Officials are hereby authorized, directed, and responsible for fulfilling the ministerial, intergovernmental, technical, compliance, procedural or promotional functions as required for the effective administration and implementation of the IGA and this resolution, and to take any other action as may be advisable, convenient, necessary, or appropriate, and the execution thereof by any such City Official shall be conclusive as to such determination.

Section 8. The Finance Director is authorized to disburse funds, subject to annual appropriations, as necessary to fulfill the IGA obligations and the intent of this resolution and is further directed to implement all such actions necessary to ensure budgetary compliance.

Section 9. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
