1. Speed Zone Investigation – Chetco Avenue

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Brookings Planning Commission was called to order by Chair Wulkowicz at 7:01 pm in the Council Chambers at Brookings City Hall followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

PLANNING COMMISSION CHAIR PERSON ANNOUNCEMENTS – election of Chair and Vice-Chair

Motion made by Commissioner Malmberg to nominate Chair Wulkowicz as Planning Commission Chairperson for 2022 proceedings; motion seconded. By a 5-0 vote with Chair Wulkowicz abstaining, the motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Bond to nominate Commissioner Coons as Planning Commission Vice Chairperson for 2022 proceedings; motion seconded. By a 6-0 vote the motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

4.1 In the matter of File No. CUP-13-21, a request for approval of a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to operate Short Term Rental facilities at 1338 Heather Lane.

There was no ex parte contact, bias, personal interest, or conflicts of interest declared and no objection to the jurisdiction of the Planning Commission to hear the matter. The public hearing was opened at 7:07 pm. PWDS Director Tony Baron reviewed the staff report.

The applicant's representative, Holly Hatch, Paragon Property Management was present to answer any questions.

Teresa Lawson, 821 Brookhaven Drive, Brookings spoke in opposition of the application, expressing concern over the number of residences that are being turned into short term rentals depleting the local housing supply for residents seeking long term housing.

Applicant's representative Holly Hatch advised the applicant does intend to use one of the units as a long term rental.

No participant requested additional time to submit materials. The public hearing was closed at 7:24 pm.

The Commission discussed and deliberated on the matter. Motion made by Commissioner Watwood to approve File No. CUP-13-21, a request for a Conditional Use Permit to operate two short term rentals at 1388 Heather Lane based on the findings and conclusions stated in the Staff Report and subject to the Conditions of Approval; motion seconded and with no further discussion by a 6-0 vote the motion carried.

Motion made by Chair Wulkowicz to approve the Final Order regarding file CUP-13-21, based on the findings and conclusions stated in the Staff Report and subject to the Conditions of Approval; motion seconded and with no further discussion by a 6-0 vote the motion carried.

4.2 In the matter of File No. CUP-14-21, a request for approval of a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) for an existing church to operate a benevolent meal services facility at 1200 Easy Street, Trinity Lutheran Church.

Commissioner Bond declared ex parte contact and a potential conflict of interest and recused himself from the proceedings. No objections to the jurisdiction of the Planning Commission to hear the matter. The public hearing was opened at 7:26 pm. PWDS Director Tony Baron reviewed the staff report.

Representatives for the applicant, Mary Jo Delaney, 1401 View Court advised the church recently had been inspected and approved by OHA for licensing of the Benevolent Meal Kitchen. She did not believe the church had not received any complaints from neighboring property owners. Randy Loring advised the church had been offering meal services one day a week prior to COVID for the last nine years and resumed serving one day a week in October, 2021.

Danielle Byrd, 640 Mardon Court, Brookings spoke as an interested party. She appreciates all the activities the church conducts, but is concerned that the meal services could increase causing neighborhood issues that are happening near St. Tim's Church.

Kevin McCurdy, 1214 W MarVista Lane, Brookings spoke in opposition of the application and believes the meal services increase the likelihood of crime and homeless camps in the area.

No participants requested additional time to submit materials. The public hearing was closed at 7:41 pm.

The Commission deliberated on the matter. Motion made by Commissioner Watwood to approve File No. CUP-14-21, a request for a Conditional Use Permit to operate a benevolent meal services facility at 1200 Easy Street, Trinity Lutheran Church based on the findings and conclusions stated in the Staff Report and subject to the Conditions of Approval; motion seconded and with no further discussion by a 5-0 vote the motion carried with Commissioner Bond recusing himself.

Motion made by Chair Wulkowicz to approve the Final Order regarding file CUP-14-21, based on the findings and conclusions stated in the Staff Report and subject to the Conditions of Approval; motion seconded and with no further discussion by a 5-0 vote the motion carried with Commissioner Bond recusing himself.

4.3 In the matter of File No. CUP-15-21, a request for an existing church to operate a benevolent meal services facility at 820 Old County Road, Star of the Sea Catholic Church.

There was no ex parte contact, bias, personal interest, or conflicts of interest declared and no objection to the jurisdiction of the Planning Commission to hear the matter. The public hearing was opened at 7:48 pm. PWDS Director Tony Baron reviewed the staff report.

Representatives for the applicant, Sister Mary and Lynette McCallister, 818 Old County Road were present to answer any questions. Their OHA Benevolent Meal Kitchen inspection is scheduled for the upcoming week. They currently serve one day a week (Wednesday) and have no current plans to increase the number of days they serve.

No members of the public spoke in opposition and no participant requested additional time to submit materials. The public hearing was closed at 7:54 pm.

The Commission deliberated on the matter. Motion made by Commissioner Malmberg to approve File No. CUP-15-21, a request for a Conditional Use Permit to operate a benevolent meal services facility at 820 Old County Road, Star of the Sea Catholic Church, based on the findings and conclusions stated in the Staff Report and subject to the Conditions of Approval; motion seconded and with no further discussion by a 6-0 vote the motion carried.

Motion made by Chair Wulkowicz to approve the Final Order regarding file CUP-15-21, based on the findings and conclusions stated in the Staff Report and subject to the Conditions of Approval; motion seconded and with no further discussion by a 6-0 vote the motion carried.

4.4 In the matter of File No. CUP-16-21, a request for approval of a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) for an existing church to operate a benevolent meal services facility at 540 Pacific Avenue, Brookings Presbyterian Church.

Commissioner Coons declared a potential conflict of interest and recused himself from the proceedings. No objections to the jurisdiction of the Planning Commission to hear the matter. The public hearing was opened at 7:56 pm. PWDS Director Tony Baron reviewed the staff report.

The applicant, Brookings Presbyterian Church, was not present.

No participants requested additional time to submit materials. The public hearing was closed at 7:59 pm.

The Commission deliberated on the matter. The applicant, Seventh-Day Adventist Church was not present.

No participants requested additional time to submit materials. The public hearing was closed at 8:04 pm.

BROOKINGS PLANNING COMMISSION 2021 YEAR IN REVIEW

The Brookings Planning Commission met in quorum ten times in 2021. The Commission is made up of seven members. It is chaired by Gerald Wulkowicz with Cody Coons serving as Vice Chair. The other members of the Commission include: Skip Hunter, Clayton Malmberg, Skip Watwood, Anthony Bond who replaced Tim Hartzell and Bill Hamilton who replaced Michelle Morosky following her appointment to City Council. Tony Baron serves as Public Works and Development Services Director and Lauri Ziemer as Planning Tech.

During the year the Planning Commission acted on the following matters:

- Approval of 17 Conditional Use Permits, 13 of which were for short term rentals and four of which were for Benevolent Meal Service Facilities at local churches.
- Approval of two City initiated Land Development Code Revisions including:
 - 1. Chapter 17.180 changing language regarding workforce housing that would result in less restrictions for ADU development in residential zones.
 - Chapter 17.08.020 adding the definition of Benevolent Meal Services. Adding Benevolent Meal Services as a Conditional Use to Chapters 17.20.040, 17.24.040 and 17.28.040 and adding the specific standards for Benevolent Meal Services to Chapter 17.124.
- Approval of two Minor Partitions both of which were splitting one parcel into two parcels.
- Approval of two Subdivisions including:
 - 1. A 20 lot Subdivision to be known as Seacrest Estates Phase III in the East Harris Heights neighborhood.
 - 2. A four lot subdivision to be known as Tide Pool Estates in the Dawson Tract area.
- The Planning Commission participated in a joint City Council/Planning Commission workshop to discuss putting a cap on the number of short term rentals allowed in the City.

The Planning Commission looks forward to the upcoming year and serving the residents of Brookings with a fair and unbiased decision making process as well as advising the Brookings City Council on matters affecting its residents.

Background/Discussion:

Curry County turned over Public Health Services to the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) effective July 1, 2021. With no remaining county representation, OHA leaned on St. Timothy's Episcopal Church to provide some services including vaccination clinics and COVID-19 rapid testing. Soon after, OHA contracted with St. Timothy's and began paying them for some of these services, and additional wrap-around services.

The City has not been contacted by OHA regarding Land Use Compatibility. This process is used to ensure that proposed projects and services are consistent with local land use requirements. I contacted both OHA and St. Timothy's in August to make sure they were aware that "medical clinic" services were not allowed in a residential zone. The City understood that the increased services were, in part, due to the pandemic. I reiterated that both the City Council and City Staff were supportive of the services, but not in the location in which they were being provided – a residential zone. We asked that a long-term solution be found in the near future, as this was negatively impacting the neighborhood. There has been no change.

The Mayor requested that this topic be brought to a Council meeting so that authorization could be given to send a letter to OHA.
