Waive Park Use and Picnic Table Rental Fees for the annual Wild Rogue Relay event scheduled June 18, 2022.

Recommended Motion:

Move to waive park use and picnic table rental fees for the annual Wild Rogue Relay event.

Financial Impact:

Loss of park use and picnic table rental fees in the amount of \$1,379.

Background/Discussion:

This will be the eighth year of the Wild Rogue Relay event and the sixth year that Azalea Park has been the terminus for the event. This event starts at Applegate Reservoir and covers a 215-mile route to the coast. This event was canceled in 2020, and eventually canceled in 2021 after first being rescheduled to September. The event organizers estimate typically 85 twelve-person teams and 14 six-person teams participate in the event. Combined with family members, vendors, and other volunteers, this event brings many visitors to Brookings. Organizers report that approximately 40 percent of those participating in the event stay overnight.

Wild Rogue Relay event organizers have requested a waiver of the park use and picnic table rental fees which the City has waived in the past for this event.





Background/Discussion:

BMC 2.85.070(D) provides for the City to develop an alternate process pursuant to ORS 221.727 for selling the property, after notice and a public hearing.

221.727 Alternative procedure for sale of city-owned real property; public notice and hearing. Notwithstanding ORS 221.725, a city council may adopt, after public notice and hearing, a procedure for the sale of individual parcels of a class of city-owned real properties, or any interest therein, under a single program established within the city for the sale of that class of properties. The city may thereafter sell any parcel under that adopted procedure in lieu of the procedure under ORS 221.725.

Staff reviewed the relevant BMC and ORS with the city attorney, and recommend developing a "simpler" alternative process for a specific class of properties. The class defined in the attached resolution is property less than 4,000 square feet that abut one adjoining landowner.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BROOKINGS AUTHORIZING AN ALTERNATIVE PROCEDURE FOR THE SALE OF CITY-OWNED REAL PROPERTY.

WHEREAS, the City of Brookings ("City") has adopted Brookings Municipal Code (BMC) 2.85.070(D) which provides for the City to develop an alternative process for the sale of surplus property pursuant to ORS 221.727; and

WHEREAS, ORS 221.727 allows an alternative procedure for the sale of city-owned real property in lieu of the procedure under ORS 221.725; and

WHEREAS, the city has provided public notice and a hearing regarding this process; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to establish a class of properties to which this alternative process would apply; and

WHEREAS, this class of properties is defined as city-owned parcels that are less than 4,000 square feet, and are only abutted by one adjoining landowner; and

WHEREAS, the property is only of value to a person or entity that has adjoining property; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the City Council of the City of Brookings authorizes the direct sale and transfer of property in this classification to an individual or entity that meets the above criteria, with approval of the City Council.

Passed by the City Council April 25, 2022, and made effective the same date.

Motion to approve the transfer of real property, map number 40-13-31BA lot 400, to Kellie Hanson for \$1, with the purchaser paying for all closing and recording costs.

Background/Discussion:

The City received a request from Kellie Hanson, a resident at 7192 Vista Ridge Drive, to transfer a small parcel of property that is owned by the City and is currently occupied by a water reservoir and pump house that was taken out of commission when the new airport reservoir was constructed in 2013. This is a discrete parcel, roughly 2200 square feet in size, and accessed through an easement placed on the lot at 7192 Vista Ridge. In addition, the resident has requested the reservoir remain onsite as they intend to use it as an accessory structure to their primary residence.

Staff has reviewed the water master plan, consulted with the Dyer Partnership (city engineer), and have determined that the reservoir is no longer necessary to supply water to the area. Additionally, staff and the Dyer Partnership evaluated the possibility of relocating the steel reservoir to another location and determined that there was no guarantee it would not leak upon reassembly at another location.

Staff reviewed three comparable bare land sales in the area which averaged between \$11 and \$15 per square foot, therefore giving it a value between \$24,200 and \$33,000. We received an estimate from McLennan Excavation to demolish the reservoir in the amount of \$36,780. The estimated cost to demolish the reservoir exceeds the estimated value of the land therefore staff recommends

the transfer of this parcel for \$1. The requesting resident has agreed to pay all closing and recording costs associated with the sale of this property.

Resolution 22-R-1127, authorizes an alternative process for the sale of surplus property pursuant to ORS 221.227. Therefore, staff recommends the transfer of this property to the adjoining landowner, Kellie Hanson. The quitclaim deed will state that the sale is for \$1 and "other good and valuable consideration" (City saving approximately \$36,000 in demolition costs).
