\$562,755 GF	• POP 140 – Environmental Justice Coordination. Authorizes additional positions to implement new Environmental Justice work. 1.5 FTE
\$2,909,234 OF	• POP 141 – Maintain Agency Support Staff. Authorizes positions in the central services division to increase capacity in core support functions including human resources, contract management, facilities, IT and financial services. 12.0 FTE
\$449,717 OF	• POP 142 – Grants Management and Support. Authorizes two full-time positions to support the growing work related to federal and state grant management. 2.0 FTE

\$3,580,269 OF	• POP 110 – Title V Stabilization. Authorizes a fee increase to restore permitting position that will otherwise be eliminated. 11 FTE
\$500,000 GF, \$1,049,039 OF	• POP 115 – Community Climate Investments. Authorizes a small administrative fee to over see Community Climate Investment projects. 4.0 FTE

\$537,045 GF, \$11,815,524 in FF/OF limitation	•129 - Effectively Administer Grants and Contracts. (Provides DEQ Water Quality programs with staffing capacity to proactively develop and effectively administer programs funded by new and expanded federal investment. 2 FTE
\$600,000 OF Limitation only, no revenue.	•162 – Modernize Clean Water State Revolving Fund Loan Management Software. Expenditure limitation to complete replacement of Clean Water State Revolving Fund software.
\$70,080,000 OF Limitation only.	•181 – Clean Water State Revolving Fund Loans and Bonds. Seeks limitation to provide \$70 million of additional CWSRF loans using federal grant monies. Also, establishes non-limited expenditure approval to fund \$80,000 of bond issuance costs associated with bonds issued to provide the state match for three federal capitalization grants to maintain Oregon's CWSRF.
\$20,080,000 OF Limitation only.	•191 – Clean Water State Revolving Fund. Seeks approval to issue up to \$20 million worth of bonds during the 2023-25 biennium to meet the twenty percent state match requirement for federal capitalization grants and to pay bond issuance costs.
