Program Overview

DEQ

- Approve plans and plan changes
- Oversee compliance with BOP
 - Approve annual reports



SW Incinerator

Timeline

- Program plans due November 1, 2020
- Programs begin operations by July 1, 2021

What's Covered

Includes:

- Prescription drugs
- Over-the-counter drugs
- Brand name drugs
- Generics

Examples of what's excluded:

- Supplements
- Exposed sharps (needles)
- Animal medicines



Drop-Off Sites

A program operator will contract with:

- Pharmacies, or other DEA-registered authorized collectors
- Law enforcement agencies

Drop-Off Sites

Sites must provide reasonably convenient and equitable access.

A program operator must find authorized collectors to host:

- One site per county
- Additional sites for each population center

Drop-Off Sites

Program operators can request DEQ to:

- Waive sites in a specific county, or
- Approve additional services and events, where a site cannot be established or maintained.

DEQ's Role

Provide oversight, including:

- Reviewing plans, plan changes and reports for approval.
- Overseeing compliance in partnership with Board of Pharmacy.





Summary of Proposed Rules

- Incorporate new rules into OAR Chapter 340, Division 98
- Four new proposed rules on:
 - Enforcement
 - Ensuring access for historically underserved communities
 - Factors for granting waivers or approvals
 - Fees

Rulemaking Advisory Committee

Included representation for:

- Pharmaceutical manufacturers
- Pharmacies, including independent pharmacies
- Drug take-back programs
- Substance abuse prevention advocates
- Clean water protection interests
- Board of Pharmacy

Enforcement

Require:

- Board-of-Pharmacy registration number for each manufacturer, or
- Statement that the manufacturer is not required to register

Convenient and Equitable Access

For historically underserved communities:

- Ensure access to services.
- Develop goal for fostering public awareness.

Services, Events in Place of a Drop-Off Site

Demonstrate:

- Good-faith efforts to establish a site
- Why a site cannot be established or maintained
- Convenience of services or events, and engagement with historically underserved communities to ensure this
- If local government concurrence was obtained
- Commitment to solicit annually

Enforcement and Discipline

Designates DEQ to act on the EQC's behalf for ORS 459A.239




Fees

- Plan review fee: \$75,000
- Annual fee:
 - First year: \$345,000
 - Second year: \$210,000
 - Third year onwards: \$125,000
- Hourly fee: not to exceed \$250 per hour

Portion of DEQ's fees to a program's costs

Est. annual operating costs of a program operator: \$4 million



Additional Fee Provisions

- Divide annual fee equally among programs.
- Reduce annual fee if revenue exceeds program costs.
- Publish current and projected expenditures and revenue for each fiscal year.

DEQ Recommendation

DEQ recommends that the Environmental Quality Commission adopt the proposed rules and rule amendments seen in pages 39 through 42 the staff report for this item as part of Chapter 340 of the Oregon Administrative Rules Division 98.
