STATEMENT CONCERNING REQUESTED ANNEXATION OF TAX LOT 3209-2700

In Compliance with Peterson v. City
Council of Klamath Falls
[279 OR 249 (1977)]

A.
THE PROPOSAL

Lyle D. Lookabill of Tax Lot 3209-2700. Tax Lot 3209-2700 is approximately 46.24 acres in size. It is immediately to the East of Springbrook Road and adjacent to the West of County Road Number 54 at the North East Part of the City of Newborg. The purchaser, through Mr. Lookabill, is requesting annexation of the parcel to the City. The Purchaser intends to hold the property until rezoning occurs (probably simultaneously with the adoption of Newberg's Proposed Comprehensive Plan). The property will then be developed to a mixture of residential and industrial uses consistent with the general designations on the Proposed Comprehensive Plan.

It should be noted that the subject property is contiguous to property presently in the City of Newberg which is on the South: (Tax Lot 3216-300 and Tax Lot 3216-400). The A-Dek property (Tax Lot 3216-2690) is to the West, across Springbrook Road.

COMPLIANCE WITH ICCC GOALS

(1) Introduction.

This section of the statement will relate to the proposed

annexation's compliance with LCDC Goals. Since the land in question is within the City of Newberg's Urban Growth Bounday, and yet outside the City Limits, it fits with the LCDC definition of Urbanizable land. That definition is:

"Urbanizable Land: Urbanizable lands are those lands within the urban growth boundary and which are identifed and (a) Determined to be necessary and suitable for future urban uses (b) Can be served by urban services and facilities (c) Are needed for the expansion of an urban area."

However, because of the development of Spring meadow Stage 2 and the Rinkus property close to the subject property, the proposed development of Tax Lots 3216-300 and 800, as well as the existing A-Dek industrial land, the land will shortly be able to be considered urban land. The LCDC Definition of Urban Land is:

"Urban Land: Urban areas are those places which must have an incorporated city. Such areas may include lands adjacent to and outside the incorporated city and may also:

(a) Have concentrations of persons who generally reside and work in the area

(b) Have supporting public facilities and services." (Emphasis supplied)

The LCDC Urbanization, Goal No. 14, addresses the question of the change from urbanizable to urban land. The standards set out in the goal for such a change are:

"Land within the boundaries separating urbanizable land from rural land shall be considered available over time for urban uses. Conversion of urbanizable land to urban uses shall be based on consideration of:

(1) Orderly, economic provision for public facilities and services;

(2) Availability of sufficient land for the various uses to insure choices in the market place;

(3) LCDC goals; and

(5) Encouragement of development within urban areas before conversion of urbanizable area."

The proposed annexation complies with the above standards.

(2) Services ..

The proposed Lindquist subdivision on Tax Lots 3216-300 and 800 will be bringing water and sewer services up to the southern edge of the proposed annexed property, they will thus be available.

Access to the proposed property can be had from the Springbrook Road or County Road Number 54, when it is improved.

Oral confirmation has been obtained from the Newberg

Fire Department that fire service is already provided to the

subject area by that Department. There will, thus, be no change.

According to a report on September 19, 1978, to the City by Doctor Post concerning the school situation, total Newberg school attendance is approximately the same as last year. The report also confirmed the building of the new Jr. High School for Newberg, noth of Mabel Rush Grade School and the High School. The new Jr. High School will be located just South of Crestview Drive and to the West of the subject property. The three-school complex is approximately one mile from the subject property. With the Jr. High School addition, the complexwill be adequate to service the children from the proposed development on the property.

A substantial portion of the land in question will be proposed for zoning as industrial. The proximity of the rail-

- (3) Land Availability to Insure Choice in Market Place.
- (a) Housing.

The City's residential growth needs for the near future are not adequately by land suitable for development which is presently within the City. Reference is made to the, "Inventory of Fatural and Cultural Resources", pp. 172 et seq. The Inventory is a manual prepared by the Planning Department and Robert E.

Light Engineers, Inc., which clearly demonstrates future population growth and housing needs.

The lack of land is especially serious if the necessity for some kind of a vacant land inventory is assumed to be sary. Such an inventory is necessary because, if there was little vacant land, land costs would be unreasonably additionally, too little vacant land available for future as sion results in uneven growth; growth occurring in jumps each new parcel becomes available. , a 30% vacancy factor is assumed to be optimum. At the of the study, a 40% vacancy factor existed. However, the facts, nevertheless, justify the proposed annexation for

First, the vacancy factor has changed from the time of the study. According to the Planning Director, Mr. Blanton, there has been proportionately greater utilization of vacant land for building than there has been increases in vacant land through annexation. Mr. Blanton is unable to give a precise estimate of the present vacancy factor. However, 35% would be a valid approximation.

Second, there is some evidence that a vacancy factor of more than 30% would be a better assumption. As the Inventory states at page 186, "In the land use study of the 33 Oregon cities, a slightly higher average of 37% of the land was vacant." This higher percentage becomes even more reasonable when the extremely rapid increase in land prices, which has occurred over the last five (5) years, is considered. The evidence of these increases is to be found in the Yamhill County Assessor's Office, and is asked to be considered as evidence for this report.

Finally, there is evidence that services (as discussed in Part B-2 above) are more immediately available to the proposed land than to a relatively substantial portion of the vacant land which is presently located in the City. This information was confirmed in a conversation with Mr. Blanton.

(b) Industrial.

The <u>Inventory</u> indicates that opproximately 50% of the industrially zoned land is being used for industrial purposes. As is stated, however, at page 179 and 180:

"About 44 acres of industrial land are vacant. While this land appears to be sufficient in terms of acreage, not all of this land is available. Much of the land in the vicinity of the railroad track is parcelized. The two other major areas with space for new industrial expansion generally provide adequate land but on a leased basis only. Several additional areas suitable for industrial development exist outside the City limits. Use of these areas, however, would require sufficient demand to diseplace existing rural uses and extend public services. Without public facilities and services these areas are not immediately available for industrial development.

In the future, any commitment to a major industrial development program would require the conversion of some of these additional lands into planned industrial areas. For such an effort to be successful, an active promotional effort would be required. Such an effort would involve the purchase of an industrial site or the establishment of some other type of incentive program. Also, the major expansion of public services would be a necessity.

In terms of zoning the City is not overzoned for industry. Currently, a relatively good relationship exists between the Plan and the ordinance. Sufficient land is designated in the Plan, but conversion of land to industrial zoning should take place as the need arises."

Rail services are available. The land in question is large entered for the type of major industrial development contemplated in the Inventory as quoted above. The land in question is, thus, more suitable for development than presently zoned land. Choices for suitable industrial land in the marketplace are best insured by the proposed annexation.

(4) LCDC Goals.

a mix of single-family dwellings and apartments. The attached letter (Exhibit "B") substantiates the need for such housing and large tract industrial land in Newberg. As such, the annexation complies with ECDC Coal No. 10, Housing, in that it helps to provide housing at price ranges commensurate with the financial capabilities of Oregon households.

Morcover, as this statement indicates, the proposal complies with the four standards for conversion of urbanizable land found in LCDC Goal Ho. 14, Urbanization, as set out elect

Finally, the fact that all services will be available to the project complies with the LCDC Goal No. 11, Public Facilities and Services, Guideline A5.

(5) Urban Land Defore Urbanizable Land.

Upon completion of Spring Meadows No. 2 and the Edition Rinkus subdivisions, as well as the proposed Lindquist Subdivision within the next year, a strong argument can be made that the lining question will fully comply with the LCDC definition of Upon Land. As such, its compliance with this goal is obvious.

As was developed in Part B-3 above, there is strong evidence that additional land is needed within the City to insure reasonable choices in the marketplace for residential housing and allow for development of adequate industrial land. As such, the urban areas of the city are sufficiently utilized to justify the inclusion of urbanizable land. This land is preferable to other land outside the city because of its profinity to land presently to be developed and existing services.

COMPLIANCE WITH THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

'The property in question is designated "Agricultural" on the present Comprehensive Plan. However, the majority of the property is designated as "Industrial" and smaller portions as "Open Space" and Residential" on the City's proposed

Comprehensive Plan. The, on-the-record testimony and discussions surrounding the proposed plan would seem to indicate the clear intention that this area will be designated "Residential" and "Industrial" on the next plan, and the reasonableness of such a designation.

D. CONCLUSION

Because, the <u>Peterson</u>, requirements have been complied with, the annexation should be approved.

SUBJECT: Proposed Charter Amendments

Enclosed are copies of three resolutions adopted by the COG Board of Directors at their regular meeting on April 10th. The Charter (copy attached) requires, pursuant to Section XVI AMENDMENTS, that all amendments be agreed to by <u>all</u> of the member governments.

It will be appreciated if you will take these resolutions to your Council/Board at their next meeting, discuss them and take action to authorize the Mayor/Chairman to sign the amended Charter when the original is circulated to you.

If you have any questions, I would be happy to respond. In the event that your Council/Board is not in favor of approving one or more of these resolutions, I would appreciate notification of that and an opportunity to discuss it with you.

The reasons for the Board's passage of the resolutions are as follows:

Resolution No. 1-79: About a month ago the Executive Committee raised questions about deficiencies in the Charter having to do with what constitutes a quorum of the Board at an official meeting.

This resolution would amend the procedures to state that a simple majority of the voting members of the Board of Directors at the time of any officially called meeting shall constitute a quorum to conduct business at that meeting.

Resolution No. 2-79: The Executive Committee believes that each member of the Board has a duty to vote unless he or she states that a direct financial interest is involved in the item and is so stated during the discussion and prior to the vote. The Committee recommended Board approval.

Resolution No. 3-79: This amendment was a follow-up on the Board's action in March to remove a standing, permanent committee, the Regional Planning Committee, and appoint ad hoc task forces to deal with proposed plans or programs as they arise.





For the past two years Herb and I have had hearings and planing commission meetings. Nothing has happened so far for us to obtain proper zoning.

Our property lies immediately next to Spring Meadow sub-division on Hghwy 99. Sec 16, R 3W T3S tax lot # 3216-1200 (re-numbered) 3226-AC13800.

The city of Newberg, the county, and we do know that these 14.7 acres is NOT agricultural land. Our previous planner did not want to admit to this fact. We know that there is one other need, and that is this; there is a dire need for mobil home spaces.

Since the SEWAGE PUMP REQUIREMENT has been the sole reason for our project being continously defeated Herb and I have agreed -from the beginning) that we will contract with the city to BUY, INSTALL, and MAINTAIN sewage facilities required by our project.

It has been the Citys' contention that they will not serve sewer puppns in the event of annexation. On the other hand Newberg has annexed land recently and installed sewage pumps. So has every town in Oregon.

Herb and I are requesting that the County Commissioners make a recommendation to the City of Newberg to put our 14.7 acres in the UGB and to zone it exclusively for mobil homes residences.

SUGGESTED CORRECTIONS AND ADJUSTMENTS TO 1979 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN MAP AND ZONING-TL 1900 - 3216

We present the following suggestions on behalf of the following property owners in various parcels of the former Tax Lot 1900 - 3216. Annexation and subsequent partitions have created new property lines but we believe the properties are adequately identified by the attached sketch map, Exhibit "A".

The concerned property owners are listed below with their respective holdings. The writer has attached letters of authority to act as agent from each owner.

Property Parcel A, Exhibit A Parcel B, Exhibit A Parcel C, Exhibit A

Newberg Veterinary Clinic Newberg East Joint Venture Ltd. C. R. Moe

The desire of these concerned property owners is to remove the Industrial designation from the annexed portion of the former TL 1900, saving and excepting the North half of Parcel A, ExhibitA.

They wish to subsitute instead a "Commercial" designation and zoning. Under the present ordinance, still in effect, this would be Roadside Commercial, C-3. Under the proposed ordinance, the C-2 Zoning category may be probably most appropriate, considering the terms of Section 406 of the proposed ordinance. The petitioners recognize however, that the proposed C-1 category would be equally acceptable should the City prefer it.

The owners of Parcel "A" are prepared to partition that property to provide the necessary lot line at the proposed zoning boundary. The North half of the property would remain INDUSTRIAL contiguous to TL 2000, which is now Industrial.



RE: Petition for Zoning Revision and Comprehensive Plan Map Amendment Residual Portion of TL 1900-3216

The subject property is depicted on the attached sketch 903-14, Exhibit "A", dated May 22, 1979, as Parcels "B" and "C", and the South half of Parcel A.

Tax Lot 1900 was annexed April 1978 and the ensuing automatic zone change request was originally specified in the application Commercial C-3, and so filed. The Planner reviewed the application and returned the papers informally with the recommendation that we re-file for Industrial Zoning, as he felt he could not provide a favorable recommendation for C-3. We did not concur, but passed the decision back to the then owner, Hubert Slegers. Mr. Slegers was principally concerned with obtaining the annexation and had no strong opinion as to ultimate zoning, so the application was revised for Industrial Zoning, which was subsequently approved.

The Planner stated that his opinion was strongly influenced by the 1974 Comprehensive Plan Map as revised by resolution, May 1974. This revision is shown on the attached excerpt Exhibit "B" from the revised 1974 Plan Map, taken from the City Administrator's copy.

Reviewing the Comprehensive Plan Map excerpt Exhibit "B", it is immediately apparent:

- 1. That the Industrial designated area was only very loosely and generally defined on that map.
- 2. That although some 150 acres of the Werth property (TL 2000-3216) had contemporaneously been annexed and designated Industrial, and although the resulting new City Limits line was very clearly shown on the Plan Map, nevertheless the Industrial area on the amended 1974 Comprehensive Plan Map does not conform to that 1974 annexation line, but cuts across TL 2000 (Werth property) incorrectly and includes most of TL 1900 (Slegers property) inadvertently.
- 3. That a Commercially designated strip about 400 feet deep along the East side of Springbrook Road, South of 99W was omitted from the 1974 Map.

The 1974 Plan Map in this area is so full of errors of omission and of commission that it cannot be used with any confidence except perhaps as a very loose and general guideline. The 1974 Plan and Map were the controlling regulatory documents at the time of the Slegers annexation.

It is felt by this applicant that these documents had an undue influence upon the decision in 1978 to revise the Slegers application from C-3 to Industrial, a decision admittedly propelled along the line of least resistance by the seller's desire to conclude the annexation and re-zoning as quickly as possible for private reasons.

The conclusion is warranted that the Industrial designation was only loosely sketched on the adopted documentation of the 1974 Plan, and that arbitrary decisions should not have been made on the documentary background of that Plan without the opportunity for a complete airing of pros and cons in public hearing.


There are several additional reasons for favorable reconsideration of the Zoning on TL 1900, from the general standpoint of PUBLIC NEED:

- (a) Appearance Parcels "B" and "C" command a frontage on the Highway of about 765 feet, at Newberg's "front door" so to speak, and as a point of civic pride, it is highly desirable from the community point of view to present a frontal appearance of commercial amenities than an industial facade, to the travelling public.
- (b) Public Acceptance Tax Lot 1900 outside City Limits is contiguous to two sides of a partly-built rural residential subdivision, Klimek Homes, and the annexed portion of TL 1900 is barely 350 feet from that subdivision. The impact of an industrial Zoning so close to an established rural setting is highly questionable and should be avoided. Recent public hearings have produced intense and sustained opposition by local residents to proposed contiguous industrial developments even of moderate intensity such as M-2. There is every reason to expect similar opposition from local residents in this case, in particular the residents of Spring Meadow Subdivision, immediately across the highway, 125 feet from the annexed portion of TL 1900. It is a matter of experience that homeowners groups will, over several years accept a specific but potentially undesirable zoning in their neighbourhood map with complete unconcern, until the time comes to implement that zoning. Commercial development on TL 1900 should not draw any significant or articulate opposition, however, due to the lower and more acceptable intensity of use and improved compatibility with established residential uses.
- (c) Priorities and timing Fasano guidelines require that the proposed action be evaluated in terms of two general criteria among others. The first such criterion, that of timing, can be addressed by answering the question "Why perform this action on this property now?" If this zoning correction is not applied now, then this property will remain Industrial and the entire thrust of this application, and its history and rationale, will be set aside. Such a verdict would be irreversible, at least until a major review of the newly adopted (1979) Comprehensive Plan could be scheduled, perhaps five years from now.

It is highly improbable that either TL 1900 or TL 2000 would be still undeveloped five years from now. Therefore it is of paramount importance to resolve these discrepancies and dilemas at this time. It is probably our last opportunity. If this request is denied, we will have Industrial development on TL 2000 and TL 1900 very rapidly. (d) Choice of property, and balance of uses - Another Fasano guideline may be expressed "Why this property rather than some other similarly zoned property which may be available?" This guideline was formulated to cover annexations and major zone changes, particularly those which direct a major negative impact upon surrounding uses. In this case, there is no alternatvie property competing for consideration, and most importantly, the requested change is a less intensive zoning that presently placed on these properties, and is considered a positive and favorable impact. (e) Services - City water is available across the highway, namely the ten inch main from Otis Springs. A fairly new sanitary sewer interceptor exists on the East side of Springbrook Road, and the properties are all within gravitysewerable range of that interceptor. (f) Other factors - The petitioners feel that no negative impacts will be created in any of the following areas of study: Public Services, including fire and schools Economy of City, Region and State - strong positive impacts Air, Water Quality - possibly enhanced, no negative (g) Traffic - There is probably no type of development which does not convey some negative impact in traffic and circulation. This will be true of these properties under any form of zoning and development. Whether industrial or commercial, these properties possess only two authorized highway accesses, and a frontage road is recommended. The petitioners are prepared to dedicate the necessary rightof-way should this petition be successful. (h) Accessibility from Highway - Arising out of traffic considerations, we can also point to the desirability of matching commercial development to highway frontage. It would be undesirable to induce heavy truck access to a major highway at this location. Summary It is our conclusion and recommendation that commercial zoning on this highway frontage property would permit the highest and best use of these lands, would be in the best interests of Newberg and the region, and would conform to good planning criteria in all respects. p-3

It is also our view that the re-zoning application processed in 1978 was erronious in its objective, was developed out of a confusing documentary base, and should be corrected at this time before it is too late.

The favorable consideration of Council is earnestly requested.

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
