Gentlemen:

I wrote you on July 18, 1958, on behalf of L. E. Risedorph and Robert J. Finsand, dba Bob's Wrecking Company, requesting approval of their application to the State of Oregon for a motor vehicle wrecking license. As you know, this approval is in the form of a recommendation by the City Council that the application be approved by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

This matter was considered at the August Council meeting, and continued for final action at the meeting on October 6, 1958. At that time, the matter was heard at some length by the Council, and a motion was made and carried denying the recommendation. Since that time, the matter has been the subject of further thought within the community, and the members of the Council may have given it some additional consideration.

Without wishing to reopen the controversy, or a desire for a further debate at this time, but in order that the record may be fully complete, and that the Council might have an opportunity to express a further opinion on the matter, if it desires to do so, we are submitting the application, dated July 14, 1958, to you again at this time. If during the interval since October 6, 1958, the matter might appear differently to you, my clients would appreciate a favorable recommendation by the Council. If, on the otherhand, you wish to adhere to the former position, then the enclosed application should be returned to me with an appropriate notation under paragraph 6 showing that the recommendation has been denied officially by the Council.

Re: City Liens - Tax Foreclosure

Dear Sir:

Mr. Beaty, the Recorder, has called to my attention the fact that the City of Newberg has interest in three of the tracts of land included in the pending foreclosure by Yamhill County for tax liens. One of these, Item No. 273-Zell, covers a residential property on South River Street on which the City has a water account of \$21.80. I find that the City is holding a deposit of \$5.00 but has no lien on the premises and therefore we would have no right in connection with the tax foreclosure. Due to the fact that I have the address of one of the Zell sons, I am writing him about this matter.

Item No. 264, Schwigert, consists of a lot in City Park Addition on which the City has old gravel liens as follows:

1925 - - - \$ 8.68) Plus Interest 6.76)

It is apparent that the interest on this item would be considerable in view of the small principal.

There is also a 15 cent lien on Item 263 which is Lot 5, Block II, City Park.

On the Schwigert property, Item 264; and on the other property covered by the 15 cent item, the City would have the right to redeem the property at this time or pay the taxes and remove the property from the foreclosure list. However, I would not suggest that this be done as this foreclosure is only the preliminary phase resulting in the acquisition of a title by Yamhill County and permitting a one-year period for redemption

by the taxpayers. After the year of redemption has expired, the County will again advertise the properties and at that time we can give the same notice as was given on the last such sale and acquire the property by bid if desired. It is my suggestion that no steps be taken at this time.

Gentlemen:

The Undersigned visited with Mr. J. W. Harney, City Manager of Hillsbore, Oregon, on March 9, 1959, in connection with various City problems connected with public works.

The first problem had to do with sewer improvement and the means of payment for same. We found that the City of Hillsboro is divided into two sewer districts, Numbered 1 and 2 respectively and that Number 1 is the older district and has a slightly different system than Number 2. Generally speaking, we found that the City makes a sewer connection charge of \$225.00, plus an annual sewer minimum use charge of \$24.00 for residential and \$36.00 for commercial use. This entitles the residential user to six outlets or less and he pays extra for more outlets. Apparently the commercial minimum is subject to increase if water usage increases at the commercial plant but this seems to be the only manner in which the charges are geared to water usage. It appears that this source of revenue makes it possible for the City of Hillsboro to pay the expense of sever improvements without resorting to special assessments on a square foot basis or otherwise. It appears further that the amount of the charges which I have stated represents a gradual increase over a period of time but that they have charged these amounts for a long enough time so that they have a backlog of funds to use for future improvements from time to time. If funds are not available, they resort to bond issues and pay them off through these charges.

Hillsboro has a special clause in their charter allowing the issuance of water bonds without a special City election.

This is an unusual provision so far as most Cities are concerned and in the case of Hillsboro applies to this type of bond only. Special elections are required for all other types of issues, including sewage.

The City Manager stated that he had come to the conclusion that municipalities should operate on the same basis as private corporations and provide for high enough rates in all respects to pay for all costs including improvements and reserves.

The City of Hillsboro has a swiming tank which operates during the summer months only, the same as Newberg. The City Manager states that the annual overhead for this facility is about \$18,000.00 and he feels that they break even on it by making a charge of from 10-to-50 cents per person, together with a family rate of \$13.00 per year. It seems apparent that the Newberg City pool represents a continuing unreimbursed drain on the City budget.

The City of Millsboro allows no new water connections outside the City and this has been their policy for some time. Their annexation problems cover only approximately the past three years.

The City of Hillsboro allows no private ownership of pipe lines or meters outside the City.

In connection with the sewer connections and annual . charges, the City of Hillsboro contacted F.H.A. and found that they would not object to charges as high as \$250.00 per connection, plus a residential annual minimum of \$30.00 or less.

From the foregoing we conclude that the immediate situation relative to the Villa Road sewer extension should be paid for in full by the proposed users and that a chance should be made in sewer connection rates and annual sewer rates. We also conclude that consideration should be given to establishing priorities for a bond issue and every effort should be made to educate the voters as to the need for same without in any way attempting to conceal the fact that the future issues will be needed.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. General Information

Bids will be considered by the City of Newberg, Oregon for furnishing and installing a horizontal centrifugal pump together with motor, bed plate and starting gear. The equipment is to be installed in the City's water treatment plant which is readily accessible for truck delivery. The water plant contains a concrete foundation for the pumping equipment, flanged pipe connections in place and electric conduit. The City will furnish fittings, gate valves and check valve required for the installation.

2. Delivery

The plant is located on a macadam road with ready access, and the equipment shall be delivered freight allowed by the Supplier.

Bidders shall clearly state the time of delivery following receipt of order, and the Supplier shall be held accountable for compliance with delivery time bid.

3. Prices

Bid prices shall be firm without escalator clauses and shall include freight and delivery.

EQUIPMENT SPECIFICATIONS

1. General

The pump shall be an horizontal centrifugal unit direct connected to electrical motor and the pump shall have double suction. The pump shall be a single stage unit capable of pumping against the maximum head conditions specified. The pump will draw water from an adjoining wet well which will contain sufficient water for submergence of pump suction pipes. The unit will discharge into a 12" pipe line from the water treatment plant into the City's distribution system. The static head of the system is about 275 feet.

Pump shall have a capacity of approximately 750 G.P.M. against a T.D.H. of 275 feet.

2. Information with Bid

Bidders shall supply full and complete description of the equipment offered under these specifications accompanied by catalogs, cuts, and engineering data. Characteristic curves for the pumps bid shall be furnished showing capacity, head, efficiency and brake horse power requirements throughout the entire range of the equipment bid.

3. Overall Efficiency and Guarantee

Bidders shall state with the proposal submitted, the over-all efficiency of the pump and motor and the KWH consumption per thousand gallons of water pumped against the required head and the bidder shall guarantee the over-all efficiency and power consumption stated in his bid. Acceptance will be based upon actual field test.

4. Pump Arrangement

Information regarding the details of the pump installation may be obtained from the Consulting Engineers and arrangements may be made with the Owner to examine the plant in which the equipment is to be installed.

Bidders shall submit, with bids, detailed drawings showing the principal dimensions and arrangement of pump and motor in order that it may be readily ascertained whether or not the equipment being offered is suitable for the proposed installation.

5. Pump Constituction and Design

- a. Type: Pump shall be horizontal, split case, centrifugal type with driving unit connected to pump through a flexible coupling with the pump and its driving unit mounted upon a continuous cast iron or welded steel bed plate arranged for bolting to foundations. Pump shall be hydraulically and mechanically balanced.
- b. Pump Casings: Pump casings shall be best quality cast iron, shall be horizontal split design with suction and discharge nozzles cast integral with the lower half, so that upper parts can be removed for inspection of rotating parts without disturbing pipe connection or pump alignment. All water passage-ways shall be designed to produce smooth flow.

c. Impeller: Impeller shall be enclosed type, constructed of bronze, cast in one piece and shall be mechanically and hydraulically balanced. Impellers shall be smoothly finished with interior surfaces hand scraped. They shall be securely fastened to pump shaft. d. Wearing Rings: Removable wearing rings shall be furnished on both pump casings and impellers. Impeller rings shall be bronze, cast iron, or other ferrous material. 8. Loading

Improvements which we feel should be made prior to operating your pool this year are as follows: Clean and paint the interiors of the bathhouses, as needed, and especially in the toilet and shower areas. Replace the broken toilets in both the boys' and girls' bathhouses. 3. Install self-closing valves on all showers to minimize the flow of waste water which must be handled by the inadequate floor drains. Provide sufficient personnel to ensure orderly use of the bathhouse facilities and to maintain clean and sanitary conditions in the bathhouses by exercising close supervision and by frequent cleaning. 5. Clean the pool, repair cracks which have developed near the scum gutter and re-paint where the paint has peeled or worn off. Ramova the trees and shrubbery from inside the wading pool enclosure and fill in this area with concrete and provide benches for the mothers of the children using the wading pool. This will vastly improve conditions in the wading pool. Further improvements to the present bathhouses are considered unjustified due to their small size and overall inadequacy. More adequate bathhouse facilities will be required for operation of the pool beyond this year. GOPY

In addition to the bathhouse deficiencies, the pool is seriously lacking in deck space, and the interior of the pool structure itself should be re-finished and a new scum gutter provided within a very few years.

It is also felt that improvements in the operation of your pool would result from limiting the number of swimmers inside the pool enclosure at any one time to a maximum of 120 in view of the inadequacy of the bathhouses and the limited deck space.

We will be glad to give further consideration to your application for a permit to operate your swimming pool during the coming season upon receipt of your reply to these comments.



In the interest of economey; the uncertainity of channel allecation changes which may come out of FCC hearings to be conducted in Washington D.C. and the necessity for greater operational efficiency and flexibility of cross communication between services during time of great emergency or disaster, or individual use when required, the executive heads of the various fire departments of Tambill County have adopted the following resolutions

RESOLVED: "That the undersigned Fire Departments of Namhill County go on record as favoring and requesting the continued use of Radio Channel 39.18 Mc. as now licensed to the City of McMinnville and other subsidiary base stations as long as feasible or until a change is required."

Two-Way Radic communications have already proven their value in normal, daily use; however, it is during times of disaster or great emergency where many services are involved that we must prepare for effective and efficient operation.

It is the consensus of opinion of the undereigned that there is great need for more comprehensive study; detailed engineering and long-range, cooperative planning between all agencies concerned to meet this end.

With six city fires and three rural for the month of September only two were serious. On the morning of Sept. 5th at 7:00 A.M. we were called to the Spaulding pulp mill log pile. the logs were piled fourty feet high and a continuous pile around the pond. The fire could not be reached with water streams and all the logs had to be removed before the fire could be extinguished. The department was on this fire for nine hours. one hundred twenty eight man hours and thirtysix truck hours, as well as thirty one hundred feet of hose used. On the nght of September 26th the Standard oil bulk plant garage cought on fire this was extinguished before any gasoline tanks were involved, Three trucks were damaged and a small loss on the building.

A surplus armytruck has been secured by the department at the cost of \$350.00 we will mount a water tank on it to use on fires in the rural districts. We hope to have it ready by next fire season so we wont have to use the city flusher

Two drills held last month this is the last of the special drill with the instructor from the Portland fire department but we will continue to drill twice each month, this is necessary to get in the hours of drilling required by the Rating Bureau for a class 5 rating. A total of 57 men attended 13 excused and 7 absent. total 39 men on roll October 1st.

STATE OF OREGON COUNTY OF MARION I, Floyd Query, Secretary of the Oregon State Highway Commission, do hereby certify that the attached copy of Abandonment and Retention 325 Resolution No. adopted by the State Highway Commission on November 5, 1959 abandoning portions of the Newberg-Gerin Corner Section of the Hillsboro-Silverton Secondary Highway No. 140 to Yamhill County, Marion County, and the City of Newberg, respectively entered in Volume XLIV of the minute book, wherein official acts of the said Oregon State Highway Commission are recorded, has been compared by me with the original resolution and that the same is a true and correct copy of said resolution and of the whole thereof. IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the official seal of the Oregon State Highway Commission this 18th day of November , 19 59 .

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, under the provisions of ORS 366.300, whenever the Highway Commission relocates or realigns a state highway or any section thereof, and by reason of said relocation or realignment, there is eliminated from the original highway a section thereof, the eliminated section shall:

- (a) If needed for the service of persons living thereon, or communities served thereby, be maintained by the Commission at the State's expense or by the County, or by the State and County, on such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon:
- (b) If the abandoned sections are merely a part of the old right of way which are no longer needed for right of way purposes, then they shall revert to the abutting property owners, unless, in the judgment of the Commission, said sections are needed or are valuable for any public use; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of ORS 271.330, State may relinquish title to any of its property not needed for public use to any governmental body or political subdivision within the State, providing such property shall be used and continue to be used for a public purpose by such governmental or political subdivision within the State; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of ORS 373.010, whenever the route of any state highway passes through the corporate limits of any city, the Highway Commission shall select and designate the streets of the city over which the state highway shall be routed and may alter or change such routing when in its opinion the interests of the motoring public will be better served; and

WHEREAS, State has relocated a section of the Hillsboro-Silverton Highway, State Secondary Highway No. 140, in Marion and Yamhill Counties known as the Newberg-Gerin Corner Section, the northerly terminus of which is at relocated Highway Engineer's Centerline Station 0+00 on the relocated highway and the southerly terminus of which is at relocated Highway Engineer's Centerline Station 231+00 on the relocated highway; and

WHEREAS, due to the relocation of the aforesaid section, a portion of the former right of way is no longer needed for right of way purposes and may be eliminated as a section of the original Hillsboro-Silverton Highway, State Secondary Highway No. 140, which section to be eliminated is hereinafter designated as Units "A", as shown colored in blue and "B" and "C", as shown colored in red, all on the map attached hereto, marked Exhibit "A" and by this reference made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, State, Marion County, Yamhill County, and the City of Newberg entered into an agreement dated February 15, 1957, relating to the elimination and disposition to be made of the said section of the said original Hillsboro-Silverton Highway which is subject to elimination; and

WHEREAS, said agreement provides that State, by resolution, upon the completion of the said relocated section of the said Hillsboro-Silverton Highway, shall:

- l. Eliminate Unit "A" as part of said highway; and all right, title and interest of State in said Unit "A" shall pass to and vest in the City of Newberg.
- 2. Formally eliminate said Unit "B" as part of the Hillsboro-Silverton Highway, State Secondary Highway No. 140, and the state highway system; and all right, title and interest which State has in said Unit "B" shall pass to and vest in Yamhill County and Yamhill County shall accept all right, title and interest which State has in said Unit "B" and shall maintain said Unit "B" as part of the county road system so long as needed for the service of persons living thereon or communities served thereby.
- 3. Formally eliminate Unit "C" as part of said Hillsboro-Silverton Highway, State Secondary Highway No. 140, and the state highway system; and all right, title and interest which State has in said Unit "C" shall pass to and vest in Marion County and Marion County shall accept all right, title and interest which State has in said Unit "C" and shall maintain said Unit "C" as part of the county road system so long as needed for the service of persons living thereon or communities served thereby.
- 4. Eliminate the existing Willamette River Bridge as part of said highway; and all right, title and interest of State in said bridge shall pass to and vest in the City of Newberg so long as said bridge is used for public purposes. Said bridge is located in Section 29, Township 3 South, Range 2 West, W.M. as shown on said Exhibit "A" and is known as State Highway Bridge No. 1326.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AND IT HEREBY IS RESOLVED by this Commission as follows:

l. That, by reason of the relocation of the Hillsboro-Silverton Highway, State Secondary Highway No. 140, a section of the former right of way of the Hillsboro-Silverton Highway is no longer needed by the State of Oregon and is not required for part of the said new right of way of the said relocated Hillsboro-Silverton Highway which said section to be eliminated is identified as Units "A", "B" and "C" as shown on the attached Exhibit "A" and described as follows:

Unit 18A11

All the land situated within the right of way boundaries of the Hillsboro-Silverton Secondary Highway as formerly routed, beginning at the intersection of said highway as formerly routed and the Pacific Highway West in the City of Newberg; thence southerly, easterly and southeasterly via said Hillsboro-Silverton Secondary Highway as formerly routed to the southerly city boundary of the City of Newberg.

Unit "B"

All the land situated within the right of way boundaries of the Hillsboro-Silverton Secondary Highway as formerly routed, beginning on said highway as formerly routed at the southerly city boundary of the City of Newberg; thence southerly via said highway as formerly routed to the mean high-water line on the northeasterly bank of the Willamette River in Section 29, Township 3 South, Range 2 West, W.M.

Unit "C"

All the land situated within the right of way boundaries of the Hillsboro-Silverton Secondary Highway as formerly routed, beginning at the mean high-water line on the southwesterly bank of the Willamette River in Section 29, Township 3 South, Range 2 West, W.M.; thence southerly and southeasterly via said highway as formerly routed to the westerly right of way line opposite Highway Engineer's Survey Station 179+18.18 in the northwest quarter (NW\(\frac{1}{4}\)), Section 4, Township 4 South, Range 2 West, W.M.

- 2. That pursuant to said agreement entered into with Marion County, Yamhill County and the City of Newberg on February 15, 1957, Units "A", "B" and "C" as heretofore described and as shown on said attached Exhibit "A" are hereby duly eliminated as part of the Hillsboro-Silverton Highway, State Secondary Highway No. 140, and the state highway system; and all jurisdiction which State has in said Unit "A" hereby passes to and vests in the said City of Newberg; and all control and maintenance of said Unit "A" shall hereafter be the responsibility of the City of Newberg; all right, title and interest which State has in said Unit "B" hereby passes to and vests in said Yamhill County; and all right, title and interest which State has in said Unit "C" hereby passes to and vests in Marion County.
- 3. That pursuant to said agreement, the aforementioned bridge spanning the Willamette River, as shown on the attached Exhibit "A", is hereby duly eliminated as part of the Hillsboro-Silverton Highway and the state highway system and all right, title and interest which State has in said bridge hereby passes to and vests in said City of Newberg so long as it is used for public purposes.
- 4. That this resolution be entered in full in the minutes and records of this Highway Commission as Abandonment and Retention Resolution No. 325 this 5th day of November , 1959, and the Secretary is hereby ordered to mail a duplicate original hereof to the County Courts of Marion and Yamhill Counties and to the City Recorder of the City of Newberg.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. General Information

Bids will be considered by the City of Newberg, Oregon for furnishing and installing a horizontal centrifugal pump together with motor, bed plate and starting gear. The equipment is to be installed in the City's water treatment plant which is readily accessible for truck delivery. The water plant contains a concrete foundation for the pumping equipment, flanged pipe connections in place and electric conduit. The City will furnish fittings, gate valves and check valve required for the installation.

2. Delivery

The plant is located on a macadam road with ready access, and the equipment shall be delivered freight allowed by the Supplier.

Bidders shall clearly state the time of delivery following receipt of order, and the Supplier shall be held accountable for compliance with delivery time bid.

3. Prices

Bid prices shall be firm without escalator clauses and shall include freight and delivery.

EQUIPMENT SPECIFICATIONS

1. General

The pump shall be an horizontal centrifugal unit direct connected to electrical motor and the pump shall have double suction. The pump shall be a single stage unit capable of pumping against the maximum head conditions specified. The pump will draw water from an adjoining wet well which will contain sufficient water for submergence of pump suction pipes. The unit will discharge into a 12" pipe line from the water treatment plant into the City's distribution system. The static head of the system is about 275 feet.

Pump shall have a capacity of approximately 750 G.P.M. against a T.D.H. of 275 feet.

2. Information with Bid
