In submiting my annual report I have compiled it in table form for easy understanding. In addition to the listings of the table we have had twenty one calls during the last year that didnt require a general fire alarm. Each business house in the city has been inspected at least two times and many of them more. The department used equipment to wash gasoline off the streets after accident three times. one call for drowning at Scookum lake, three calls for oxygen equipment at the hospitaland rest homes. One arson investigation with the State police. Twentyseven men completed the State vocational 20 hour training course, this was in addition to ten regular drills, members of the department put in eleven hundred and fourty hours drilling last year. The membership has been maintained at over fourty members with about 80% attendance at fires and drills.

I am very pleased with the efficiency of the men of the department and feel that the people of this community should be justly proud of a group of men who devote so much to public service.

It is the opinion of this Department that something should be done to eliminate the hazard that has been created by the above structure, due to its condition and the fact that it has been vacant for a long period of time.

We have been concerned over this situation for a number of years, as it is not only a fire hazard and a public eye sore, but children have, for a long time, used it as a place of seclusion to commit various acts of delinquency. Numerous complaints have been received from the public about this place, and it is definitelyfelt that something should be done as soon as possible. This place is partially obstructed from view due to the overgrowth of trees, shrubs and weeds, which not only create a fire hazard in dry weather, but make it difficult for fire and police officers to keep necessary surveillance of premises in an attempt to keep proper protection from possible fire and further damage. It is falling to pieces due to dry rot and lack of maintenance, and could easily collapse at any time, possibly injuring any child or person that might be within, as it has been impossible to keep them out. Since no apparent effort has been made by the owner to correct or improve this situation, it is the opinion of this Department that the City should take definite steps to eliminate this very dangerous hazard.

Program for planning Assistance

- A. This project will call for the completion of the following maps, charts, studies and reports:
 - 1. Preparation of a base map, at a scale of 1 inch equals 400 feet, of the City and those areas adjacent to the City tending toward urban growth.
 - 2. Preparation of studies of present and potential trends in the growth and distribution of population, industry and commerce in Newberg and the surrounding area likely to be affected by urban growth.
 - 3. Assembly of land use data for the City and those areas adjacent to the City tending toward urban growth.
 - 4. Preparation of preliminary plans for major arterials.
 - 5. Preliminary investigation of the need for zoning regulations and subdivision control.
- B. These studies will be initial parts of an over-all basic planning study of the City and surrounding area. The over-all plan will include land use, arterials, public buildings, schools, parks and recreation, study of the need for utility extensions, and the preparation of drafts of such regulations as zoning ordinances, subdivision control, building and housing codes, and a long-range capital improvement program.
- C. These steps toward a master plan will be an important tool for the City's use in preserving community values and preventing conditions leading to urban blight.
- D. The City has a base map, at a scale of 1 inch equals 400 feet, which needs substantial revision. Maps of the area surrounding the City are in individual sheets and will have to be redrawn. The City has no zoning ordinance or subdivision control.
- E. Planning work contemplated in this first project will be a part of an over-all long-range plan. Long-range plans will be made for necessary facilities in accordance with the over-all needs of the City and surrounding areas and will lead to a capital improvement program for the community.
