Gentlemen:

Replying to your letter of January 2, 1957, concerning the existing highway bridge crossing Willamette River at Newberg, Oregon, you are advised that transfer of such structures after construction can be accomplished by the original owner notifying this office that title is being transferred, and the new owner submitting a letter advising of the acceptance of the transfer and acknowledging full responsibility for the structure.

In reference to the question of removal of the steel superstructure and leaving the piers in the waterway, no objection is now foreseen to such action. The two main piers are at or near the low water line and extend above extreme high water, so would be visible at all times and should present no particular hazard to navigation. The removal of the steel superstructure would improve conditions for navigation in providing unlimited vertical clearance for the full width between the piers.

However, this office does not favor dropping the steel superstructure into the waterway, principally because of the probability of unexpected delays in its removal. Due to the type of construction, it is believed it can be economically removed by other means.

As stated above, no reason is found at this time to require the removal of the piers when the steel superstructure is removed. However, this office cannot accept responsibility for their removal in the event the future finds them to be hazardous to navigation because

of increasing traffic or for other reasons. In this event the City of Newberg, or any legal owner of the structure, would be required to remove the piers.

The City also desires to know if the steel superstructure might be dropped into the river and removed therefrom, provided no extended unreasonable interference with navigation would occur thereby.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 15 day of February, 195%, by and between the STATE OF OREGON, by and through its State Highway Commission, hereinafter called "State", and MARION and YAMHILL COUNTIES, political subdivisions of the State of Oregon, by and through their County Courts, hereinafter called "Counties", and the CITY OF NEWBERG, a municipal corporation, acting by and through its City Officials, hereinafter called "City";

WITNESSETH:

RECITALS:

- l. Under the provisions of ORS 366.300, whenever the State Highway Commission relocates or realigns a state highway or a section thereof and by reason of such relocation or realignment there is eliminated from the original route of the highway a section or sections thereof, if the eliminated section is needed for service of persons living thereon or a community served thereby, State and County or Counties may enter into an agreement on the terms and conditions of which the said eliminated section shall be maintained for the service of persons living thereon or community served thereby.
- 2. State has relocated and shall place under contract for construction a section of the Hillsboro-Silverton Secondary Highway No. 140 known as the Newberg-Gerin Corner Section, Marion and Yamhill Counties, the Northerly terminus of which is at Highway Engineer's Survey Station 0+00 and Southerly terminus of which is at Highway Engineer's Survey Station 231+00 on the relocated highway.
- 3. By the authority granted in ORS 373.010, State is empowered to alter or change highway routes on city streets when such route change will better serve the motoring public.
- 4. By the authority granted in ORS 271.330, State is empowered to relinquish title to any of its property not needed for highway purposes to any other political subdivision within the State, provided such property shall be used and continue to be used for public purposes.
- 5. Construction of the proposed relocated section of the said highway shall make possible the elimination of certain portions of the old route of said highway from the state highway system, as shown on the map attached hereto, marked Exhibit "A", and by this reference made a part hereof. The said portions to be eliminated are herein designated Units "A", "B" and "C" and described as follows:

Unit "A"

All the land situated within the right of way boundaries of the Hillsboro-Silverton Secondary Highway as formerly routed, beginning at the intersection of said highway as formerly routed and the Pacific Highway West in the City of Newberg; thence southerly, easterly, and southeasterly via said Hillsboro-Silverton Secondary Highway as formerly routed to the southerly city boundary of the City of Newberg.

Unit "B"

All the land situated within the right of way boundaries of the Hillsboro-Silverton Secondary Highway as formerly routed, beginning on said highway as formerly routed at the southerly city boundary of the City of Newberg; thence southerly via said highway as formerly routed to the mean high-water line on the northeasterly bank of the Willamette River in Section 29, Township 3 South, Range 2 West, W.M.

Unit "C"

All the land situated within the right of way boundaries of the Hillsboro-Silverton Secondary Highway as formerly routed, beginning at the mean high-water line on the south-westerly bank of the Willamette River in Section 29, Township 3 South, Range 2 West, W.M.; thence southerly and southeasterly via said highway as formerly routed to the westerly right of way line opposite highway engineer's survey station 179+18.18 in the northwest quarter (NW\frac{1}{4}), Section 4, Township 4 South, Range 2 West, W.M.

- 6. It is the purpose and plan of the parties hereto that all the right, title and interest which State has and the right of way of the eliminated sections shall thereupon be relinquished by State and shall pass to and vest in City and Counties as hereinafter more fully set forth, and that jurisdiction and control over Unit "A" as shown colored in blue on said Exhibit "A" shall revert to and vest in City and shall be maintained by City as part of the city street system, and that Units "B" and "C" as shown colored in red on the said exhibit shall revert to the Counties and shall be maintained under the jurisdiction and control of the Counties as part of the county road systems as long as needed to serve persons living thereon or communities served thereby.
- 7. The construction of the relocated highway shall also make possible the elimination of the existing Willamette River Bridge, said bridge being located in Sec. 29, T. 3 S., R. 2 W., W.M., and known as State Highway Bridge No. 1326. City being desirous of using said bridge for the support of its existing water mains to traverse the Willamette River, State and Counties agree and are willing to relinquish all their right, title and interest in and to said bridge to City for City's use.

NOW, THEREFORE, the premises being in general as stated in the foregoing recitals it is agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:



THINGS TO BE DONE BY STATE:

- l. After the Newberg-Gerin Corner Section has been completed and opened to travel, State, by resolution, shall formally eliminate Units "A", "B" and "C", as described hereinbefore, as parts of the Hillsboro-Silverton Highway and the state highway system; all right, title, and interest which State has in the right of way of Unit "A" shall thereupon be relinquished by State and shall pass to and vest in City; and all the right, title, and interest which State has in Unit "B" shall be relinquished by State and shall pass to and vest in Yamhill County, and all the right, title, and interest which State has in Unit "C" shall be relinquished by State and pass to and vest in Marion County.
- 2. State shall place Units "A", "B", and "C" in serviceable condition before they are relinquished and eliminated from the State Highway System and turned over to the City and Counties.
- 3. State shall retain that portion of the right of way of the former Newberg-Gerin Corner Section of the Hillsboro-Silverton Highway and that real property acquired by State for highway right of way and other public purposes which is shown colored in green on Exhibit "A" attached hereto.
- 4. State shall relinquish to City all its right, title and interest in the existing Willamette River Bridge, it not being required for future state highway purposes, and shall adopt a resolution confirming said transfer, and shall further cooperate with City and Counties for City to obtain a War Department permit covering the use of said bridge by City.
- 5. State shall remove the south approach to the aforementioned Willamette River Bridge and shall erect a permanent barricade on the south bank of the river within the right of way.

THINGS TO BE DONE BY YAMHILL COUNTY:

- l. Yamhill County shall accept all right, title, and interest of State in Unit "B" for the purpose of maintaining it as a county road as long as needed for the service of persons living thereon or communities served thereby.
- 2. Yamhill County agrees to relinquish and by this agreement does relinquish all its right, title and interest in and to the existing Willamette River Bridge, described above, to City and to cooperate with City that City may obtain a permit from the War Department covering the use of said bridge by City.

THINGS TO BE DONE BY MARION COUNTY:

1. Marion County shall accept all right, title, and interest of State in Unit "C" for the purpose of maintaining it as a county road as long as needed for the service of persons living thereon or communities served thereby.


2. Marion County agrees to relinquish and by this agreement does relinquish all its right, title and interest in and to the existing Willamette River Bridge, described above to City, and to cooperate with City that City may obtain a permit from the War Department covering the use of said bridge by City.

THINGS TO BE DONE BY THE CITY OF NEWBERG:

- l. City shall accept all right, title and interest of State in Unit "A" for the purpose of maintaining it as a city street.
- 2. City accepts the interests of State and Counties in and to the existing Willamette River Bridge in Section 29, Township 3 South, Range 2 West, W.M., and shall maintain said structure for the sole purpose of carrying the City's water pipe line over said structure, and City accepts all responsibilities of such ownership, and agrees that State and Counties are relieved of any and all liabilities, obligations and responsibilities in connection with the use and ownership of said bridge by City.
- 3. City shall erect and maintain at City's expense a permanent barricade on the north approach to said bridge for the purpose of preventing vehicular, pedestrian, or any other traffic on said structure, except that City shall permit its employes and equipment to use the structure to maintain City's water pipe line.
- 4. City shall officially advise the District Engineer, U. S. Engineering Department that City accepts the transfer of the aforedescribed bridge and all responsibilities that attach to such use and ownership, and that State and Counties are relieved of any and all responsibilities or obligations connected with said bridge, including but not limited to its use and ownership by City.
- 5. That City shall obtain and accept the responsibility for obtaining any permits from the Federal Government as may be required for the maintenance of said bridge over the Willamette River, as well as any easements from private property owners necessary for the continued use and maintenance of said Bridge.

Dear Mayor Hester:

The League of Oregon Cities in common with other agencies has been faced with increasing costs during the past few years and at the same time the demand for League services continues to increase. The League executive committee has been considering this problem for some time and after reviewing the financial situation voted to increase dues from four cents per capita to five cents per capita beginning with the next fiscal year.

This letter is written to advise you of this increase and to ask that your city make provision for the increased amount in the budget which you will soon be preparing. Since League dues are based on the same population estimates which are used for the allocation of state highway and liquor revenues it will not be possible to send you an exact statement until after the 1957 population estimates of the State Census Board are announced on April 15. However, each city will be able to approximate the amount of dues in preparing its budget.

It has been apparent for several years that increased costs would make some increase in the League dues necessary in order to avoid curtailment of services but a small surplus had been accumulated and it was decided to utilize this before increasing dues. The League budgets of the last few years have been in excess of the annual income and the surplus has been exhausted.

The services of the League are now so well known that it hardly seems necessary to explain or justify them. The League has represented the cities effectively in legislative matters and has obtained various benefits including state revenue allocations. When the dues schedule of four cents per capita was adopted by the League executive committee in 1947, cities were receiving \$4.28 per capita from state highway revenues and 51 cents from liquor revenue allocations. These allocations have increased to \$6.52 per capita and approximately 90 cents, respectively, for the current fiscal year. These are very tangible benefits received by every city and the League executive and legislative committees have been working on the revenue problem further during the past year and recognize the need for further property tax relief.

Requests for information and assistance from city officials have continued to increase and the League has proven an effective agency for the exchange of information and for assistance in the solution of common problems.

We will appreciate your cooperation in providing dues at the new schedule. It is important to every city in the state that the League continue an active program.

It is the desire of the Cub Scouts, Pack 520, of Newberg to sponsor and further expand the soap box racing program in conjunction with the Newberg Berrians Festival.

The agenda to do this includes plans for a movable portable ramp to enable the Cubs to race more often and allow time for expiermentation with each racer. The funds to defray the costs of building this ramp have been partially pledged and further funds are forthcoming. The labor to build the ramp has been donated by several persons.

Storage parking place for this type of ramp when not in use has been provided to the extent, that the city engineer has said that he could find room for it on the pipe storage area with the consent of this council.

We respectfully submit this matter to this council and urge their acceptance of it, as another phase of the Scout movement in Newberg.

Dear Dr. Hester:

A short time ago the State Highway Department made a test run over the Hillsboro-Silverton Highway, testing the highway for the safe operation of large truck-trailer and semitrailer combinations. It was found that at the intersection of College and Fourth Streets, in the city of Newberg, trucks could not negotiate the right turn from east to north without encroaching upon the opposing lane of traffic.

It is the desire of the State Highway Department to alleviate this situation so that permits for the movement of this type of vehicle may be granted. This may be accomplished through cutting back the curbs in the northeast quadrant of the intersection and prohibition of parking as shown upon the attached sketch. If the City of Newberg will enact an ordinance prohibiting parking, as shown on the attached sketch, the State Highway Department will take care of the cutback and the installation of the necessary signs.

Will you please advise me of the reaction of the City Officials to this proposal.

In accordance with our discussion of May 1, I have checked the matter of fire protection service for the Spaulding Pump and Paper Co. plant and advise you as follows:

For capacity of 1,000 g.p.m. through a 6" pipe line, the velocity would be about 12 feet per second and the loss of head about 15 lbs. in 1,000 feet of main. An 8" line carrying the same flow would have a velocity of about $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet per second and a loss in head of about 11 lbs. per thousand feet.

A Hersey Detector Meter with compound bypass would measure both low flows and the fire flow of 1,000 g.p.m. with a reasonable head loss, and I would recommend such a meter for the installation. Whether or not an 8" connection to the meter from your 12" main and an 8" line on the private property from the meter installation should depend upon the importance of pressure drop to the Paper Co.

If you have any further questions regarding this matter, please let us know.






