January 7, 1957 Honorable Homer Hester Mayor of the City of Newberg Newberg, Oregon Dear Sir: Re: Dog Control In the Spring and early Summer of 1956 the above matter was under consideration by the Council and the undersigned was instructed to secure information regarding possible additional measures which might be taken by the City of Newberg. Some information and forms of ordinances used in other Cities in Oregon, was obtained and considered but no action was taken. As the ordinances could not be kept any longer they have been returned to the League of Oregon Cities. The matter will undoubtedly come up again in the Spring of the year and recently the Honorable R. E. Renne, County Judge of Yarhill County, contacted the undersigned and asked me to ask the Council to consider the question of taking over dog control within the City limits. He stated that the County felt that their budget and facilities were inadequate to take care of the matter within the corporate limits of the various cities throughout Yamaill County. In order that the Council may be advised as to the present law and the courses open to them, I submit the following analysis of the applicable Statutes: Under the present law every person owning or keeping a dog over 8 months of age must not later than March 1st each year or within thirty days after he acquires the dog, secure a license from the County Clerk. The amount paid is determined by the County Court but must not be greater than \$ 2.00 for each male or spayed female and \$3.00 for each female. The County Court is permitted to assess a penalty of \$2.00 additional for failing to secure the license in time. The County Clerk is required to supply a suitable metal tag which must be attached to the dog collar and kept on the dog when he is not in the immediate possession of his owner or keeper. NOTE: This rule has not been enforced in Yamhill County. However, the League of Ore. Cities feels that this is the only County of which they are aware, where such enforcement is not required. The foregoing license is the only license which can be required and no City under 100,000 population can impose an additional fee. ORS 609.100.

Any incorporated city having less than 100,000 population may apply to the County Court and agree to diligently enforce license collections within the City. In that case the County Court is required to enter into an agreement with the City directing that the City Council appoint a certain person to be a deputy dog control official within the city limits and pay for his services. The deputy thereupon has the authority and is charged with the duty of enforcing the dog license statute referred to within the city limits. While the agreement is in effect, the County must pay the City 80 per cent of any license fees received for dogskept within the city. These are payable by the County to the city on the first of each month. The County Clerk may set up an agency for the sale of dog licenses within the city. Residence of the owner determines where the dog is kept for the purpose of dividing up the license fees with the city. The city may adopt an ordinance providing for a penalty for failure to purchase a license for dogs in accordance with the foregoing. ORS 609.120.

If the City agreed to enforce the statute regarding dog licensing it must compensate the deputy charged with the duty of enforcing the law. The only bulletin on the subject from the League of Oregon Cities is dated June, 1944, and is probably out of date. Using it as a guide I find that one city pays the deputy 50 per cent of the license feek share and another pays 90 per cent and another pays 50 cents per day, another \$40 per month, arother \$25 per month, another pays a fee for each dog captured and another about \$200 for six weeks work during the summer only.

The same bulletin of 1944 states that the cities between one and five thousand population received an average of \$193 in the 1942-43 fiscal year from dog license sharing.

Largest amount was received by Burns, \$378. It should be noted that these figures are over ten years old.

If the City undertakes to enforce the licensing law it will be necessary to provide a pound of some kind to keep the dogs which are picked up without licenses. The bulletin states that dogs are held from three-to-five days before being killed and that the owner must buy a license and in some cities an additional charge for board for the dog and a redemption fee of one-to-five dollars. The same 1944 bulletin states that Tillamook provides a pound in the basement of the City Hall and in Seaside, in the City barns. Dallas provided three kennels and charges a redemption fee of \$2.00. Hillsboro charged \$1.00 for the first offense, \$2.00 subsequently. Cottage Grove charged \$2.50 redemption fee and

costs of keeping the dog. Seaside charged \$1.00 per day first offense, \$2.00 per day second offense and \$1.00 per day for keeping dog as well. Silverton charged \$2.00 first offense and \$4.00 thereafter. Silverton provides a kennel and an enclosure, St. Helens a building and pen.

The 1944 bulletin contains a suggested form for the agreement with the County on the 80 per cent basis. There is also a suggested form of Ordinance covering the matter of nuisances, running at large, licensing, pound regulations and penalty. This form requires that the dogs be held ten days.

It might be well to investigate this matter early in the season allowing the appropriate committee sufficient time to decide on the details they wish included in the Ordinance. The Ordinance could then be enacted in sufficient time to allow publicity so that the public will be aware of its provisions before it goes into effect. In this way the spring pardoning season would also enter into the consideration of the matter.

I will await your instructions.
