NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the City of Newberg,
Yamhill County, Oregon, at a regular meeting to be held on Monday, May
4, 1953, at 7:30 o'clock p.m. Pacific Standard Time, in the Council
Chambers in the City Hall of said City, will receive and consider bids
for furnishing the City with one police automobile for the use of the
Police Department of said City. Specifications for said vehicle and said
bid are as follows:

1 - 1953 Model Tudor sedan automobile for the use of the Police Department of the City of Newberg, Oregon, Vehicle must have 6-cylinder engine and automatic transmission and a minimum horse power of 115. Vehicle must be equipped with a good quality heater satisfactory to the Chief of Police of said City. Vehicle color must be black and wheel base at least 115 inches. City of Newberg will trade in the present police automobile to the successful bidder and the value thereof shall be applied on the purchase price of the new vehicle. Bidder must state the value at which he will accept the present police automobile. New police automobile to be furnished with standard equipment except as herein specified. Delivery to be made in June, 1953, and payment will be made by the City in July, 1953. New vehicle must be equipped with first quality tires and spare satisfactory to said Chief of Police and having 4-ply construction in a size of 6.50-15. Bidder will be required to transfer oil filter and siren from present police automobile and install same in new vehicle. Before the present police automobile is traded in, all radio and other police equipment, including but not confined to, oil filter, public address system and siren will be removed and will not go with the whicle. Radio and public address system will be removed by the Police Department.

All bids must be in writing and must be filed with said Recorder on or before 7:30 o'clock p.m. Pacific Standard Time on Monday, May 4, 1953. Bids will be opened and considered by the Council at said regular meeting to be held immediately thereafter. The City of Newberg reserves the right to postpone making the award for a reasonable length of time and to reject any and all bids and to accept the proposal deemed best for the City.



This contrast shall not be assigned by Buyer, or by operation of law, without Seller's prior written consent. This contract contains the entire agreement between the parties, there being no oral promises, representations or warranties affecting it. Subject to the provisions of this Article, this contract shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective legal representatives, successors and assigns. This contract or any modification thereof shall not be binding upon Seller until signed on its behalf by its proper manager. Re: Model Traffic Ordinance

Some time ago I was instructed to investigate the matter of a model traffic ordinance for Newberg, particularly designed to provide for changes in the State Traffic Code. It was proposed that the State Code be adopted by reference and that, if possible, future amendments in the State Code be also adopted in advance in order to keep the ordinance permanently in line.

Since that time the Chief of Police and myself have examined the Salem Traffic Ordinance of 1939 and the model traffic ordinance prepared by the League of Oregon Cities in 1942. There is no question but that the present Newberg Traffic Code is outmoded and should be replaced. It was prepared approximately 15 years ago by extracting all appropriate matters from the State Code then in force and copying them verbatim. The resulting rigidity is not only undesirable but actually conflicts with the state law providing that local regulations must be in harmony with the State Code.

I am of the opinion that it is possible to adopt the appropriate statutes by reference although I think this should be kept clear by itemizing the sections and giving their State Code number in each case. In this way, it would be possible to select only those which were appropriate.

I am also of the opinion that it is possible to so draft the ordinance as to include therein subsequent amendments to the statutes as they existed at time of adoption by reference. It is necessary for this purpose that the intention of the Council be clearly expressed in the language of the ordinance.

A further suggestion which would make it possible to simplify the present complicated ordinances regarding parking areas and stop streets would be to provide that all parking restrictions, stop streets, etc., should be set up by resolution of the Council based upon recommendations of the Police Committee. This would avoid the complicated procedure of passing and continually amending an ordinance each time changes are made in such matters.

Finally, I feel that there is some objection to making these changes at the present time for the reason that the

legislature now in session has made a complete change in the Oregon Code effective December 31, 1953. Therefore, I think the Council should wait until the new code is in force and then apply the principle of adoption by reference and automatic amendment to the State Traffic Code as it then exists.

0/15/53 October 15, 1953 TO THE HONORABLE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF CITY OF NEWBERG Gentlemen: Re: Liability for Sidewalk Accidents. The above matter had been brought to my attention recently because of an accident in which a local lady injured her arm in a fall on one of the city sidewalks. It is also important to note that the Supreme Court of this state recently decided the case of Olson vs Chuck et al 56 Adv. sheets 1265, opinion rendered July 8, 1958, in which the court construed the provisions of the Fortland Charter and Ordinances relative to sidewalk repairs and owners liability. It should be noted that the Portland Charter contains a provision exempting the city from liability as does the Newberg Charter. The present Newberg Ordinance is number 929(18-109) passed and approved July 2, 1940. This Ordinance contains the following pertinent sections: Section 23. POWER OF COUNCIL. The city council. may provide adequate means for the cleaning and repairing of streets, sidewalks, gutters, sewers and drains and cause such work to be performed as need arises. Such costs to be assessed against the property owner holding the property adjacent to the street or sidewalk on which said cleaning or repairing was performed. The property owner to be noti-fied of the cost of said work within ten days of its completion and given ten days in which to appear before the council and protest such assessment. Upon failure of the owner to protest such assessment or pay same, said assessment shall become a lien upon said property. Section 24. OWNER. All owners of land within the city limits shall keep in repair all sidewalks constructed or existing in front of, along, or abutting upon their respective lots. Section 25. NOTICE. The marshal shall cause a notice to be served upon the owner or reputed owner of the adjacent or contiguous lots having defective sidewalks; or if the owner or reputed owner be absent from the city or unknown, service shall be made by posting a copy of such notice upon the premises affected by the proposed improvement which shall be equivalent to personal Page 1

service. Said notice shall be served by the marshal or his duly authorized agent, and a return of such service endorsed by him on the original thereof. Said owner shall within thirty days after such service, construct or repair the sidewalk in front of and adjacent to his property. Said notice shall give the location of the property, the beginning and terminus of the sidewalk to be repaired, the materials to be used in repairing, the penalty for failure to repair, with such additional information as may be necessary.

Section 26. OWNER'S LIABILITY. All owners of property within the city limits of the city of Newberg failing to repair defective sidewalks along and adjacent to their property shall be liable for all damages to whomsoever resulting or arising through their fault or negligence in failing to construct or put such sidewalk in repair.

The remainder of the above-quoted Ordinance provides in detail for the type and nature of sidewalks which may be constructed including specifications and other detail requirements. Furthermore, the construction, or repair of sidewalks by the city under local assessments, is governed by the provisions of Ordinance No. 1111(4-102) passed November 5, 1951.

The following suggestins for amendments to Ordinance No. 929 are submitted:

Section 23 should be combined with section 25 so as to provide for appropriate notice to owners giving them an opportunity to repair sidewalks and thereafter providing for repair by the city creating a lien on the abutting property. The provisions of section 5-309, 5-310, and 5-311 of the Public Works Code of the city of Portland as cited in Olson vs Chuck, supra, could be used with some alteration to cover this phase of the matter. These sections have now been construed by the Oregon Supreme Count.

Section 24 of Ordinance No. 939 could well be broadened to require that the abutting owner "construct, reconstruct, and maintain in good repair" the sidewalks adjacent to his land.

This would be in accordance 5-309 of the Portland Code, supra.

Section 26 could be related to section 44 of the Newberg, Sity Charter regarding non-liability in accordance with section 5-313 of the Portland Code and there could be added to this section a direct statement that failure by the city to give notice of a need for sidewalk repairs should not constitute a defense in case of injury and litigation. This would be in line with the decision in Olson vs Chuck, suppa.

It should be stated that the provisions of this Ordinance are not intended to replace the provisions of Ordinance No. Illl supra and are intended to provide an alternative method. Furtheremore, Ordinance No. Illl may be referred to regarding collection and foreclosure.

It is myopinion that changes along these lines would be advisable but should be discussed with a representive of our liability insurer before enactment.

PROPOSAL FOR CONSIDERATION OF OREGON COACHES ASSOCIATION November 28, 1953

Competitive athletics for elementary school students is of immediate and pressing concern to school administrators and all others who are genuinely interested in the welfare of children of this age. Commercial sponsors are now exploiting thousands of children using high pressure methods. This is made possible, in part, by the failure of many schools to provide adequate programs in physical education, intramurals, and athletics.

The Gregon Coaches Association believes that a sound program of physical education and intramural competition is necessary to give all students an opportunity to participate in wholesome sports. It further believes that a sensible and well supervised program of inter-school competition provides values which are not easily derived from intra-mural sports. Such an athletic program is a challenge to the gifted student and he will develop accordingly.

The Oregon Coaches Association wishes to go on record as favoring the following:

- a. The State Department of Education is requested to consult with the Oregon Association of School Administrators, the Oregon Association for Health, Physical Education, and Recreation, and the Oregon Coaches Association for the purpose of formulating basic principles and administrative policy governing the conduct of competitive athletics in the elementary schools of Oregon.
- b. The State Department of Education shall supervise and control elementary school athletics in Oregon according to the policies agreed upon.

The Oregon Coaches Association submits the following suggestions for consideration in formulating principles and policies governing competitive athletics in the elementary schools of Oregon:

- 1. No student shall be allowed to compete without a physical examination by a physician.
- 2. At least 3 weeks of practice and conditioning should precede t the first game in any sport.
- 3. There shall be a definite rest period of two weeks between sport seasons during which there shall be no practice or games.
- 4. No team shall play more than one game a week except for one basketball tournament.
- 5. No grade school team shall compete in more than one basketball tournament during a year. In such a tournament, no team shall play on consecutive days, and no team shall play more than 3 games in the tournament.
- 6. The number of contests in each sport shall be limited as follows:

Football 6
Baskstball 13 if a tournament is played, otherwise 12
Baseball 8

Track Meets 6 (Any combination of baseball and track not to exceed 8 total contests)

7. Playing time and rest periods should be as follows:

Football 7th and 8th grades - 8 minute quarters, 10 min. between halves 6th grade - 6 minute quarters, 10 min. between halves.

Basketball - - 6 minute quarters, 10 minutes between halves.

Baseball - 7th-8th grades, 7 innings maximum 6th grade, 5 innings maximum

Track - - All distances reduced. 8th grade, maximum 660 yards. 6th, 7th grades, maximum 330 yards.

- 8. Travel distances should be limited to the immediate vicinity of the community.
- 9. School districts which are large enough should operate a self-contained program rather than scheduling outside schools.
- 10. Championships should be of a local nature only. There should be no district or state championships, "Little Bowl" games, or contests of like nature.
- 11. Coaches shall be qualified and should be certified teachers employed by the school district in which they coach.
- 12. Games shall be refereed by competent officials.
- 13. Equipment should be adequate for the protection and safety of players.
- 14. Practice sessions should be limited to onehour for 6th grade students and 12 hours for 7th and 8th grade students.
- 15. Practices should be conducted in the afternoon, and all possible games should be scheduled in the afternoon. (After school)
- 16. Games should be scheduled so as to interfere as little as possible with school time.
- 17. Publicity should be of a team nature only with a minimum of emphasis on individual performance.
- 18. Sponsorship of teams should be by the school administration only.

 No outside organization or commercial interest should influence on
 control the administration of the athletic program. (Gifts of uniforms,
 equipment, etc. should have no strings attached which might influence
 the conduct of the program. Such gifts are not inherently harmful.)
- 19. There should be no girls' competitive athletics. Play days and invitational games where social values are emphasized should be encouraged.

Gentlemen:

This letter is to advise you on several matters on which I am told you would like specific information regarding insurance.

- No.1 Any fire insurance or liability insurance which you now have or may need can be written through this agency with any one of several different companies. The policies would either be in mutual or in stock companies as you wish, for the fire insurance. Two of my casualty companies have specifically stated that they would write the present liability insurance at the present rates and premiums you are now paying.
- No.2 I live in Newberg and pay property taxes in Newberg. This property is at 512 S. Howard Street. I also have an office in Newberg, on First street and have had continuously since May 15, 1944.
- No.3 I am, and have been for about seven years a member of the Oregon Association of Insurance Agents. There are four members of this association in Newberg who have voluntarily joined it in the interests of better standards of performance in the insurance business. Agents writing insurance as a sideline usually do not join.
- No. 4 It is my belief that the insurance business of the City of Newberg should be placed by the Council through a committee of citizens and tax payers who are in the general insurance business, who maintain offices where they can serve their clients, who have been in this position for at least five years, and who have been members of the Oregon Association of Insurance agents for several years, and that they should share in the benefits and responsibilities of placing this business on terms which they agree to amongst themselves. Such a committee of such agents should be considered by the Council as competent to handle their insurance business and should be responsible to it and serve at its pleasure. For the Council to continue to do business exclusively with one agent when this other method is available to them is obviously unfair, and your own interest in this subject at this time clearly demonstrates most of you feel the same.

Gentlemen:

Apparently the question has been raised by someone in the Council as to the ability of the agents in the town writing coverage and the extent to which the agent could participate.

For my agency, I wish to state that I have twelve companies, of which at least eight could probably write on risks that have a limit of from \$500,000.00 to three million, and I hardly think that the assets of the city will equal those amounts. So far as casualty is concerned, I might mention that I have the Firemen's Fund, the Glens Falls, the Globe Indemnity and the Maryland Casualty. I have accepted risks in the past and have some at the present time that run somewhere around \$600,000.00, and presumably you won't have anything equal to that amount that has to be covered. So I feel that my agency can handle any business that may be submitted for insurance.

Consistent with the time that the agents have been in business in the city, I believe that the business should be distributed equitably, as they are all interested in the welfare of the city, and presumably most of them are paying taxes here.

STANDARD FRANCHISE AGREEMENT - ORDINANCE NO. // 43 An ordinance granting Portland General Electric Company, an Oregon corporation, its successors and assigns, for a period of twenty years from and after the effective date of this ordinance, the right and privilege to erect, construct, maintain and operate within the corporate limits of the City of Newberg, Oregon, as such limits now exist or may be hereafter constituted, an electric light and power system with the poles, wires, fixtures, underground circuits and equipment

necessary or convenient to supply said City and the inhabitants thereof and others with electric energy for light, power and other purposes, upon, over, along, under and across the streets, alleys, roads and other public ways and places within the corporate limits of said City, fixing the terms and conditions thereof, and providing for the manner of determination of the effective date thereof.

XIIX XIS XORDAGANED XBYX XIHE XCOMMON XCOUNG KIX XOR XIMEX CXIXIX ON The City of Newberg Ordains as Follows:

Section 1. That Portland General Electric Company, an Oregon corporation, hereinafter sometimes referred to as the "Company," is hereby granted, subject to the terms and conditions hereof, the franchise right and privilege to erect, construct, maintain and operate an electric light and power system within the corporate limits of the City of Newberg , herein sometimes referred to as the "City," as the same now exist, or may be hereafter constituted, and the franchise right and privilege to erect, construct, maintain and operate poles, wires, fixtures, equipment, underground circuits and other property necessary or convenient to supplying the City and the inhabitants thereof and other persons and territory with electric energy for light, power and other purposes, upon, over, along, under and across the streets, alleys, roads and other public ways and places within the corporate limits of the City as the same now are or may be hereafter constituted.

All poles, wires, fixtures, equipment, underground circuits and other property owned or in possession of the Company now located within the corporate limits of the City shall be deemed to be covered by the terms of this ordinance and to be located in accordance therewith, and the location and placement thereof is hereby approved.

Section 2. That all rights and privileges hereby granted

41 shall be effective as of January 1, 1954 and shall terminate at the expiration of twenty years from said date, except that in the event the Company shall fail, neglect or refuse for thirty (30) days after demand in writing by the City to perform any or all of the obligations or requirements set forth in this ordinance to be performed by the Company, then the rights and privileges herein granted may be terminated and annulled by the Common Council or other legislative body of the City, and the Company shall forfeit all rights and privileges hereby granted. Section 3. That the Company shall, if requested so to do, file with the City Engineer, or other City official designated by the City, maps or sketches showing any proposed construction work to be done by the Company within the corporate limits of the City, and such construction work shall be done in a reasonably safe manner subject to the approval of the official designated by the Council of the City and in accordance with requirements of applicable State laws and City ordinances. Section 4. That the Company, under the direction of the City or its properly constituted authorities, may make all necessary excavations in any street, alley, road or other public way or place for the purpose of erecting, constructing, repairing, maintaining, removing and relocating poles and other supports for its wires, conductors, lights or street lights; and laying, repairing and maintaining its underground conduits and pipes; and for placing, maintaining and operating its wires and conductors. All poles of the Company shall be erected at the outside edge of the sidewalk unless otherwise directed by the proper City authorities. Section 5. That when any excavation shall be made pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance, the Company shall restore the portion of the street, alley, road or public way or place to the same condition to which it was prior to the excavation thereof, and all work shall be done in strict compliance with the rules, regulations, ordinances - 2 -

or orders which may be adopted from time to time during the continuance of this franchise by the Common Council of the City or as may be otherwise provided by law. Section 6. That the City, by its properly constituted authorities, shall have the right to cause the Company to move the location of any pole whenever the relocation thereof shall be for public necessity, and the expense thereof shall be paid by the Company. Section 7. That nothing in this ordinance shall be construed as in any way to prevent the City from sewering, grading, paving, planking, repairing, widening, altering or doing any work that may be desirable on any of the streets, alleys, roads or public ways or places; but all such work shall be done, if possible, in such manner as not to obstruct, injure or prevent free use and operation of the said electric light and power system of the Company. Section 8. That whenever it shall be necessary in sewering, grading, or in making any other improvement in any street, alley, road or other public way or place, to remove any pole, underground conduit or equipment belonging to the Company or on which any light, wire or circuit of the Company shall be stretched or fastened, the Company shall, upon ten (10) days' written notice from the City, or its properly constituted authorities, remove such pole, underground conduit, equipment, light, wire or circuit, and if it fails, neglects or refuses so to do, the City, by its properly constituted authorities, may remove the same at the expense of the Company. Section 9. Whenever it becomes necessary to temporarily rearrange, remove, lower or raise the aerial cables or wires or other apparatus of the grantee to permit the passage of any building, machinery or other object, the said grantee will perform such rearrangement on seven (7) days' written notice from the person or persons desiring to move said building, machinery or other objects. Said notice shall bear the approval of such official as the Common Council may designate, shall detail the route of movement of the building, machinery or other objects, shall - 3 -

provide that the costs incurred by the grantee in making such rearrangements of its aerial plant will be borne by the person or persons giving said notice and shall further provide that the person or persons giving said notice will indemnify and save said grantee harmless of and from any and all damages or claims of whatsoever kind or nature caused directly or indirectly from such temporary arrangement of the aerial plant of the grantee, and, if required by grantee, shall be accompanied by a cash deposit or a good and sufficient bond to pay any and all such costs as estimated by grantee. Section 10. That the rights and privileges granted by this ordinance are granted upon the conditions herein contained and also upon the following considerations and conditions to wit: (a) That Portland General Electric Company shall, within thirty (30) days from the effective date of this ordinance, file with the City Recorder its written acceptance of this ordinance, subject to all the terms, obligations, restrictions and provisions of this ordinance, and upon the expiration of the allotted time for the acceptance of this ordinance, the same not having been accepted unconditionally, then this ordinance shall become wholly void, inoperative and of no effect. (b) That in consideration of the rights and privileges herein granted, the Company shall pay to the City a franchise fee for each full calendar year during the life of this franchise beginning with the year 1954 an annual fee of three per cent of the gross revenue as defined herein for the immediately preceding calendar year. Gross revenue as used in this ordinance shall be deemed to - 4

include any revenue earned within the City from the sale of electric energy after adjustment for the net write-off of uncollectible accounts computed on the average annual rate for the entire Company and excluding sales of electric energy to large industrial customers with nominal demands of 3,000 kw or greater and also excluding sales of electric energy sold by the Company to any public utility when the public utility purchasing such electric energy is not the ultimate consumer. A public utility as defined herein is any individual, partnership, cooperative, corporation or government agency buying electric energy and distributing such electric energy to other customers or users. (c) That in consideration of the agreement of the Company to make such payments, the City agrees that no license, tax or charge on the business, occupation or franchise of the Company shall be imposed upon, exacted from or required of the Company by the City during the term of this ordinance, but this provision shall not exempt the property

- or from special assessments of the Company from lawful ad valorem taxes/. for public improvements.
- (d) That on or before the first day of March 1954, and on or before said day of each year thereafter during the term of this franchise, the Company shall file with the City Recorder a statement under oath showing the amount of gross revenue of the Company within the City on the basis outlined in paragraph (b) hereof for the calendar year immediately preceding the year in which the statement is filed. The annual franchise fee for the year in which the statement is filed shall be computed on the gross revenue so reported. Such franchise fee shall be payable annually on or before the first day of April beginning in the year 1954. Upon receipt of such annual payment the City Recorder shall issue his receipt therefor, which shall be full acquittance of the Company for the payment. If controversy arises as to the amount of gross revenue within the meaning of this ordinance, the amount of such gross revenue as determined by the Public Utilities Commissioner of Oregon after examination of the Company's records shall be deemed the correct amount. Any difference of payment due either the City or the Company through error

or otherwise shall be payable within fifteen (15) days of discovery of such error. Should the Company fail or neglect to pay any of said annual payments provided for in this Section for thirty (30) days after any annual payment shall become due and payable and after thirty (30) days' written notice from the City, the City, by its properly constituted authority, may at its option either continue this franchise in force and/or proceed by suit or action to collect said payment or declare a forfeiture of this franchise because of the failure to make such payment but without waiving the right to collect earned franchise payments. (e) That the City reserves the right to cancel this franchise at any time upon one year's written notice to the Company in the event that the City decides to engage in public ownership of light and power facilities and the public distribution of electric energy. (f) That the Company shall permit the City to string wires on poles of the Company for municipal fire, police and water departments, and for municipal telephone, telegraph and traffic signal systems and to attach to the top of any pole city fire alarm and police signals, provided that such wires and signals shall be strung so as to interfere as little as possible with the wires of the Company and to conform to the provisions of the National Electrical Safety Code; and further, that the City shall indemnify and hold the Company harmless from loss or damage resulting from damage to property or injury or death to City employees or the public arising from or connected with the use of said poles by the City. (g) That the Company shall not during the term of this franchise sell, assign, transfer or convey this franchise without the consent of the Common Council of the City expressed by ordinance first obtained, and that upon obtaining such consent all of the provisions shall inure to and bind the successors and assigns of the Company; and whenever the Portland General Electric Company shall be mentioned in this ordinance, it shall be understood to include such successors or assigns in interest of the Portland General Electric Company as shall - 6 -

have been so consented to by the Common Council. (h) That the Company shall render the service hereby authorized to be supplied upon equal terms without unjust discrimination or undue preference to any users within the City. Section 11. That the rates to be charged by the Company for electric energy shall be such as may be fixed and/or approved by the Public Utilities Commissioner of Oregon, or any other governmental official, commission or body having jurisdiction. Section 12. That the Company hereby agrees and covenants to indemnify and save harmless the City and the officers thereof against all damages, costs and expenses whatsoever to which it or they may be subjected in consequence of negligence of the Company, or its agents or servants, in any manner arising from the rights and privileges hereby granted. Section 13. That the franchise hereby granted shall not be exclusive and shall not be construed as any limitation on the City to grant rights, privileges and authority to other persons or corporations similar to or different from those herein set forth. Section 14. That all rights, authority and grants herein contained or conferred are also conditioned upon the understanding and agreement that these privileges in the streets, alleys, roads and other public ways and places of the City are not to operate in any way so as to be an enhancement of the Company's properties or values or to be an asset or item of ownership in any appraisal thereof. Section 15. Ordinance No. 935 & 987 is hereby repealed, and upon acceptance by the Company of the franchise herein granted, all rights and obligations arising under Ordinance No. 935 & 987 shall terminate. Section 16. That because it is necessary for the peace, health and safety of the people of the City that an arrangement be made immediately with the Company governing the continued use of public property within the City, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor. - 7 -

A-7 PLANTING OR INTERPLANTING FOREST T REES ON FARM LAND FOR FORESTRY
PURPOSES, WINDBREAKS, SHELTER BELTS, AND FOR EROSION CONTROL

COMDITIONS:

- 1. A qualified forester must set up specifications for each farm.
- 2. Plantings must be protected from fire and grazing.
- 3. No Federal cost-sharing will be allowed for planting orchard trees, or for plantings for ornamental purposes.
- 4. Federal cost-sharing may be authorized for clearing land occupied largely by scrubby brush of no economic value to permit planting of desirable tree species. Clearing by bulldozing, spraying, burning, or hand grubbing, alone or in combination, may be approved. Clearing shall be limited to areas where the slope does not exceed 50%. Necessary erosion preventive measures must be carried out.
- 5. Federal cost-sharing for fencing shall be limited to permanent fences meeting the following specifications:

Posts shall be of standard size and of steel or other durable material, that is either naturally decay resistant, or treated by an approved process. Posts shall be spaced not more than 20 feet apart. Rock jack, figure four and stay construction may be used where it is impracticable to set posts, and spacing shall conform to standards established for the area.

Barbed wire shall be new and not less than 12 gauge material. No fence will qualify with less than three strands of new barbed wire.

Woven wire will qualify when at least one strand of barbed wire is placed above, and the county committee may require additional strands where necessary.

Boundary and road fences and the repair, replacement, or maintenance of existing fences are excluded. Domestic animals must be excluded from the fenced area.

FEDERAL COST -SHARE:

- (1) Trees and planting \$15.00 per acre.
- (2) Land clearing \$10.00 per acre.
- (3) Fencing materials
 - (a) 75 cents per rod of barbed wire fence
 - (b) \$1.10 per rod of woven wire fence.
