THAT WHEREAS the party of the first part owns, maintains and operates a police radio station and allied units under license from the Federal Communications Commission; and

WHEREAS the party of the second part owns and proposes to operate a mobile transmitting and receiving police radio unit and further proposes to apply for a license from said Federal Communications Commission; and

WHEREAS it is desirable that the party of the second part should operate said mobile unit temporarily in connection with the radio units owned by the party of the first part until such time as such license shall be granted to the party of the second part.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, and in further consideration of the sum of \$1.00 paid to the party of the first part, receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

- l. Party of the first part will permit party of the second part to operate its said mobile unit in connection with the units of the party of the first part until such time as party of the second part shall receive a license for its radio unit from the Federal Communications Commission, provided however, that such permission shall not extend beyond a period of six months from and after the date of this agreement.
 - 2. It is further specifically agreed that the party of

the first part shall at all times retain full control of all operations by the radio unit of the party of the second part hereunder and the party of the first part has and does hereby reserve the right to cancel this agreement and/or to cut the radio unit of the party of the second part off the air temporarily or permanently whenever the party of the first part shall see fit to do so.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused their respective Mayors and Recorders to set their hands and affix the corporate seal hereto pursuant to Resolutions of the Common Council in each case, duly adopted, the day and year first hereinabove set forth.

Re: Daylight Saving Time

For the past week the matter of local adoption of daylight saving time has been referred to me from time to time both by members of the Council and other citizens of Newberg. Investigation develops the fact that the City of Portland provided for daylight saving time by vote of the people of Portland last year. The measure being successful by a small margin. Thereafter the recent Oregon legislative assembly passed house bill 454 which was signed by the Governor on April 12, 1949, without an emergency clause and which provides for a uniform standard of time in Oregon subject to variation only by proclamation of the Governor. The bill further provides that the Governor may so proclaim only when all adjoining states are agreed on a similiar program. I am informed that the State of California will not adopt daylight saving time. Geographically speaking, the Governor of Oregon could not issue such proclamation unless the states of Washington, Idaho, Nevada and California were agreeable. The legislation referred to will be effective July 17, 1949. I am informed that the cities of Oregon City, West Linn, Milwaukee and Forrest Grove have followed Portland and that Hillsboro and Beaverton are likely to do so. I have talked with Senator Patterson of Hillsboro and Senator Marsh of McMinnville and Friday I talked with Governor McKay. The Governor feels that he can not issue a proclamation making statewide uniformity possible and therefore when the law becomes effective on July 17, all cities who continue to maintain Daylight Saving Time will be violating State law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 921 OF THE CITY OF NEWBERG, OREGON, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE ORGANIZING AND REGULATING THE FIRE DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF NEWBERG, YAMHILL COUNTY, STATE OF OREGON; PROVIDING FOR THE SELECTION, DUTIES, AND TERMS OF OFFICE OF THE OFFICERS THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR THE PAY OF OFFICERS AND MEMBERS THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR THE REMOVAL AND DISMISSAL OF OFFICERS AND MEMBERS THEREOF; DEFINING CERTAIN OFFENSES: PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ORDINANCE NO. 490 OF THE CITY OF NEWBERG; AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF." PASSED AND APPROVED MARCH 25, 1940, AS AMENDED, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

The people of the city of Newberg do ordain as follows:

Section 1: That Section 14 of Ordinance number 921 of the City of Newberg, Oregon, entitled "An Ordinance organizing and regulating the Fire Department of the City of Newberg, Yamhill County, State of Oregon; providing for the selection, duties, and terms of office of the officers thereof; providing for the pay of officers and members thereof; providing for the removal and dismissal of officers and members thereof; defining certain offenses; providing for the repeal of Ordinance No. 490 of the City of Newberg; and providing penalties for the violation thereof", passed and approved March 25, 1940, be and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows, to-wit:

Section 14: The members of the fire department shall receive pay for their services as such members from the city of Newberg in the following amounts: The chief shall receive the sum of \$25.00 per month; the assistant chief shall receive the sum of \$10.00 per month; all other members shall receive the sum of \$2.50 per month; provided however, that the night fireman shall receive the pay hereinafter provided.

Section 2: That the provisions of this ordinance shall be effective from and after the first day of July, 1949.

Section 3: Whereas it is necessary for the peace, health, and safety of the people of the city of Newberg that this ordinance be immediately effective; now, therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the council and approval by the mayor.

- b. The statement of values shall be submitted in terms of dollars and cents (not percentages) and shall be dated and signed by the insured. If the insured is a company, corporation or association, such statement shall be signed by a responsible officer thereof in his official capacity. It is recommended that values be submitted on this form, which is available from the Oregon Insurance Rating Bureau.
- The value of stock shall be the average value for the past year, except that in the case of seasonal risks or other properties with widely fluctuating amounts of stock, a statement of the value of stock for each of the preceding twelve months will be required. Annual inventory values may be submitted for non-seasonal risks only if such inventory is representative of average conditions maintained throughout the year.
