


DEQ Rule Project Proposal Process



Rulemaking Plan

- Approved rulemaking projects
- Preliminary timelines
- Description of purpose and scope



Rulemaking Process

Time in Months



Initiate

- Research key issues
- Draft policy concepts or draft rules
- Plan advisory committee

Advisory Committee Meeting(s)

- Technical and policy advice
- Review draft rules and Fiscal and Racial Equity Impact Statement

Notice and Comment Period

- Publish notice and proposed rules
- Begin accepting public comment

Public Hearing

- Agency explains proposed rules
- Anyone can attend
- Anyone can submit written or verbal comments

Response to Comment

- DEQ staff reviews, considers and responds to all comments
- DEQ may make adjustments based on public comment

Final Proposal and Action

- DEQ prepares report that summarizes rules, public comment, response to comments
- EQC deliberates and may vote to take action



Delegation of Final Adoption

- EQC is the rulemaking authority for DEQ
- ORS 183.325 provides authority for delegation
- Streamlines process for procedural/administrative actions, saving commission time for more substantive issues
- Criteria:
 - Permanent adoption of temporary rules
 - Limited or no policy discretion for the commission
 - Routine alignment with federal standards and other procedural maneuvers



Proposed Rules for Delegation

Permanent adoption of temporary rules

- Title V fee increase 2023
- Low-NOx delayed effective date and identicality with the California Air Resources Board



Proposed Rules for Delegation (Cont'd)

- 2024 air quality fee adjustment
 - Asbestos abatement and certification fees
 - Cleaner Air Oregon fees
- High hazard rail tank fee 2023
- Air quality rules to address federal regulations 2023
- Noise 2024
