#### CITY MANAGER REPORT

City Manager Weinheimer reported that City facilities were still closed due to COVID-19. The Budget Committee met and discussed distribution of ARPA funds. He and Mayor Rogers toured George Fox University. He was working with translation services for meetings, and public engagement materials. He was committed to improving accessibility and inclusion.

Mayor Rogers noted in 2017 the Council passed a resolution to declare Newberg as an inclusive city. It was still forefront and one of Council's primary goals.

## PUBLIC HEARING - Ordinance 2021-2888

Mayor Rogers opened the public hearing. He called for any abstentions, bias, ex parte contacts, and objections to jurisdiction. There were none. City Attorney Walker made the quasi-judicial land use hearing announcements.

Associate Planner Leonard presented the staff report. This was a request to amend the Comprehensive Plan Map from IND to MDR and Zoning Map from M-2 to R-2. There was currently a legal non-conforming home on the property which would remain. He explained the surrounding zoning, industrial land analysis, population forecast for 2020-2060, residential analysis, approval criteria, compliance with Newberg Comprehensive Plan and State Planning Goals, public facilities and services, and State Transportation Planning Rule. Staff recommended approval.

Janelle Baugh, applicant, planned to renovate this older home into a larger home that was more efficient and up to date. She agreed to waive the 7-day timeline to submit final written comments.
